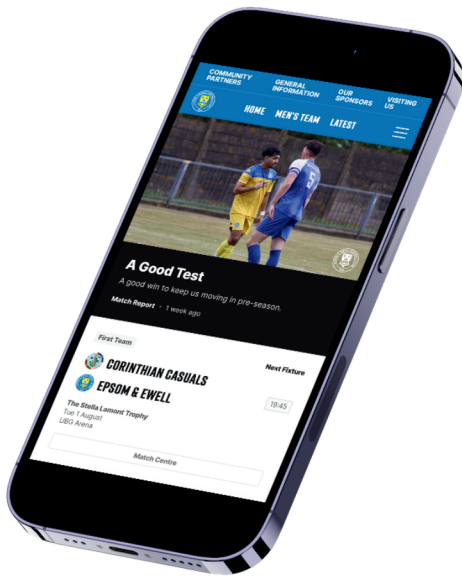

FLEET TOWN FC

Fleet Town FC was officially formed in 1890, making it the oldest sports club in the town. The centenary was celebrated in 1990 with a special Scroll being presented by the Football Association to the club, together with a commemorative plaque from the Hampshire FA.

In its early years Fleet FC played at the bottom of the Views where Campbells Close is today. Later they moved to Watsons Meadow in Fleet Road, roughly opposite where Travis & Perkins now stands, at the station end of Fleet Road. It was during this time that a young, future Prime Minister, Clement Atlee played for the club, his aunt living in a house that backed onto this original ground.

In 1923 Lord Calthorpe of Elvetham Hall made available the site of the present ground in Crookham Road, and the club moved to its new home playing their first match on 3rd March 1923. The ground was subsequently bequeathed to the District Council and later the Fleet Town Council, with the proviso that it would continue to be for the use of the Town's football club.

In 1953 floodlights were installed for the first time. The club entered the Hampshire League in 1961. From then on Fleet Town FC gradually moved through the Divisions, eventually moving into the Wessex League for the 1989/90 season.

After six years of steady progress, the club gained promotion to the Southern League as Wessex League Champions. In 1999/00, its fifth season in the Dr Martens Southern League the club finished bottom and returned to the Wessex League. Within a few seasons the club returned to the Southern League, winning promotion under Player/manager, Steve Beeks.

Playing in the Ryman League the 2005/06 season began with a new management team of ex-England International Andy Sinton assisted by Steve Mellor. In their second season together this new team saw their side top the table at Christmas before they finally finished in 5th place. In a pulsating play-off semi-final they lost 2-1 to Tooting & Mitcham, with the London side scoring twice in added-on time. The team also reached the final of the Hampshire County Cup, losing 2-1 to Aldershot, the game being played at AFC Bournemouth.

For season 2007-08 the Club were moved by the FA to the BGG Southern League, South & West Division, and again had a record breaking season. Right up until the last few games they were in with a chance of automatic promotion but eventually had to accept 2nd spot behind Farnborough. This however was their highest ever non-league finish and again played in front of record crowds. It was heartbreak in the play-offs though as the team again lost in the semi-final, this time to an injury time penalty that gave Uxbridge a 2-1 victory. Fleet also went their furthest in the FA Cup before losing 2-1 at Havant & Waterlooville in the 3rd Qualifying Round.

Season 08/09 had the club on the move yet again with promotions/relegations elsewhere meaning that Fleet returned to the Ryman League, South Division. Andy Sinton's side again broke more records as the team won four cups, including the prestigious Hampshire Senior Cup when over 1,200 witnessed victory over VTFC at St Marys Stadium, Southampton, to send the cup to Fleet for the first time. In addition the team also won the Russell Cotes Cup, Aldershot Senior & North Hants cups. They again progressed to the 3rd Qualifying Round of the FA Cup before losing 5-2 in a bruising encounter at AFC Totton.

May 2010 brought major changes at the club with Chairman Graham Smith stepping down and this was shortly followed by manager Andy Sinton resigning to join AFC Telford United. For the new

season Steve Mellor stepped into the Manager's shoes. A largely new Blues side finished a credible 13th.

