

Today we face Epsom & Ewell in the penultimate home league game of the season! And the final Leafe game before the HUGE Vase Quarter Final vs Bourne Town next Saturday at Church Road. Make sure you pre-purchase your tickets for next week's game as it's going to be a very busy one!

The last time we faced Epsom & Ewell back in August, the Leafe came out 4-1 winners with a brace from Omari Hibbert. Today we really need the win to keep the pressure on Redhill and Jersey at the top, and to also go into next week's Vase match in high spirits!

Epsom & Ewell were established in March 1918 as Epsom Juniors and played cricket during the summer of that year. At the end of the summer a football team was formed, joining the Surrey Junior League in 1919. Although they finished bottom of the table in their first season, they became founders of the Sutton & District League in 1920. Renamed Epsom Town in 1922, they were Premier Division champions in 1922–23. The club subsequently transferred to the Southern Suburban League, which they won at the first attempt without losing a game. They then moved up to the Surrey Senior League. After finishing third in their first season in the league, the club won back-to-back league titles in 1925–26 and 1926–27, as well as winning the league's Charity Cup in 1926–27 with a 1–0 win over Egham.

After their success in the Surrey Senior League, Epsom moved up to the Premier Division of the London League in 1927, going on to win the division in 1927–28. They finished as runners-up in 1931–32 and 1932–33, also winning the Surrey Senior Shield in 1932–33 with a 5–0 win against Woking in the final held at Woking's Kingfield Stadium. They reached the first round of the FA Cup for the first time in their history in 1933–34, losing 4–2 at Leyton Orient. In 1934 the club was renamed Epsom, and they went on to finish as Premier Division runners-up again in 1934–35, 1936–37 and 1937–38. In 1949 the club joined the Corinthian League. They won the Surrey Senior Shield in 1954–55, beating Carshalton Athletic 1–0 in the final. The 1959–60 season saw the club win the league's Memorial Shield with a 2–0 win against Maidenhead United. In 1960 the club adopted its current name.

When the Corinthian League was disbanded in 1963, Epsom & Ewell joined Division One of the Athenian League alongside most of the other teams from the league. They were relegated to Division Two at the end of the 1964–65 season, having finished bottom of Division One. The club subsequently struggled in Division Two, finishing bottom in 1970–71 and 1971–72.

In 1973 they dropped back into the Surrey Senior League. Their first season back in the league saw them finish as runners-up and win the League Cup. The following season, 1974–75, the club won the league and the League Cup, as well as reaching the final of the FA Vase, losing 2–1 to Hoddesdon Town at Wembley Stadium.



The club were promoted back to Division Two of the Athenian League and were runners-up in their first season back in the division, resulting in promotion to Division One. In 1977 the club transferred to Division Two of the Isthmian League, which they won at the first attempt, earning promotion to Division One. In 1979–80 the club won the Southern Combination Challenge Cup, beating Hampton 7–2 in the final, which was played at Hampton's home ground.

Epsom & Ewell remained in Division One until the end of the 1983–84 season, when they were promoted to the Premier Division after finishing as runners-up in Division Two under manager Adrian Hill. However, when Hill left the club to join Croydon in 1985, the club struggled; they finished bottom of the Premier Division in 1985–86, resulting in relegation back to Division One. The following season also ended in relegation, with the club placed in Division Two South for the 1987–88 season. League reorganisation in 1991 saw them moved to Division Three, where they remained until another round of reorganisation resulted in the club being placed in Division One South. However, they were relegated to Division Two at the end of the 2003–04 after finishing bottom of their division. In 2006 they were transferred to the Premier Division of the Combined Counties League when Division Two of the Isthmian League was scrapped. In 2012–13 the club won the Combined Counties League Premier Challenge Cup with a 3–0 win over South Park in the final at Cherrywood Road.

The 2017–18 season saw Epsom & Ewell finish second-from-bottom of the Premier Division, resulting in relegation to Division One. At the end of the 2020–21 season the club were transferred to Division One of the Southern Combination League. In 2022–23 they were runners-up in Division One, qualifying for the promotion play-offs. After defeating Selsey 6–5 on penalties in the semi-finals (after a 0–0 draw), they beat Wick 2–1 in the final, earning promotion to the Premier Division South of the Combined Counties League.



How do think their season will pan out? Mid table mediocrity hopefully.





Andy's Adventures!

'Leafe fan and club shop volunteer Andy Parker has recently been on a groundhopping tour of West Wales, the third game on his journey was......Penlan FC







From Ynystawe we drove towards Swansea, or Abertawe as we now knew it, with the next stop being the Mynydd Newydd playing fields in the Penlan district, home to Penlan football, rugby and cricket clubs. There is a large car park and a large clubhouse with the match pitch being in the far left corner of the fields a good 400m walk away.


The clubhouse has a large number of changing rooms with a cafe accessed from the car park. They seemed to have a large selection of food but the queue was already stretching out the door by the time we got there.

Penlan had thought of that and had arranged for a temporary bar to be set up in a gazebo just outside the pitch which has newly installed temporary plastic fencing to help with controlling the admission. They had a couple of lager and cider pumps along with some food, snacks and hot beverages.

