

Match report



Epsom & Ewell 1-1 Sutton United Academy

Pre-season friendly Saturday 27 July 2024 Scorer: Will Kendall (55')

We played against Sutton United Development Squad at the Reg Madgwick Stadium on Saturday, 13th July.

Upon arriving at the ground, the match was in serious doubt. In the previous match, between the Met Police and Windsor and Eton, the game was suspended after the Met Police goalkeeper sustained a broken leg. We had to wait for an ambulance to arrive and take the injured player to hospital. This delayed our game until 15:45. All of us at Epsom and Ewell wish the goalkeeper a speedy recovery, as no one likes to see such incidents.

As is typical for this time of year, there were several trialists for Epsom, and we started well. We took the lead after Will Kendall outmuscled the Sutton United centre-half to pass to Sirak Negassi, who finished into a fairly empty net on 12 minutes. The rest of the half was evenly contested, with our visitors probably holding the upper hand. The half ended with Epsom leading 1-0.

As usual, various changes took place at half-time, and both sides appeared to get stronger. There were chances at both ends, with us hitting the bar and post. However, Sutton equalised with 15 minutes to go and scored the eventual winner with 5 minutes remaining. A draw would have been a fair result, but it was another good test for our

players.

Formed in 1935, Phoenix Sports Club originally started out as St. Johns Welling, later changing its name to Lakeside, before renaming to Phoenix following the Second World War as it was seen to rise from the ashes of the previous two clubs amidst the destruction caused by the blitz. Over the years the club has played at various locations in the local area, including Danson Park until 1950 when the local council offered them a piece of waste land in Mayplace Road East, Bexleyheath. Over time it evolved into the ground that we all know now as Phoenix Sports Club.

Both football and cricket have been played at Mayplace Road East, with many members, both past and present, representing the club in both sports. However, with the growth of junior football, cricket has now moved away.

After entering various leagues, including the Sidcup League, Kent Amateur League and the Dartford League, the club eventually settled in the Kent County League Division One West.

In the 1986/7 season, the club entered the Spartan League and competed there for six seasons. They then returned to the Kent County League - Division One - West, winning the Challenge Cup in 1993-94. In 1999/2000 we won the league, gaining promotion to the Premier Division, however after two relegations ended up in Division Two West, finally returning to the first division in 2004/05, and then back to the Premier Division in 2007/08.

After three seasons in the Premier Division, the first team became founder members of the Kent Invicta League at Step 6 of the National League System (Step 10 of the English Football League System) – the highest level of football the club had ever played at. We went on to finish runners up, missing out by only two points to eventual champions Bly Spartans as well as reaching the League Cup Final, again losing out to Bly Spartans.

Unfortunately, the First Team and Reserve Team Management both resigned for personal reasons at the end of season 2011-2012. After an exhaustive process we appointed Steve O'Boyle and Tony Beckingham as Joint First Team Managers and John Hope as Manager for the Reserves assisted by Brian Magenis and John Barry. Off the pitch we installed floodlights and a 108 seat stand and with further improvements around the ground we soon received an F Grade.

History of Phoenix Sports FC

We had a successful first campaign under the new management structure, and after losing only two league games all season, Phoenix won the Kent Invicta League and gained promotion to the Kent League (now renamed the Southern Counties East Football League) to play at step 5 of the National League System. We finished in sixth place in our inaugural season but had aims to do even better the next year. We had a very good start to the campaign but unfortunately lost in our first ever appearance in the FA Cup - losing on penalties after a replay.

We then began an unbelievable run in both the League and FA Vase. The Vase journey was fantastic culminating in us reaching the 4th Round Proper, where we lost to the eventual winners North Shields.

In the League we managed to lose only 1 game all season and accumulated 30 clean sheets. Due to these great performances we managed to win the League quite comfortably. Following quick and necessary works done on the ground we gained a D Grade and promotion to Isthmian League North Division. Our first season at this level saw us finish in 14th place, which was improved upon the next year when we came 8th. We were then the subject of a lateral movement and competed in the newly sponsored Bostik League South, for the 2017-18 season. After a decent start and sitting in the play-off spots for a while, we were rocked by the departure of First Team Manager Steve O'Boyle. Paul Bryon came in and steadied the ship and we finished in a creditable 11th place. The following year we improved to a pleasing 9th position.

The early ends to the 2019/20 and 2020/21 seasons, due to the Coronavirus Pandemic, prevented us from again gaining top half finishes before a disappointing 2021/22 campaign saw us finish second bottom and get relegated down to SCEFL league.