Season 2011-12 again saw Fleet Town move as they were switched back to the Southern League after a three year absence, this time placed in the Division One Central. However results were poor and after a run of defeats and exiting the major cup competitions Mellor left in November 2011 to be replaced by Craig Davis as player/manager. Despite some improved displays, the Blues faced relegation after ending the season in 21st spot. However, due to circumstances elsewhere in the Football pyramid Fleet Town gained an FA reprieve and retained their place as a Southern League club, to play a 2nd season in the Division One Central for season 2012/13.

In July 2012 Steve Cantle became Chairman and the club enjoyed an improved Southern League season, finishing with 4 teams behind them, in 18th spot. Following the end of the season Fleet Town were again moved, this time within the Southern League to Division One South & West.

After several difficult seasons the 2015/16 season saw Fleet moved back to the Division One Central, and they enjoyed 3 successful seasons with league status retained and the winning of the Aldershot Senior Cup and the North Hants Senior Cup in 2017.

However, 2018-19, Fleet's 17th consecutive season at this level, brings new challenges to the Club as against their wishes, they have been laterally moved to the Southern League South with long journeys ahead including two to Devon. With Chairman Alec Grant at the helm the Club is moving forward and getting the infrastructure right and as a result the feeling at the Club is one of optimism. Sam Waters is the new Head of Football with Dave Kelly as manager and with their reliance on youth the Club are looking for stability and progress after the turmoil of the close season. A very tough season with multiple managers and chairpeople led to little consistency.

2019-20 started with Fleet back in the Wessex League Premier Division after relegation from the Southern League South Division. Moving forward a new committee is in place and with Dave Kelly continuing as manager and many players returning it is hoped that much of the consistency lacking from last year will be in place this year. The team were solidly in midtable when covid caused an end to the season. The club focussed on rebuilding the club infrastructure, with much work taking place on the pitch, in the clubhouse and around the ground.

2020-21 saw a second season in the Wessex League. Dave Kelly remained as manager and the team kicked on with new players, still with a focus on developing young players. The team reached the 1st Rd of the FA Vase for the first time in many years. Work on the ground continued and the future is starting to look better at Calthorpe Park. With the FA's reorganisation taking place over the summer Fleet moved leagues yet again and for 2021-22 played in the Combined Counties Premier League Southern Division.

At the start of 2022-23 we created our "community club". Then with Dave Kelly departing late in 2022, the club appointed a new manager, Jermaine McGlashan to take over the first team. Jermaine was given the task of keeping the club at step 5. After many ups and downs, finally on April 26th our safety at step 5 was confirmed. During the close season a new squad was built for the 2023-24 season and has had a reasonable start seeing the club around mid-table in mid-October. Unfortunately Jermaine has now departed to manage fellow league side AFC Croydon Athletic and we have now appointed Elliott Hunt as first team manager. Elliott has started well with three league wins from five. We look forward to seeing the progress of this great group of players.

Elliott is assisted today by coaches Luke Barron and Darryl Evans along with Club Medic Teagan Brown

Epsom & Ewell FC v Spelthorne Sports FC
Combined Counties Premier South
Tuesday 2nd April 2024

“After an uninspiring result at ‘The Madgwick’ on the evening of April 2nd, we are left with three huge games to save us from relegation, or should we say ‘Three Cup Finals.’

The rightful winners on the evening were Spelthorne Sports, who showed much more passion than we did in the latter stages of the second half to secure the result.

We began the game with high hopes, with new signings Will Kendall taking our lone striking role (he was one of the best players on the pitch), and Luke Taylor on the bench, although he would see action far too late in the game.

In the first half, of the few chances that were created, we had two of the best ones to score and duly did so from our new striker Will Kendall, who was in the six-yard box to put the ball into the net on 39 minutes; it was probably a lead that we deserved, even though our opponents had a good amount of possession. We should mention that the game was watched by only 43 spectators who got absolutely drenched on what was a dreadful evening weather-wise.

