Founded in 1922 as the London & District Combination Football League, and renamed the Combined Counties Football League in 1978, the 2024–25 Cherry Red Combined CCL season will be the 47th in the history of the league. The league consists of four divisions for the second time, with a new Division Two being added to the Premier North, the Premier South and Division One. Division Two is intended largely for reserve and U23 sides, although it is also open to first teams.

















For season 2024-25, both CCL Premier Divisions have 20 clubs, Division 1 has 23, and there is a new Division 2, mostly featuring reserve and U23 teams.

Premier Division North

Flackwell Heath and Rayners Lane have been promoted to step 4 and Chalfont St Peter relegated to Division 1. Amersham Town, Berks County and British Airways have all joined from Division 1, and Woking & Emmbrook are now known as Wokingham Town.

Premier Division South

Farnham Town and AFC Croydon Athletic have been promoted to Step 4 and Colliers Wood United relegated to Division 1.

Chipstead and Corinthian-Casuals join after relegation from Isthmian League South Central, and AFC Whyteleafe are promoted in.

Non League Day



What is Non-League Day?

Non-League Day was set up by James Doe in 2010 as a social media experiment, after being inspired by a pre-season trip to Devon to watch Queens Park Rangers play at Tavistock. It has now grown to become an annual part of the football calendar, backed by Premier League and Football League clubs, MPs, celebrities, media organisations, charities and most importantly the non-league clubs themselves and the fans who turn up on the day.

Always scheduled to coincide with an international break, Non-League Day provides a platform for clubs to promote the importance of affordable volunteer-led community football while giving fans across the country the

volunteer-led community football while giving fans across the country the chance to show support for their local non-league side.

Many non-league clubs are almost exclusively volunteer run, with money taker

at the turnstiles often funding thriving youth set-ups, projects and facilities which are of benefit to the whole community. The level of skill on offer at non-league grounds might not be the same as that at the Etihad Stadium or Stamford Bridge, for example, but there are other sides to the experience, from which the smaller club will always win hands down.

The vast majority of games still kick off at 3pm, ticket prices are realistic, you can often stand (and drink!) anywhere in the ground and will always be guaranteed a warm welcome by people who run their clubs for a love of the game.

Whether you're a Premier League or Championship fan without a game, a League One or League Two supporter who can't make an away trip, or just someone who is curious about what their local club has to offer, there is sure to be something to interest everyone.








Welcome to Balham





Balham FC is run by a Board of Directors: Greg Cruttwell, Derek Fordham and Jennie Molyneux.

They are joined on the Club Committee by Zoe Appleton, Len Chapman and Steve Pigott.

The club was originally founded by Greg Cruttwell in 2001 as Balham Blazers FC. It started with one Under 10 team in 2001/02 playing in the London County Saturday Youth Football League.

Following on from their success more age group teams have gradually been added and the club now offers a direct pathway in boys' football from Under 7 to Senior First Team semi-professional level at Step 5 in the Football League Ladder.

The club also has an ever-expanding, high achieving, County Cup winning girls section which currently offers football from Under 10 to Under 16 and a pathway into the Senior Women's team who play in the Greater London Women's Football League Division 2 South.

Following a playing ethos of trying to bring a bit of Barcelona to Balham the age group section of the club has been extremely successful to date, winning and being runners up in over 600 League and Cup Competitions, which includes being Champions of London.

The club, which has a partnership agreement with Fulham FC, has also been an unprecedented three-time winner of the London FA Charter Standard Community Club of the Year Award and a four-time winner of the Wandsworth Sports Club of the Year Award.

After nine seasons of age group football between 2001-2010 an Under 18 Youth team was launched. The team played for seven seasons in the Southern Youth League.

The team moved into the newly formed Combined Counties League Youth Section for the 2017/18 season. In 2018/19 the team were League Champions and League Cup Winners and in 2022/23 they were East Division Runners Up.

Following the launch of a Youth team the flagship First Team was founded as Balham FC in 2011.

Having won back-to-back promotions in 2011/12 and 2012/13, Balham did the League and Cup double in the Surrey South-Eastern Combination League in 2013/14.

Welcome to Balham



In 2014/15 Balham finished in a promotion position again, in the Surrey Elite Intermediate Football League, however promotion was denied due to Combined Counties League facility requirements not being met.

Having moved to ground share with Cobham FC, to meet the facility requirements, Balham finished as Runners Up in the SEIFL in 2015/16 and as a result were promoted to Division One of the Combined Counties League for the 2016/17 season.

The club had an exceptional first league campaign at Step 6, finishing in a promotion position for the sixth consecutive season and winning the London Senior Trophy.