All that did though was set us up for an epic season in the SCEFL where Steve O'Boyle led us to a second placed finish and a winner takes all Play Off Final at VCD Athletic. In a tight and nervy game Ryan Hayes scored the winner deep into injury time, earning us promotion and a swap of places with our closest neighbours and rivals.

We now go into the 2023/24 campaign excited by our return to Isthmian League football.

Phoenix Sports are a FA charter Standard Community Club - the highest level of youth recognition from the Football Association. Mini-soccer is played at the Mayplace Ground and Sundays are always busy with parents cheering on the young players wearing our green shirt.



Keith McMahon: The Manager – Keith spent some time at Mayplace working with O'Boyle last season, so will be in familiar surroundings. He previously spent five years- from May 2015 to June 2020- in charge a few hundred yards away at VCD Athletic. Prior to his time at Oakwood he managed Thamesmead Town, and indeed was a big part of the club for eleven years, steering them to promotion from the Kent League and then to another promotion to our Premier Division, his side winning a famous penalty shootout over Maldon & Tiptree in the 2012-13 North Division Playoff Final. After leaving Vickers, he spent time in charge of Whitstable Town.

Phoenix Sports FC squad



Reece Jacobs: New to this area, Reece has spent his career so far playing in the North of the Country, turning out for sides like Kidderminster Harriers, Market Drayton, Hinckley AFC and Shawbury United. He is a direct attacking player who can play out wide or as a forward.

Matt Cafer: Matt came through the youth setup at Weymouth before moving on to Yeovil Town. After leaving the Glovers he moved back to Weymouth before spending several seasons playing in Gibraltar over two spells, with a period in the middle where he was back in the UK with Bath City, Gosport Borough, Farnborough and Dorchester Town.

Jack Marney: Young attacking midfielder that has played for the England 6-aside team. Previous clubs include AFC Croydon, East Preston, Merstham and Sheppey United.

Kevin Diomande: Kevin joins after reaching the Isthmian North Division Play Offs with Southall last season. The defender has also played for Bedfont Sports and Hendon previously.

Emmanuel Dasho: We add to our defence with the signing of Emmanuel Dasho. He finished last season atWitham Town and can count Aveley, Sittingbourne, Faversham and Walthamstow among his former clubs.

Alfie Bloomfield: Alfie comes in after ending last season at Beckenham Town. Our new centre-forward had previously played for Punjab United, Sittingbourne, AFC Croydon and Bromley.

Darnell Bromfield: A midfielder that spent last year at West Essex FC. Previous to that his teams have included Fisher, Thurrock, Redbridge and Aveley.

Jaiden Chang-Brown: A hardworking and industrious centre-midfielder and can play as a center half. He has most recently played for Abbey Rangers and Tooting & Mitcham.

Harvey Browne: An attacking midfielder that was at Welling United's Academy before moving on to Barking FC then Tooting & Mitcham. He won the Essex Senior League last year at Tilbury.

Seye Okunlola: A strong and athletic attacking player that can count Marlow and Braintree Town among his former sides. Marcus Travers: A centre-back that has plenty of experience at this level. Most recently played for Met Police and can count Corinthian Casuals, AFC Croydon, Redhill and Tooting & Mitcham among his former sides. Valentino Alazeni: A talented young left-sided player that has represented Qatar at u23s level. His former clubs include Brentwood Town, Binfield FC and Hashtag United. Ade Batula: Young hungry forward who spent last season at Epsom & Ewell following spells with Dulwich Hamlet and Chatham Town. Previously an academy player at Dulwich Hamlet and has also played for Chatham, Fisher and Spelthorne. Harrison Mayhew: Centre-back that has just finished a great season for Crowborough Athletic. making 31 appearances as the Crows came in third in the SCFL. Before that he was part of the academy at Tonbridge Angels. Alex Gaggin: Back at the club following a spell here in 2020. The winger is well known to the boss having worked with him at VCD Athletic and Whitstable Town. His other clubs include East Grinstead and Margate. Veron Nzinga: The Mayplace was his home ground when he turned out for Welling Town in the SCFEL last season. The left-back has previously played for Whitstable Town, Redbridge and Margate. Marcel Brown: Marcel is a dominant midfielder who has joined us from Sutton Athletic, where he played 34 league games last season, scoring 5 times.

Entering and Leaving the ground

If you have driven to the ground, please park your vehicle considerately, don't block in others, and in particular don't block our neighbours' access to their houses.