We took to the pitch in the second half with no changes in personnel, and from the start, you could see that our opponents had ‘upped their game.’ The question on the Epsom supporters’ minds was, ‘could we match them?’ By the end of the 45 minutes, we could not, as we yet again this season conceded two goals in quick succession in the 74th and 82nd minutes as Spelthorne equalized and then took the lead. When we went behind, we made four substitutions to try and salvage something from the game, but this was all to no avail, despite having a golden opportunity to equalize from a late corner which went agonizingly wide.

We really are in a relegation ‘dogfight,’ having played more games than our rivals. After this weekend where we do not have a game and our rivals do, we shall have a clearer picture of what is required in our remaining three ‘Cup finals’. It could all come down to our final game of the season away at Guildford City, but before that, we have to take on mid-table Fleet Town and playoff-chasing Abbey Rangers at home. The first game against Fleet Town is on Saturday, April 13th, at ‘The Madgwick,’ with a 3 pm kick-off.”

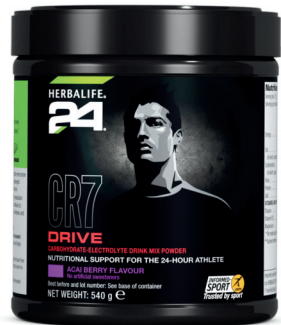

Horley Town FC



Epsom & Ewell FC v Horley Town FC Combined Counties Premier South Saturday 23rd March 2024

We hosted Horley Town at the 'Madgwick' on Saturday, March 23rd, in what was another crucial game as we try to secure our place in the Premier Division for the next season. The match was billed as 'Non-League Day' due to the international break. However, the turnout was disappointing, with only 70 supporters in attendance. Carl Obiltey returned to his position as our central striker after recovering from a hamstring issue, while Matt Macgillviray took up a central midfield role.

Before kickoff, a respectful minute of silence was observed to honour the passing of Terry Molloy, the Banstead Athletic Chairman and Owner, who sadly passed away on Thursday. Terry's remarkable contribution to non-league football in Surrey over the years was acknowledged by many clubs in the region, including ours, with a minute of silence before the game.

Despite a promising start, we found ourselves trailing as our visitors opened the scoring in the 15th minute. The goal came amidst what seemed like a clear foul on one of our players, but the referee allowed play to continue, resulting in Horley scoring. (The Horley players and supporters also confirmed after the game, that they also felt it was a foul.) Despite this setback, we had an opportunity to level the score, but we hit the post instead of finding the back of the net. Shortly after, a Horley player was sent to the sin bin for ten minutes for dissent towards the referee, but we failed to capitalise on the numerical advantage. Just before halftime, Horley extended their lead after capitalising on a clearance from one of our players. The halftime score stood at 2-0 in favour of the visitors, compounded by questionable refereeing decisions.

No changes were made to our lineup at halftime, and although we maintained possession, we struggled to convert it into goals. A failure to mark a Horley player during a corner kick led to their third goal, putting us at a significant disadvantage. However, we managed to pull one back in the 82nd minute through a powerful header from Thompson Adjemi, giving the Horley goalkeeper no chance.

Despite the Horley goalkeeper delaying the restart by kicking the ball out of play, no action was taken by the referee. Additionally, the referee's inconsistent decision-making was evident as three yellow cards were shown to Epsom players within a five-minute period for minor challenges. A fourth goal conceded in injury time sealed our fate, resulting in a final score of 4-1. As we left the pitch, a Horley player, who had committed several fouls without being booked, was seen laughing with a teammate about "getting away with it" in front of the referee.

Aside from the disappointing performance by the referee, we failed to capitalise on the chances we created, only managing to convert one into a goal. With four crucial matches remaining, we now have four "Cup Finals" left to try and secure our future in this division, starting with a home game against Spelthorne Sports on Tuesday, April 2nd, with a kick-off time of 19:45 at the "Madgwick". 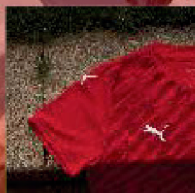
