Epsom and Ewell Women



It has been an incredible journey for our team, evolving from grassroots football into competitive women's football. After spending several years as part of the Colts, we had the option to continue in the U18 grassroots league for two more seasons. However, an exciting opportunity arose to step up into Tier 7 of the Women's Football Premier League, and we embraced the challenge.

This transition wasn't without its challenges. At the start of the season, many of our current players were still too young to take to the pitch, having to patiently wait until they turned 16 before becoming eligible. With a large squad split between the U18 JPL Colts team and the Women's team, squad selection has been a demanding process, but one that reflects the strength and depth of our player pool.

A crucial early addition to the squad was goalkeeper Gemma Vardon. Not only has she provided us with a solid presence between the posts, but she has also shown a keen interest in progressing into a player-coach role. This will further strengthen our coaching team and contribute to the long-term development of the squad.

John French and I are fortunate to be supported by Ayulie Dabor, whose extensive experience working with previous Colts girls' teams has brought energy, enthusiasm, and expertise to our training sessions. John, in addition to his coaching role, also brings his medical knowledge as a GP, ensuring the welfare of our players both on and off the pitch. As for myself, my focus is on maintaining a fair but competitive ethos that keeps the team striving for success.

At the start of the season, our target was simple: to be competitive. We had a realistic ambition to avoid the bottom of the table, with a sixth-place finish as our ideal target. The early part of the season was an unknown, but as we progressed, it became clear that we could position ourselves well in this league.

One of the biggest takeaways from our first season so far has been the disparity in quality across the division—the difference between the top and bottom teams has been striking. That being said, we have proven that we belong at this level. As the youngest team in the league—possibly the smallest as well—we have shown ourselves to be one of the most technically gifted teams to watch. We have been unfortunate in a few matches where the results could have easily gone our way, which would have significantly changed our position in the table. However, rather than dwelling on 'what ifs,' we prefer to focus on the facts: we are competitive, we have been praised for our technical ability, and we are steadily improving where it matters—scoring goals.

Recent performances have shown that we are beginning to convert our chances, and that is a testament to the players' hard work and dedication. These are still early days for us, but the pathway is now firmly in place for the future. Tier 7 is winnable, and with further development and additional strength coming through for next season, that is certainly the aim.

The journey has only just begun, and we are incredibly proud of how far we have come. The future of women's football at this club is bright, and we can't wait to see what comes next.

Cobham Football Club was formed on Friday 5 November 1886 by Founding President, Hon. Alan Egerton MP and villagers connected with the local Coffee Tavern. The Vicar offered to supply it with a football. On 4 November 1890, The Evening Telegraph reported on the death of our Centre Half, Arthur Smith, following injuries sustained in a match vs Kingston Wanderers. In 1892, the Club affiliated to the Surrey FA. The home ground was never settled with various fields around the outskirts of the village being used at different times. During the late 1920's they played in the Kingston and District League winning division 1 in 1928/29 and 1929/30. Following the Club gaining intermediate status in 1933, Cobham won the Surrey Intermediate League Cup (Central) in 1933/34 and 1935/36. The Club achieved senior status in 1938 upon election to the new Surrey Senior League. The war years between 1939 to 1945 saw a vote to agree a temporary merger with the Avorians Sports Club to form Cobham Avorians to ensure local football continued. After the War, the Club made home at Cobham recreation ground until 1955/6 when it moved to Anvil lane also known as the Leg o' Mutton field. The club took its nickname from the word anvil and thus became the Hammers. Phil Walker and Trevor Lee of Millwall FC and Cricketer Bob Willis of Surrey & England are amongst famous explayers. During the 70's, 80's and 90's the club had a really good local feel with the ground being a vibrant hub of football. The World Famous Rock Band, Moody Blues, played an Annual Charity Match at Cobham Football Club, giving us our record attendance of 2,000 in 1974/75. The floodlights were installed in season 1996/97 and were christened with a game against Conference side Woking FC on 18th February 1997. The Hammers were founder members of the Combined Counties League moving up from the now defunct Surrey Senior League. They finished second to Ash United in 1998/9. Amongst long serving stalwarts such as Dave Tippetts who first joined the club in the 1980's, the pride of place on the clubhouse wall goes to a painting of Reg Madgwick, who served as player, committee member and fund raiser. When he died in 1995, he requested his ashes be scattered on the pitch and left all his worldly possessions to the club and the decision was made to rename the ground The Reg Madgwick Stadium in his honour.

The Club won the Combined Counties Premier League Challenge Cup in 2001/02 beating Bedfont FC 3-2. After the stand went up in 2004, the club was a mainstay in the Combined Counties Division 1 under the guidance until 2015 of the late Ken Reed who died in 2018. After a new committee was elected in 2015 led by Dave Tippetts, the club has built its Junior football with 16 sides to compliment the men's team and the new seated stand, new fencing and the dual turnstile were put in during April 2016 to allow the ground to achieve a Grade D (Step 4) rating. 2017/2018 saw the club & Virginia Water Reserves both on penalties. This adds to their 2019 triumph over SCR FC under 23's also on penalties to win the Combined Counties Development League Cup promoted to the Combined Counties Premier Division under the guidance of Sam Merison and the introduction of an Under 23 side to support the first team. During the covid years, Cobham enjoyed record cup runs in the FA Cup (1st qualifying round) and last 16 of the FA Vase in 2020/21. The club most recent trophies are the unique weekend double achieved by the Under 23's winning the Surrey Elite Intermediate League's Reserve Division Covid Cup & Challenge Cup in 2021 beating Frimley Green Under 23's.

