Balham History

Balham FC is run by a Board of Directors: Greg Cruttwell, Derek Fordham and Jennie Molyneux. They are joined on the Club Committee by Zoe Appleton, Len Chapman and Steve Pigott.

The club was originally founded by Greg Cruttwell in 2001 as Balham Blazers FC. It started with one Under 10 team in 2001/02 playing in the London County Saturday Youth Football League.

Following on from their success more age group teams have gradually been added and the club now offers a direct pathway in boys' football from Under 7 to Senior First Team semi-professional level at Step 5 in the Football League Ladder.

The club also has an ever-expanding, high achieving, County Cup winning girls section which currently offers football from Under 10 to Under 16 and a pathway into the Senior Women's team who play in the Greater London Women's Football League Division 2 South.

Following a playing ethos of trying to bring a bit of Barcelona to Balham the age group section of the club has been extremely successful to date, winning and being runners up in over 600 League and Cup Competitions, which includes being Champions of London.

The club, which has a partnership agreement with Fulham FC, has also been an unprecedented three-time winner of the London FA Charter Standard Community Club of the Year Award and a four-time winner of the Wandsworth Sports Club of the Year Award.

After nine seasons of age group football between 2001-2010 an Under 18 Youth team was launched. The team played for seven seasons in the Southern Youth League.

The team moved into the newly formed Combined Counties League Youth Section for the 2017/18 season. In 2018/19 the team were League Champions and League Cup Winners and in 2022/23 they were East Division Runners Up.

Following the launch of a Youth team the flagship First Team was founded as Balham FC in 2011.

Having won back-to-back promotions in 2011/12 and 2012/13, Balham did the League and Cup double in the Surrey South-Eastern Combination League in 2013/14.

In 2014/15 Balham finished in a promotion position again, in the Surrey Elite Intermediate Football League, however promotion was denied due to Combined Counties League facility requirements not being met.

Having moved to ground share with Cobham FC, to meet the facility requirements, Balham finished as Runners Up in the SEIFL in 2015/16 and as a result were promoted to Division One of the Combined Counties League for the 2016/17 season.

The club had an exceptional first league campaign at Step 6, finishing in a promotion position for the sixth consecutive season and winning the London Senior Trophy.

In 2017/18 the club had an equally exceptional season finishing 5th at Step 5 in the Premier Division of the CCL and winning the London Senior Cup.

2023/24 will be the club's seventh season at this level after flirting with relegation in 2018/19 and then having null-and-void seasons in 2019/20 and 2020/21 due to COVID-19.

Having begun on Wimbledon Extension, before moving to Cobham and then to the Wibbandune Stadium, where the club ground shared with Colliers Wood United, Balham moved again in 2020, this time to the Mayfield Stadium, where the club embarked on a ground share agreement with AFC Croydon Athletic, which comes to an end in 2024.

Moving location meant having to move sideways in the Football League Pyramid, from the Premier Division of the CCL into the Premier Division of the SCEFL (South East Counties Football League)

After one single season in the SCEFL however, the FA brought Balham back to the Combined Counties League for the 2021/22 season, at the same level, in a newly formed Premier League South.

Since returning, the club has finished 8th in the league in the 2021/22 season, 9th in the 2022/23 and 2023/24 season



Whyteleafe applied pressure from the start and took the lead after just six minutes through Daniel Bennett. However, the Salts didn't crumble and began to play on the front foot, pressing Whyteleafe higher up the pitch. Captain Adam Green was booked for handball, but as the half progressed, Epsom & Ewell grew into the game.

In the 37th minute, forward Carl Oblitey scored a superb goal to level the match at 1-1. The Salts continued to push forward, forcing the home keeper into several errors. Despite their momentum, the score remained level at half-time.

At the start of the second half, Jayden Barber made his debut, replacing Ethan Brazier. On 62 minutes, Daniel Bennett struck again to restore Whyteleafe's lead. In response, the Salts made changes, with Conrad replacing Niall Stillwell and the injured Callum Wilson making way for Craig Dundas.

Further substitutions followed in the 82nd minute, as Jack Torbett and Campbell Scott came on for Luke Miller and Ethan Nelson-Roberts. With the Salts pushing forward in search of an equaliser, they lost possession in midfield, allowing Whyteleafe to break and score at the far post through Aaron Watson in the 85th minute.

Right at the end, Jayden Barber picked up a yellow card. The final scoreline was somewhat harsh on the Salts, who had battled bravely against the league's top side.

Epsom & Ewell faced another North Division side in the League Cup, making the gruelling 130-mile midweek journey to take on Wallingford & Crowmarsh. The squad welcomed back George Owusu, who played for the club last season, along with new signing Naseem James. Callum Wilson also returned to the starting line-up.

The Salts started brightly but struggled to penetrate the opposition's box, with their long balls being dealt with too easily by the Wallingford defence. It was the hosts who broke the deadlock in the 19th minute through James Williams.

Kevin Kardel produced a fine save in the 26th minute to keep Epsom & Ewell in the game, and despite their efforts, the score remained 1-0 at half-time. Hopes of a second-half improvement quickly faded as the Salts struggled to string passes together.

Wallingford doubled their lead in the 62nd minute when James Williams netted his second of the evening. Just five minutes later, Luke Miller brought down his marker in the box, conceding a penalty and receiving a booking in the process. 

The Wakes' next stop will be Surrey, specifically Combined Counties League Premier Division South title challengers AFC Whyteleafe, for a last-eight clash on March 1.

It's often said the route to Wembley is a long one in the FA Vase, and Monday's last eight draw took place some 163 days on from a first qualifying round success against Harrowby United at the JJ Mac Stadium back in August.

Not that Bourne's supporters seem to care; seats have sold out already on two buses for next month's 300-mile round trip to the Leafe's Church Road home.

Goode added: "It's a dream for our fans, and for us.

"The backing we've had on this run is something else.

Contention

Bourne have never reached this stage of the FA Vase in 44 previous attempts, and they remain in contention for honours on four fronts.

They sit second in the United Counties League's Premier Division North table following a 2-1 defeat at fellow promotion hopefuls Lincoln United in midweek, halting a 19 game unbeaten sequence in all competitions that started in mid-October.

Goode's side will attempt to reach the Lincolnshire FA Senior Trophy final on Wednesday, and are also through to the league cup's latter stages.

He said: "There are no distractions.

"We don't care what competition it is; we just want to win the next game, and then the one after that.

"I know the players have quality, but I'm about the people too.

"And there are loads of good ones in our dressing room.

"They've come through demanding situations before, and that's exactly what they did [against Atherton LR]."

Heroics

No rival still standing has scored more goals than the Wakes' tally of 22 in seven ties, led by star player Zac Allen with five, and they have netted late to prevail on three occasions.

Goalkeeper Dan Swan's heroics in Lancashire – where he saved three spot-kicks to secure a sudden-death success – further demonstrated Bourne's resilience.

Goode added: "I was exhausted afterwards but what a special feeling.

"We want more of that."
