Founded in 1922 as the London & District Combination Football League, and renamed the Combined Counties Football League in 1978, the 2024–25 Cherry Red Combined CCL season will be the 47th in the history of the league. The league consists of four divisions for the second time, with a new Division Two being added to the Premier North, the Premier South and Division One. Division Two is intended largely for reserve and U23 sides, although it is also open to first teams.

For season 2024-25, both CCL Premier Divisions have 20 clubs, Division 1 has 23, and there is a new Division 2, mostly featuring reserve and U23 teams.

Premier Division North

Flackwell Heath and Rayners Lane have been promoted to step 4 and Chalfont St Peter relegated to Division 1. Amersham Town, Berks County and British Airways have all joined from Division 1, and Woking & Emmbrook are now known as Wokingham Town.

Premier Division South

Farnham Town and AFC Croydon Athletic have been promoted to Step 4 and Colliers Wood United relegated to Division 1.

Chipstead and Corinthian-Casuals join after relegation from Isthmian League South Central, and AFC Whyteleafe are promoted in.

Division 1

Chalfont St Peter and Colliers Wood United arrive from CCL Premier Divisions. Promoted into this division are Belstone (Herts Senior County), PFC Victoria (Middlesex County), Staines & Lammas (Surrey Premier) and Windsor & Eton (Thames Valley).

B2B Statement



Epsom and Ewell Council signed off the proposed Local Plan in December and the plan is now out for public consultation until February 5th. Details of how you can comment on the plan can be found at https://epsom-ewell.gov.uk/regulation19

Most important is that Hook Road Arena has been included in the plan to provide a sports facility with a housing "enabling" scheme which will enable the funds required.

Had the arena not been included it would have made our application to provide a sports hub along with a new stadium a lot more difficult.

Some of the local "Green Belt Groups" were against Hook Road being included at it was classed as Green Belt but the housing will be built in the South West corner which used to house the former hospital railway and the rest of the site previously had football pitches. The sports facility will help prevent the whole arena from being used for housing at some stage in the future

The club is now in conversation with the Council officers to provide a lease to enable the application to be progressed.

Barry and I had a team meeting with Helen Maguire on Thursday 23rd Jan 2025, She fully supports this proposal and is happy to engage with our local Council's fingers crossed that it is agreed on the 28th March.

Cobham History

Cobham Football Club was formed on Friday 5 November 1886 by Founding President, Hon. Alan Egerton MP and villagers connected with the local Coffee Tavern. The Vicar offered to supply it with a football. On 4 November 1890, The Evening Telegraph reported on the death of our Centre Half, Arthur Smith, following injuries sustained in a match vs Kingston Wanderers. In 1892, the Club affiliated to the Surrey FA. The home ground was never settled with various fields around the outskirts of the village being used at different times. During the late 1920's they played in the Kingston and District League winning division 1 in 1928/29 and 1929/30. Following the Club gaining intermediate status in 1933, Cobham won the Surrey Intermediate League Cup (Central) in 1933/34 and 1935/36. The Club achieved senior status in 1938 upon election to the new Surrey Senior League. The war years between 1939 to 1945 saw a vote to agree a temporary merger with the Avorians Sports Club to form Cobham Avorians to ensure local football continued. After the War, the Club made home at Cobham recreation ground until 1955/6 when it moved to Anvil lane also known as the Leg o' Mutton field. The club took its nickname from the word anvil and thus became the Hammers. Phil Walker and Trevor Lee of Millwall FC and Cricketer Bob Willis of Surrey & England are amongst famous ex-players. During the 70's, 80's and 90's the club had a really good local feel with the ground being a vibrant hub of football. The World Famous Rock Band, Moody Blues, played an Annual Charity Match at Cobham Football Club, giving us our record attendance of 2,000 in 1974/75. The floodlights were installed in season 1996/97 and were christened with a game against Conference side Woking FC on 18th February 1997.

he Hammers were founder members of the Combined Counties League moving up from the now defunct Surrey Senior League. They finished second to Ash United in 1998/9. Amongst long serving stalwarts such as Dave Tippetts who first joined the club in the 1980's, the pride of place on the clubhouse wall goes to a painting of Reg Madgwick, who served as player, committee member and fund raiser. When he died in 1995, he requested his ashes be scattered on the pitch and left all his worldly possessions to the club and the decision was made to rename the ground The Reg Madgwick Stadium in his honour.