In 2017/18 the club had an equally exceptional season finishing 5th at Step 5 in the Premier Division of the CCL and winning the London Senior Cup.

2023/24 will be the club's seventh season at this level after flirting with relegation in 2018/19 and then having null-and-void seasons in 2019/20 and 2020/21 due to COVID-19.

Having begun on Wimbledon Extension, before moving to Cobham and then to the Wibbandune Stadium, where the club ground shared with Colliers Wood United, Balham moved again in 2020, this time to the Mayfield Stadium, where the club embarked on a ground share agreement with AFC Croydon Athletic, which comes to an end in 2024.

Moving location meant having to move sideways in the Football League Pyramid, from the Premier Division of the CCL into the Premier Division of the SCEFL (South East Counties Football League)

After one single season in the SCEFL however, the FA brought Balham back to the Combined Counties League for the 2021/22 season, at the same level, in a newly formed Premier League South.

Since returning, the club has finished 8th in the league in the 2021/22 season, 9th in the 2022/23 and 2023/24 season

Epsom & Ewell handed a debut to new signing Brendan Murphy-McVey from South Park, who started in the line-up.

Unfortunately, The Salts got off to the worst possible start. After just five minutes, Stefan Aiwone slipped while trying to defend and caught the Tadley forward. To the shock of many, the referee awarded a penalty and showed Stefan a straight red card — a decision that felt extremely harsh. Kieran Rodgers stepped up and converted the penalty to give Tadley an early 1-0 lead.

Despite being reduced to ten men, The Salts responded positively, playing some good football and pushing forward. On 11 minutes, manager Warren Burton was booked from the sidelines. Shortly after, Brendan Murphy-McVey almost produced a moment of magic, hitting a superb shot that crashed against the crossbar after beating the Tadley keeper.

In the 34th minute, goalkeeper Sami Nabbad was judged to have carried the ball outside his area as his momentum took him over the line. He received a yellow card and Tadley were awarded a free-kick in a dangerous position. From that free-kick, Ash Neal doubled Tadley's lead, making it 2-0.

Nabbad then produced a fantastic save to keep The Salts in the game as Tadley pushed for a third. The score remained 2-0 at half-time.

After the break, Tadley extended their lead on 56 minutes when Kieran Rodgers scored his second to make it 3-0. However, The Salts showed great character to get back into the match. On 59 minutes, a defensive slip by Tadley allowed top scorer Carl Oblitey to pounce and pull one back, making it 3-1.

Sadly, any hopes of a comeback were short-lived, as Kieran Rodgers completed his hat-trick in the 64th minute to restore Tadley's three-goal advantage (4-1).

Warren Burton made changes to try and inject fresh energy into the side. On 68 minutes, Sean Michael Anderson replaced Jason Bloor, and on 70 minutes, Ali Forahan came on for the hard-working Brendan Murphy-McVey.

Just three minutes later, substitute Ali Forahan capitalised on a mistake by the Tadley keeper, who dropped the ball under pressure. Fofahan was quick to react, firing home to make it 4-2 and give The Salts a glimmer of hope.

On 78 minutes, Conrad Essillian-Waul came on for Ethan Brazier as The Salts looked to push on.

However, the drama was far from over. In the 81st minute, the referee appeared to lose control. He first booked Ali Fofahan, then showed Carl Oblitey a yellow card before sinbinning him. As Carl tried to leave the pitch, he collapsed due to injury. When physio Jodie came on to attend to him, incredibly, the referee showed Carl a second yellow and sent him off — apparently for being injured! This bizarre sequence left Epsom & Ewell down to nine men for the remainder of the match.

With their numerical advantage, Tadley added a fifth goal in the final minute through Oliver Rowan to seal a 5-2 victory.

The Salts battled bravely throughout, showing great resilience despite playing with ten men for 80 minutes and nine for the last ten. Unfortunately, some defensive slips and a referee whose performance left a lot to be desired made the task too great.



Overall, the game was poor, with an uneven pitch making passing difficult. As a result, both teams resorted to long balls, which the City defence dealt with comfortably.

City's No. 7, Reid Solanki, started brightly and caused some early problems for Kionte Cillfillian-Waul, but perseverance — along with some support from midfield — prevented any dangerous balls into the box.

On 34 minutes, Guildford had the first attempt on target after a poor clearance from the Epsom defence, but a good cross was met with a poor header that landed safely in Sami Nabbad's hands.

Two minutes later, a good move from Guildford saw Solanki stretch the Salts defence again, and his shot struck the bottom of the post.

