

Stalemate at the Villa

We completed our first double of the season by recording a satisfactory 2-0 win at Forest Row. The first game against Forest Row was abandoned after 82 minutes with the scoreline 0-0 when the Epsom defender, Andy Hall suffered various serious leg injuries.

There was good news when we arrived at the ground when we saw that the pitch had been cut!!! We made a few changes with Jaevon Dyer returning to the starting lineup after sickness last weekend; Warren Colman made his first full start for us after a few substitute appearances.

We started very much on the front foot and created a few half chances and probably should have converted one of them and then in the 14th minute a speculative shot from Ryan Smith squirmed under the body of the goalkeeper and we took the lead; probably not a goal that the goalkeeper would like to see repeated too often. It was only a few minutes later when Dyer was through on goal and the aforementioned goalkeeper brought him down and the referee had no hesitation in pointing to the spot. Unfortunately, Ryan Smith's spot kick was saved by the goalkeeper. The rest of the half was predominately played in our opposition's half.

There were various chances in the second half and even our opponents had one or two which they should have done better with. A 1-0 lead is never comfortable and we were fortunate that the opposition No 18 was sent off for a bad tackle on Athan Smith-Joseph, the player might have felt slightly hard done by if there was an orange card that the colour that might have been shown. With the opposition down to ten men, we began to control the game a lot more and in the 86th minute Eldi Baze cut in from the right-hand side and scored his first goal for the club; it was no more than we deserved.

The match ended 2-0 for us and the result put us four points clear at the top of the table. The point to note was that this game was our 8th away game this season so we have already played half of those fixtures and it is not the end of October.

Second Double in Four Days

After recording our first double of the season on the previous Tuesday we faced Seaford Town at Home with a chance to register our second double of the season; we duly came out on top to record that second double - this was a much harder assignment though and we won through goals by Adamson and Colman one in each half.

The team had a few changes from the previous match with Jubril Adamson coming in for Josh Owen, Zac Powell moving into midfield and Jonny Akoto making a welcome return from injury to look after the left-back berth.

The first half began we were rather 'slow out of the blocks' which Seaford nearly capitalised from and scored after a through ball but our goalkeeper, Kane Charles was able to smother the chance. In the 27th minute, we broke the deadlock after a break down the right wing by Jaevon Dyer who crossed into the on-rushing Adamson to score; it was a good goal and had '8come just after our management team had 'tweaked' the way we were playing to make us more of a threat. You could visibly see our opposition's confidence drop after this setback. There were no further chances of note, and we went into the break 1-0 in front, but with more work to do to secure the points.

We began the second half much more on the front foot and had a few chances to increase our lead, this duly came in the 67th minute after a jinking run by Athan Smith-Joseph down the left wing and he crossed to find Warren Colman who had the simplest chance to make it 2-0. The opposition goalkeeper thought that the ball had gone out of play and complained to the referee about the decision but took his complaint slightly too far and was sin-binned; we have it on good authority that the ball did not go out of play. 2-0 to the Salts and that is the way it stayed even though we had a replacement keeper in one of the opposition's defenders for ten minutes.

Overall, a very satisfactory result against a good team who will take points off the better teams in the division; we certainly wish them well in that quest to do that!!! This was our 4th clean sheet in a row and the result puts us on 31 points from 12 games and 4 points clear at the top of the table; we must not get complacent as there is just under two-thirds of the season to go but we are handily placed.

Founded in 1891 Billingshurst FC were initially a member of the Horsham league before joining the West Sussex Football League at the time of its inception, enjoying many seasons before winning the West Sussex Premier League in 2012 and being promoted to the Sussex County League.

We currently run three senior sides, the 1st team competes in Southern Combination Football League Division 1 and the Reserves will be playing in the West Sussex Football League Championship, Our Third Team will be competing in WSFL Div 2 North being one of the highest placed 3 rd teams in the league. Plus our U18 side plays in SCFL and a Vets side.

As an FA Accredited club we also run fourteen mixed junior sides from under 7 - U16, currently three girls teams, Junior sides play in the Horsham and District youth, Surrey and Mid Sussex leagues.

We moved to our current home ground at Jubilee fields after vacating the old Station Road ground in 2006, due to the development of the swimming pool. With the aid of Football Foundation funding, we enjoy excellent facilities including three senior pitches, and several junior ones and our main pitch has seen much development over recent years including, hard standing, floodlights, a stand and perimeter and spectator fencing. We are enjoying our time in senior football and as such have competed in the FA Vase and the FA Cup.

Salts get top 'billing this time round

Our starting 11 had Kane Charles in goal making his home debut along with another home debutant in Mo Cisse who anchored the midfield and who had rather an eventful afternoon, to say the least.

The opening exchanges were fairly even, but the game changed in the 21st minute when the referee awarded our visitors a penalty which was a highly dubious decision, in fact only the Billingshurst striker who was fouled appealed. Anyway, that is all history now and our visitors duly dispatched the penalty and took the lead 1-0. It was not long before we were level after a slight mix-up in our visitor's defence which left Luke Miller through on goal and he finished with some aplomb in the 32nd minute. We took the lead after a wonderful run to the bye line by Athan Smith-Joseph who left our opponent's defenders in his wake and crossed for who else but Jamie Byatt to stoop low and head in his 30th goal of the season. Half time 2-1 to the Salts.

The second half began with one replacement for the home team with Kofi Quartey replacing our 30-goal man Jamie Byatt up front. We went further ahead in the 53rd minute when Luke Miller scored his second goal of the game from an acute angle - 'his shot was too hot to handle for the Billingshurst keeper'.

The game could have changed dramatically for our visitors when the aforementioned debutant Mo Cisse was given a second yellow card and dismissed rather harshly in the 58th minute. However, this galvanised us more than our visitors and we extended our lead after Luke Miller bamboozled the Billingshurst back line and was awarded a penalty. No one was going to take this penalty apart from Luke to try and get his hat trick which he duly did. We did not stop the scoring then and Athan Smith-Joseph added a 5th goal to our tally in the 73rd minute. There was a further incident of note in the game when the display from the referee got slightly worse when he did not award a penalty to our visitors for what looked like a 'stonewall' one; anyway the game finished 5-1 to the Salts.