Welcome to Cobham



The Club won the Combined Counties Premier League Challenge Cup in 2001/02 beating Bedfont FC 3-2. After the stand went up in 2004, the club was a mainstay in the Combined Counties Division 1 under the guidance until 2015 of the late Ken Reed who died in 2018. After a new committee was elected in 2015 led by Dave Tippetts, the club has built its Junior football with 16 sides to compliment the men's team and the new seated stand, new fencing and the dual turnstile were put in during April 2016 to allow the ground to achieve a Grade D (Step 4) rating. 2017/2018 saw the club promoted to the Combined Counties Premier Division under the guidance of Sam Merison and the introduction of an Under 23 side to support the first team. During the covid years, Cobham enjoyed record cup runs in the FA Cup (1st qualifying round) and last 16 of the FA Vase in 2020/21. The club most recent trophies are the unique weekend double achieved by the Under 23's winning the Surrey Elite Intermediate League's Reserve Division Covid Cup & Challenge Cup in 2021 beating Frimley Green Under 23's & Virginia Water Reserves both on penalties. This adds to their 2019 triumph over SCR FC under 23's also on penalties to win the Combined Counties Development League Cup. Craig Lewington took over as First Team Manager in June 2022. In 2023 Sam Merison and Dave Tippetts led the development of the clubs new £1m artificial grass pitch. Committee stalwarts such as Ewemade Orobator and Mark Cornish have helped to grow the club and gain many of the town's businesses on board as sponsors and suppliers. The Hammers are on a firm footing as a 2 star accredited club, with the town and families at the heart of our plans.

- The game encountered a minor hitch before kick-off, as one of the assistant referees broke down on their way to the match. Fortunately, the other assistant was able to pick up a replacement official enroute, ensuring the game went ahead as planned.
- With regular goalkeeper Dan sidelined due to Injury, young Kevin Kardel stepped in and impressed once again by keeping a clean sheet for the Salts.
- The game began scrappily, as both sides understood the importance of the fixture. In a tense first half, chances were limited. Skipper Adam Green received a booking for Epsom & Ewell, while Spelthorne. Sports picked up a couple of yellow cards themselves. The best chance of the half fell to Nathan Best, whose shot grazed the crossbar. However, neither team could break the deadlock, and it remained goalless at half-time.

The second half saw the game spring to life. In the S6th minute, the Salts were awarded a penalty after Spelthorne Sports were reduced to 10 men due to a second yellow card. Wil. Kendall stepped up to take the penalty, but his effort was saved by the Spelthorne goalkeeper.

Substitutions followed, with Craig Dundas replacing Conrad Essilfie-Conduct in the 63rd minute, and Tobi Falodi coming on for Ethan Nelson-Roberts in the 81st minute. Spelthorne were forced into a goalkeeper change shortly after and then went down to nine men following another dismissal. The Salts picked up a late booking in added time, with Kionte Gillfillian-Waul shown a yellow card in the 90+1 minute.

As the game neared its conclusion, the breakthrough finally came. A high ball into the box from Nicolas Bostan was flicked on by Will Kendall, and substitute Craig Dundas was in the right place to fire the ball home. His late goal secured all three points for the Salts.

The non-league pyramid in England consists of seven tiers, starting with the National League at the to and culminating in the countless local leagues at the bottom. Each tier is further divided into divisions creating a complex and interconnected system. The National League is the highest level of non-league football, with clubs competing for promotion to the English Football League. Below the National League are the National League North and South, followed by the Northern Premier League, Southern League, and the Isthmian League.

The Club reserves the right to amend, alter or update this Code of Conduct and to eject, ban or prosecute as appropriate/necessary at their sole discretion.

Please remember that your behaviour reflects on Epsom & Ewell FC and could result in fines and in extreme cases heavier sanctions being imposed upon the club.

Entering and Leaving the ground

Please don't enter if you have Covid or Covid like symptoms or have been in close contact with anyone who has Covid. If you have driven to the ground, please park your vehicle considerately, don't block in others, and in particular don't block our neighbours' access to their houses. Out of respect for our neighbours, please keep noise levels down, especially late-night revelry, and don't litter the area. Don't attempt to bring Flares or Fireworks of any description into the ground. We reserve the right to check all bags and suspicious objects, and any found will be confiscated. No alcoholic drinks are allowed to be brought into the ground. We reserve the right to check all bags and suspicious objects, and any found will be confiscated. Don't attempt to bypass the gate security checks, smuggle drinks of any kind into the ground or bypass the turnstiles without payment. Anyone found doing so will be evicted from the ground.

Within the ground

Be respectful to club officers, staff, security, stewards, and other fans at all times. Don't obstruct the normal activities of the Club and its officers. Don't stand in seating areas or access gangways or steps. Don't behave in a manner that compromises the comfort, enjoyment or safety of others. Always behave appropriately and don't bring the Club into disrepute. The following behaviour will not be tolerated and will result in immediate eviction and ban. Being drunk or under the influence of drugs and behaving anti socially. Threatening behaviour, use of obscene or abusive language, persistent swearing and/or making vulgar gestures. Racial, homophobic or any other form of discriminatory abuse, chanting or harassment. Fighting. Entering the field of play before, during or after the game. The throwing of any missile or object onto the field of play. The letting off of any flare or firework.

Furthermore, the following are strictly forbidden and may result in immediate eviction and ban for repeat offenders...

The consumption of alcohol in bottles, glasses or cans in the stands, terraces and other open areas within the ground. The climbing up or onto floodlights, stands, buildings, roofs, fences or any other structure. The obstruction of any walkways and pedestrian routes. The playing of ball games in areas populated by ground visitors. Allowing any animal to roam off the leash within the ground confines. The parking of any vehicle blocking Emergency Vehicle access. The length of any ban imposed will be related to the severity of offence and solely at the discretion of The Club. Any appeal may be made in writing through The Club Secretary and will be given full and due consideration.
