Welcome to Abbey Rangers



Abbey Rangers were established in 1976, initially as a youth club for boys aged 7–16, and taking its name from the historic Chertsey Abbey.

The initial years the club had a rather nomadic existence having to use various home grounds within Chertsey and Addlestone but, as the club grew in size, it became clear that the club needed to plant it's roots and were able to do so when we established a home on the old Meads school playing fields now known as Addlestone Moor. That ground now accommodates all formats of football from 5 v 5 up to adults. After years of effort, the club opened up its new clubhouse in 2008, a superb and very welcoming facility partly funded by the Football Foundation. The facility was officially opened by Sir Trevor Brooking on 3rd June 2008.

The club has attained the FA Charter Community Status, and now have a healthy and growing girls and ladies section. The club also prides itself on being one of the leading lights in Surrey at providing disability football.

The club became members of the Surrey & Hants Border League under the management of Les Chatfield and Bob Thorpe, winning Division One in 2004–05. After winning the league, League Cup and County Cup in 2007-08 the decision was taken to move to Saturdays and entered the Guildford and Woking Alliance League winning Division 2 in the 1st season. The following season saw the club pick up another treble including another County Cup.

The following season (2010-11) we joined the Surrey County Intermediate League (Western) and finished runners up in Division One. That meant promotion to the Premier Division and finished runners up which meant promotion to the Surrey Elite Intermediate League. We were also County Cup runners up.

We remained in the league until 2014–15 winning the Intermediate League cup in 2014 and another County Cup final appearance in 2015 losing out to Horsley.

In 2015 the club invested in the ground with a view to entering the Combined Counties League and, after finishing 4th in the Surrey Elite League we were accepted for the 2015-16 season which also allowed us to enter the FA Vase. Our 1st season in the Vase saw us clock some miles up but we reached the 2nd round proper before losing to Newport (IOW) in extra time. After a slow start to the league programme we finished the season on an unbeaten 18 game run that saw us grab 3rd place and with it, promotion to the Premier Division at the 1st attempt.

Welcome to Abbey Rangers

In 2016-17 there were new faces at the helm as Les Chatfield & Bob Thorpes impressive reign came to an end and they handed the stewardship over to Mike Woolgar & Paul Johnson. This season saw the clubs 1st Foray in the FA Cup but lost out to a good Thame United side. Another run in the FA Vase saw us go a round further than the previous season losing out to Eastbourne Town. The final league table saw us achieve a top 10 finish although, but for a stuttering end of season, we could easily have finished higher.

The following season was a much tougher season which saw us looking over our shoulders at the relegation places but we managed to amass enough points to keep our place in the Premier Division.

Season 2018-19 saw the club reach new levels by reaching the last 16 in the FA Vase before losing out to Cray Valley (PM) as well as the Semi finals of the CCL Premier Cup and the quarter finals of Southern Combination Challenge cup both 1sts for the club. We also achieved our highest league position finishing in 3rd place.

2019-20 season saw us embark on an FA Cup run that saw us reach the 3rd Qualifying round defeating 2 step 4 clubs on the way in East Grinstead and Whitehawk before bowing out to Whyteleafe in the 3rd qualifying round. That season was curtailed due to covid with us challenging the promotion spots in the CCL.

2021-22 also saw us challenging for the promotions spots again before eventually missing out to Southall. 2022-23 also saw us challenging again spending a considerable time on top of the league but eventually finished 4th.

2023-24 saw us spend the best part of the season in the play off spots but a couple of slip ups towards the end of the season saw us drop out, In the summer of 2024-25 Adam Bessent took over the management role assisted by his brother Jake.

Off the field the club continues to progress and in the summer of 2018 we were proud to open our 3G facility which can only help the club to grow and help to develop players through our youth sections in both boys and girls football.

There was a special start to the game in memory of Alex McKay, who passed away recently. Family, friends, former managers, and players were present to pay tribute. A Scottish piper led the teams out, and a minute of applause preceded the start of the match.

The Tooting side included former Salts player Gideon Acheampong in the starting line-up, with the familiar faces of Jamie Byatt and Alex Penfold on the bench as part of the Tooting management team. With a big cup final coming up on Tuesday, several key players were rested or named as substitutes.

The Salts began brightly and were the better side in the first half, pushing forward and creating several chances. However, it remained goalless at half-time.

At the break, Carl Oblitey replaced Craig Dundas up front. The Salts took the lead in the 55th minute with an incredible goal. From a free kick deep inside his own half, Jack Torbett let fly, and the ball soared over Tooting keeper Toby McKimm, who scrambled back but couldn't prevent it going in.

