

# Welcome Shoreham FC

Website: shorehamfc.co.uk

Founded: 1892

Home Ground: Middle Road, Shoreham



Shoreham FC, nicknamed The Musselmen, was founded in 1892 and gained its first major honour in 1902, winning the Sussex Senior Cup, a feat that was repeated four years later. In 1920 Shoreham became a founder member of the Sussex County League, only to resign seven years later after picking up just five points over the entire season and finishing bottom of the twelve-club League.

In 1932 however, the club re-joined and ended the 1934/35 season as runners-up to Horsham. After a difficult period during the 1940s, Shoreham took the County League title for the first time in 1951/52 and retained it the following year. In 1960/61 Shoreham was relegated but made an immediate return as Division Two champions the very next season.

The Musselmen were relegated once more in 1966/67 to Division Two, where they spent six seasons before finishing as runners-up to Portfield in 1972/73. Unfortunately, they survived just one season before being relegated again. True to form, Shoreham bounced back, winning the Division Two title in 1976/77, and adding the Division One championship in 1977/78.

Over the past twenty years, Shoreham has continued to alternate between the two top divisions of the County League, with frequent relegation and promotion seasons at Middle Road. The best season in recent years came in the mid-1990s when they twice finished in the top four of Division One and won the League Cup in 1996. Shoreham was promoted back to Division One as runners-up in 2001/02 following relegation two seasons earlier.

However, a now familiar pattern followed as, after narrowly avoiding relegation in 2002/03, the club finished bottom in 2003/04 and returned to Division Two.

In the 2004/05 season, Shoreham finished third in Division Two to gain promotion for the first time of asking, so for joint managers Fred Proto and Jason Rutherford to gain promotion in their first season in charge was an extraordinary effort.

Given our previous history of moving back between the divisions, everyone at the club was very pleased to consolidate in 2005/06. That season saw Middle Road continue to be favoured as a neutral venue for cup ties, and The Musselmen were to collect some silverware of their own, defeating Whitehawk 2-1 in the final of the John O'Hara Challenge Cup.

Shoreham won the SCFL Premier League in 2016/17 and was promoted to the Bostik South League for the first time in their history, only to be relegated the same season back to the SCFL Premier, and then straight through to Division One.

Last season, 2021/22, was much more successful for the club, finishing in 5th position and progressing to the divisional playoffs. A semi-final victory at Seaford Town was followed by a single-goal defeat at Midhurst & Easebourne. Shortly after this final game, manager Mark Pulling left the club by mutual consent after three seasons in charge.

Michael Death was appointed first team manager for the 2022/23 season, and he will be assisted by Keiran Collins. Head Coach will be Paul Ettridge and the Sports Therapist is Matt Rogers. Under 23's manager is Malcolm Saunders, assisted by Ryan Harman. The Under 18's will be managed by Mark Burt, with Sean Bond as his assistant.

# Epsom eventually 'open up the shell' of the Musselmen

We visited Shoreham Football Club for the second time in less than two months but this time in the Division 1 Challenge Cup Quarter Final. On our last visit here we lost 3-1 in the league. We made a few changes to our lineup for the game but it was great to see our player-manager and leading goalscorer Jamie Byatt named on the bench after a long absence from firstteam action.

The conditions for the match were not conducive to a free-flowing game with a strong wind and a very bobbly pitch. Both teams tried to make the best of the conditions but in truth, the first half was a rather drab affair with no team getting to grip the game. We ended the first half at 0-0.

We kicked off the second half and we were playing into the stiff wind again, both sides tried very hard to play decent football but on many occasions, the pitch or the wind got the better of them. In the 68th minute, we had what looked like a perfectly good goal disallowed for offside when the person who scored (Luke Miller) ran from an onside position after a great one-two with Kofi Quartey: no one was sure what the linesman saw - but we move on. Another issue of note was that our goalkeeper was booked by the referee when the ball was moved out of the 6-yard box by the strong wind and he booked him for time-wasting!

It looked like the game was heading to a penalty shoot-out but then in the 87th minute, Luke Miller was tripped by the Shoreham number 11 as he swept into the box. Unfortunately, there were lots of shenanigans by the Shoreham players and especially the goalkeeper before Josh Uzun was about to take the penalty kick; one Shoreham player was sin-binned for something he said to the referee. Josh despatch the penalty but their 'firebrand' goalkeeper took exception to an Epsom player who was celebrating and was promptly red-carded. It did not stop there another Shoreham player was sin-binned so the game restarted with only 8 Shoreham players on the pitch. Thankfully the referee blew the final whistle within a few minutes of this incident before any more issues could take place

# A week is a long time in football.

After last week's disappointing loss to mid-table Worthing United at home, we were on the road again to visit Wick FC at their Crabtree Park home ground. The pitch had been passed fit after a 10 am inspection and we travelled knowing that we would be in for a hard game against the team lying below us second in the league. We played Wick at Home earlier in the season and had beaten them 6-1; we were expecting them to come out trying to put that result right.

There were a few changes from the team that lost at home last week with Aaron Bogel being absent so Gideon Acheampong moved into central defence. Jonny Akoto (ka Sonic) came into the right-back berth and upfront Jaevon Dyer started. It has to be said that in the opening exchanges Wick was on top but they never actually created a clear-cut chance and as the game went on and into the second part of the first half we were very much in the ascendency and a Wick foray into our half was a rare sight. We had a few half chances the best of which was a free kick from just outside the box which the Wick goalkeeper did well to parry to safety then in injury time of the first half, who else but Jamie Byatt was in the 6-yard box to stab home our opening goal. It was nothing short of what we deserved so at halftime it was 1-0 to Epsom.

As the second half began our front line was giving the Wick defence a torrid time with a tormentor in chief Athan Smith-Joseph creating all sorts of havoc down the left flank. The game was stopped after a misfortunate slip by Wick No2 with no one around him which led to a long delay as a stretcher was called for and he was carried off in a lot of pain (we subsequently learnt that he was not as bad as first thought and we at Epsom wish him a speedy recovery). Again we were on top with no notable chances for Wick at all apart from the odd speculative shot from way outside the penalty box which resulted in the ball either going over the top or well wide of the goal. Because of the nine-minute stoppage for the aforementioned injury to Wick No2, we knew there would be a long period of injury time and in the 96th minute, we put the game out of reach of Wick with Josh Alder, a second-half substitute for Jamie Byatt got onto a long ball from Zac Powell and beat the keeper even though he had got a hand to the shot so 2-0 to Epsom. We then saw the game out, the only really disappointing aspect of the late stages of the match was a booking for Nick 'Tricky' Wilson for what was a fairly innocuous challenge which means he will miss the match against 2nd place Shoreham at Home next week.