We had just ordered our hot dogs and cups of tea when a West Wales Premier League official came over and told them that alcohol was not allowed in league games. He then said that unless the pumps were removed, he would cancel the match. They quickly realised that they would not make enough money from just non-alcoholic sales so dismantled it all and took it through a gap in the fence to the transit van parked in the estate outside.



The pitch is railed off all the way round, with just a couple of small stands behind the dugouts providing anything more than grass on which to stand. I believe they have plans to surround it with a permanent fence to protect it from the local vandals, who seem to cause damage on a regular basis.

One of the best aspects of this particular hop is that so many of the locals also follow the circus around and attend most of the matches. Remember the smoking referee from the previous game? We bumped into him just before kick-off for this second game.

'This fixture is usually a bit lively', he said, in between drags on his latest cigarette.

This season is only the fourth in the West Wales Premier League. Penlan won the first two championships while today's opponents, Rockspur Fords, are the reigning champs. Their grounds are about four miles apart, but some Rockspur junior sides use other Mynydd Newydd pitches, as did the first team prior to joining the WWPL where groundsharing is prohibited. So there is a bit of a rivalry on all counts.

Coming into the game, Penlan were 8th while the visitors were looking to be a good bet to retain their title being in 1st place with a 100% record from their opening nine games and in possession of a very healthy goal difference.

Rockspur had the better of the first twenty minutes until they had a player sent off for serious foul play. It happened on the other side of the pitch from us and looked to me like a very bad challenge for the ball. There did not seem to be many complaints about the red from his team mates

There were plenty of hard tackles from both teams and I thought the referee did very well to manage the match in very trying circumstances. The only goal of the game was scored five minutes before half time from a free-kick being headed back across goal for a shot into Penlan's net.

The second half was equally combative with a splendid mix of physical and verbal confrontations throughout. As we neared full time, a Penlan player was sent off, also for serious foul play, making the game ten versus ten.

Not for long, though, as the visitors went down to nine men after a second caution for their goalscorer and the home side replied with two more red cards of their own, also for second yellow.



A most enjoyable game to watch with something happening throughout, even though the scoreline was just 0-1.

I will make the tea and you bring the biscuits – that was the message from Dean Brennan last week when we asked the Barnet boss if he had time for a cuppa and a chat.


He had more to offer than that, throwing open the Hive's doors for a full day to see their preparations for a big National League clash with Solihull Moors.

It's what we all love about Non-League football. Even at the top table, managers are so affording of their time and generosity.

Last season Barnet missed out in the play-offs – ironically to Solihull – and the previous year their hopes were ended by Boreham Wood.

But the Bees are edging ever closer and that relaxed feeling around the camp was clear to see.

Will they win every game between now and the end of the season? Almost certainly not and there will be bumps in the road. York City and Forest Green Royers hold the same title ambitions



and there are a whole number of clubs determined they hold League Two status next term.

Brennan, of course, has done the hard yards. He's turned down the chance to be an EFL manager already, staying loyal to Barnet in the hope he can be the manager to take them back into League Two.

Brennan, 44, knows what this part of the season is all about. He took Hemel Hempstead from the bottom of the Southern League into the Conference South in his first job and, after some big learnings at Billericay Town and Kingstonian, then won Step 2 with Wealdstone.

Although an FA Trophy winner with Grays Athletic, Brennan says he didn't live right to maximise his playing career. It's why he's so driven in his management career – one that actually started in Sunday League alongside his Non-League playing days.

"I wanted to get used to speaking in front of a group," Brennan tells The NLP. "Because being a player and saying, 'Oh can we do this, gaffer?' it is totally different to standing up in a changing room and seeing 16 faces staring back at you. Now the squads are even larger.

"You saw me earlier doing video analysis and speaking in front of the players. It's understanding where they're sitting because it's important how you get that communication across. I don't want to be turning around saying, 'Matt, Matt, where are you Matt?' You look like a right idiot. Rather than knowing where you are and saying, 'Right, Matt, this is what we want you to do'.

"I know where everyone is sitting. All those things I learnt early and it's important because it's hard speaking in front of a group.

"If you're a con man, they will know you're a con man. Footballers know if you're spoofing them and bluffing them.

"I just wanted to get that right. So I did player-assistant at a couple of clubs. Way lower down at Dunstable Town and Aylesbury Vale, then I started doing my badges and Mr Boggins (Hemel chairman Dave Boggins) gave me a chance."

The game has changed greatly since his first break. Brennan recalls shouting and screaming back in those days.

"It's amazing, now I don't even do team-talks before games," Brennan says. "When I started out in management and was part-time, we used to do the phases of play in the warm-up


so I could get it into the players' heads. We'd be doing attacking phases, shadow play in the warm-up because we didn't have enough contact time.

"Now the week is structured, we've got time, we've got recovery, we've got video. When you look at younger people, especially, now they learn a lot off their phones, from video, social media, YouTube. Does anybody watch Eastenders or Coronation Street? My Ma definitely still watches Corrie and Emmerdale! But, that's what I'm saying, it's generational so how it's changed is fascinating."

Brennan has grown and evolved with the times into one of Non-League's most talented and respected managers. Even in a busy week, he's still got time for a cup of tea with The NLP – and a biscuit, of course!