Shortly after, Stefan Aiwone received a yellow card and was substituted in the 63rd minute for Anthony Nazareth. A double substitution followed in the 67th minute, with Kionte Gillifillian-Wual and Luke Miller replacing Sean-Michael Anderson and Ethan Brazier.

Tooting equalised in the 77th minute, with Shay Brennan scoring from ten yards out. Our final substitution saw Niall Stillwell come on for Brendan Murphy-McVey.

Further bookings were picked up by Carl Oblitey and Jason Bloor. Despite creating more chances to find a second goal, disaster struck four minutes into added time when Hussein Siklawi scored the winner for Tooting. The referee blew the final whistle immediately after.

A disappointing end to a sad day.

The Southern Combination Challenge Cup is a football competition contested by non-league clubs. An independent cup, it was directly affiliated to the Football Association until 2015, when a change in FA Rules required such competitions to affiliate with the county of much of its member clubs: this is currently the Surrey County FA for this competition. The competition was founded in March 1958, as the Southern Combination Amateur Challenge Cup Competition. The word "Amateur" was later dropped in 1974. It is often referred to as simply the Southern Combination Cup.

The competition's rules state that entrants must be based within twenty-five miles of Weybridge, Surrey (until 1998, within twenty-five miles of Kingston upon Thames). At least two other competitions with similar names existed, in different areas of southeast England:


- (1) the Southern Counties Combination Football League started in 1971 as a league competition in Sussex (and later southern parts of Surrey), with an associated League Cup and, a few years later, a Midweek Floodlight [Cup] Competition. This competition closed in 2002, with the last winners being Fleet Town a club from Hampshire who, incidentally, have also entered the Southern Combination Challenge Cup.
- (2) the Southern Combination Cup, which started around 1980, and offered a set of the sponsors', Phillips', floodlights to the inaugural winners. In some years, a Reserve Section was also contested. Known entrants were from the Hertfordshire and Bedfordshire area, but the competition ceased following Stotfold's victory in 1996.

Hampton & Richmond Borough are the most successful club in the competition's history, having lifted the cup eight times. With seven of those coming under the name of Hampton, their most recent success came during the 2004–05 season. There have been twenty-four different winners, with Farnham Town FC the current holders after beating Balham 3-2 aet in May 2023 in front of 1,143 fans.

Ground Regulations 2024-25

Entry to the Ground shall constitute acceptance of this Code of Conduct, the rules and regulations of The Football Association and The Isthmian League.

The Club reserves the right to amend, alter or update this Code of Conduct and to eject, ban or prosecute as appropriate/necessary at their sole discretion.

Please remember that your behaviour reflects on Epsom & Ewell FC and could result in fines and in extreme cases heavier sanctions being imposed upon the club.

Entering and Leaving the ground

Please don't enter if you have Covid or Covid like symptoms or have been in close contact with anyone who has Covid. If you have driven to the ground, please park your vehicle considerately, don't block in others, and in particular don't block our neighbours' access to their houses. Out of respect for our neighbours, please keep noise levels down, especially late-night revelry, and don't litter the area. Don't attempt to bring Flares or Fireworks of any description into the ground. We reserve the right to check all bags and suspicious objects, and any found will be confiscated. No alcoholic drinks are allowed to be brought into the ground. We reserve the right to check all bags and suspicious objects, and any found will be confiscated. Don't attempt to bypass the gate security checks, smuggle drinks of any kind into the ground or bypass the turnstiles without payment. Anyone found doing so will be evicted from the ground.

Within the ground

Be respectful to club officers, staff, security, stewards, and other fans at all times. Don't obstruct the normal activities of the Club and its officers. Don't stand in seating areas or access gangways or steps. Don't behave in a manner that compromises the comfort, enjoyment or safety of others. Always behave appropriately and don't bring the Club into disrepute. The following behaviour will not be tolerated and will result in immediate eviction and ban. Being drunk or under the influence of drugs and behaving anti socially. Threatening behaviour, use of obscene or abusive language, persistent swearing and/or making vulgar gestures. Racial, homophobic or any other form of discriminatory abuse, chanting or harassment. Fighting. Entering the field of play before, during or after the game. The throwing of any missile or object onto the field of play. The letting off of any flare or firework.

Furthermore, **the following are strictly forbidden** and may result in immediate eviction and ban for repeat offenders...

The consumption of alcohol in bottles, glasses or cans in the stands, terraces and other open areas within the ground. The climbing up or onto floodlights, stands, buildings, roofs, fences or any other structure. The obstruction of any walkways and pedestrian routes. The playing of ball games in areas populated by ground visitors. Allowing any animal to roam off the leash within the ground confines. The parking of any vehicle blocking Emergency Vehicle access. The length of any ban imposed will be related to the severity of offence and solely at the discretion of The Club. Any appeal may be made in writing through The Club Secretary and will be given full and due consideration.