The Salts responded with a promising move involving Luke Miller and Kionte, whose cross into the box found Jason Bloor, but he was unable to find the target from close range. It looked as though we were heading into halftime at 0-0 until a long ball tempted the Guildford keeper out of his box with Jason bearing down. The keeper caught the ball outside the area, leading to an inevitable red card. City centre-half and captain Stingelin took the gloves, but Adam Green's ensuing free kick went high and wide. Halftime: 0-0.

After the break, you would hope the Salts would have a plan to test the 10 men and stand-in keeper, but it took 15 minutes before we had a shot on target. Another foul on Jason just outside the box presented a good opportunity. Luke Miller's low, hard shot looked destined for the bottom right corner, but the keeper got down well to save — our first real chance gone.

Epsom & Ewell began pushing forward but left gaps at the back, and on 62 minutes, City's No. 19 Darnell Jon-Peter broke through the Salts defence, holding off weak challenges. Spotting Sami off his line, he produced a sublime chip to give Guildford the lead: 1-0. Sean Michael Anderson replaced Niall Stillwell on 64 minutes as the Salts looked to respond.

On 70 minutes we had our best chance aside from the free kick — a great ball from Adam found Jason Bloor, but lacking composure, he snatched at the shot, and it drifted wide.

Moments later, another excellent delivery from Adam found Jason again, but this time his shot deflected off the bar and out for a corner. Unfortunately, the ensuing corners were poor and easily dealt with by City's defenders.

Soon after, Jon-Peter again dribbled through the middle of our defence and, seeing Sami off his line, tried to replicate his earlier finish — but this time he sent it high over the bar, with Sami beaten.

The Salts made a second change on 76 minutes with Anthony Nazareth replacing Stefan Alwone. Though we pressed for an equaliser, we lacked the quality to break down Guildford's solid defence.

On 81 minutes, a poor challenge by Jon-Peter caught Nick Boston on the foot. There were worrying moments as he stayed down, but thankfully, after some time, he was able to limp off — hopefully, nothing serious. Toby Young replaced Nick, making his first appearance after a long layoff — great to see him back!

In the final ten minutes, plus five minutes of added time, we failed to mount any serious pressure. Long balls and misplaced passes were easily cleared by Guildford, who saw out the game comfortably.

The Salts now drop to 18th, only four points above an improving Balham, though we have four games in hand.

All spectators attending home matches are required to read and comply with this Code of Conduct, and to respect the same principles when attending our away fixtures at other clubs.

The Club reserves the right to amend, alter or update this Code of Conduct and to eject, ban or prosecute as appropriate/necessary at their sole discretion.

Please remember that your behaviour reflects on Epsom & Ewell FC and could result in fines and in extreme cases heavier sanctions being imposed upon the club.

Entering and Leaving the ground

Please don't enter if you have Covid or Covid like symptoms or have been in close contact with anyone who has Covid. If you have driven to the ground, please park your vehicle considerately, don't block in others, and in particular don't block our neighbours' access to their houses. Out of respect for our neighbours, please keep noise levels down, especially late-night revelry, and don't litter the area. Don't attempt to bring Flares or Fireworks of any description into the ground. We reserve the right to check all bags and suspicious objects, and any found will be confiscated. No alcoholic drinks are allowed to be brought into the ground. We reserve the right to check all bags and suspicious objects, and any found will be confiscated. Don't attempt to bypass the gate security checks, smuggle drinks of any kind into the ground or bypass the turnstiles without payment. Anyone found doing so will be evicted from the ground.

Within the ground

Be respectful to club officers, staff, security, stewards, and other fans at all times. Don't obstruct the normal activities of the Club and its officers. Don't stand in seating areas or access gangways or steps. Don't behave in a manner that compromises the comfort, enjoyment or safety of others. Always behave appropriately and don't bring the Club into disrepute. The following behaviour will not be tolerated and will result in immediate eviction and ban. Being drunk or under the influence of drugs and behaving anti socially. Threatening behaviour, use of obscene or abusive language, persistent swearing and/or making vulgar gestures. Racial, homophobic or any other form of discriminatory abuse, chanting or harassment. Fighting. Entering the field of play before, during or after the game. The throwing of any missile or object onto the field of play. The letting off of any flare or firework.

Furthermore, **the following are strictly forbidden** and may result in immediate eviction and ban for repeat offenders...

The consumption of alcohol in bottles, glasses or cans in the stands, terraces and other open areas within the ground. The climbing up or onto floodlights, stands, buildings, roofs, fences or any other structure. The obstruction of any walkways and pedestrian routes. The playing of ball games in areas populated by ground visitors. Allowing any animal to roam off the leash within the ground confines. The parking of any vehicle blocking Emergency Vehicle access. The length of any ban imposed will be related to the severity of offence and solely at the discretion of The Club. Any appeal may be made in writing through The Club Secretary and will be given full and due consideration.