Craig Lewington took over as First Team Manager in June 2022. In 2023 Sam Merison and Dave Tippetts led the development of the clubs new £1Million artificial grass pitch. Committee stalwarts such as Ewemade Orobator and Mark Cornish have helped to grow the club and gain many of the town's businesses on board as suppliers and sponsors, The Hammers are on firm footing as a 2 star accredited club, with the town and families at the heart of our plans.



Niall Stillwell almost opened the scoring with a fine shot that the Knaphill keeper did well to tip around the post. From the resulting corner, Stillwell managed to get his head to the ball but couldn't quite direct it on target.

Epsom & Ewell eventually took the lead in the 18th minute when Stillwell delivered a well-placed ball into the box. Striker Carl Oblitey directed it goalwards, but it struck the hand of Knaphill's No. 3, Jamie Glover. The referee awarded a penalty, and skipper Adam Green stepped up to confidently fire the ball home, making it 1-0 to the Salts.

After the goal, the Salts continued to dominate. Knaphill's goalkeeper was called into action again to deny Fofana with a good save. Soon after, Fofana had another chance following a brilliant pass from Oblitey, but instead of striking first time, he took an extra touch and couldn't get his shot away.

Epsom & Ewell maintained their pressure but were unable to extend their lead before the break. The score remained 1-0 at half-time.

The second half was more about Knaphill, and three minutes after the restart, the Salts were forced into an early substitution. Having taken several knocks in the first half, an injured player was replaced by Ethan Nelson-Roberts. Soon after, Luke Miller broke into the box and unleashed a shot that went narrowly wide.

In the 55th minute, Knaphill equalised through Dale Burnham. Ten minutes later, Ali Fofana was replaced by George Owusu. Shortly before that, in the 60th minute, Callum Wilson received a yellow card for a foul.

In the 70th minute, Ethan Brazier came on for Niall Stillwell. Moments later, goalkeeper Kevin Kardell was flattened by a Knaphill forward in a nasty challenge. Despite the heavy challenge, Kardell produced a superb save minutes later, tipping the ball around the post.

Knaphill took the lead in the 75th minute when Sid Cannon found the back of the net. In response, the Salts made further changes, bringing on Conrad Essilfie-Conduah for Craig Dundas and Campbell Scott for the injured Callum Wilson.

Epsom & Ewell continued to push forward in search of an equaliser, but despite their efforts, they were unable to find a way back into the game.



Match report 2

Epsom & Ewell 0 Balham 1

Southern Combination Challenge Cup Tuesday 25 February, 2025 Attendance 54



On Tuesday, we welcomed Balham to the Armada Group Stadium for the quarter-final of the Southern Combination Challenge Cup. We have had a good run in cup competitions this season, with the prize of a semi-final against South Park Reigate awaiting the winners.

Balham started quickly and forced a corner in the 5th minute, with the ball flashing right across the E&E goal—fortunately, no one was able to get on the end of it. A couple of minutes later, a quick throw in for the Salts found Ali Fofahan, but he was unable to find another blue shirt, and the attack fizzled out. From the resulting goal kick, Balham moved out of their half, and E&E were punished when a player had his shirt pulled, providing the visitors with an early opportunity to deliver the ball into our box. A free kick just inside our half should have been easily defended, but the cross found Balham's No. 4, Jack Banks, unmarked, and he guided a powerful header into the corner of the net.

You would have hoped this would be the incentive needed for the Salts to "up their game," but apart from a good passing move that ended with Ali Fofahan—his shot being blocked—and another promising attack involving Kionte Gillfillian-Waul and Carl Oblitey, which saw the final ball flash across the Balham goal, there was little in the way of clear-cut chances.

Balham nearly increased their lead in the 34th minute when a shot from a corner struck the underside of the bar and bounced clear. In the final minute of normal time in the first half, we conceded another free kick near the halfway line, earning Ethan Brazier a yellow card for pulling back a Balham forward. Luke Millar had a chance to deliver a cross in injury time, but uncharacteristically, his ball was too high and sailed behind all our players who had made their way into the box. Moments later, a quick Balham break found their attacker one-on-one with Kevin Kardell, who made the first of several excellent saves to keep us in the game. The whistle blew after a couple of minutes of stoppage time, and we went in at the break 1–0 down.

The second half began much like the first, with Balham on the front foot. They had an early opportunity to double their lead, but Marion Galivanes failed to hit the target. Epsom & Ewell tried to apply pressure, but genuine chances remained scarce. Adam Green was unable to hit the target with a header from a Luke Millar corner, and on the 59th minute, Kevin Kardell was called into action again, making a fine save from close range. The Salts made a double substitution on the 65th minute, with Sean Michael Anderson and Conrad Essilific-Conduah replacing Ali Fofahan and Ethan Brazier. The changes nearly paid off when a good move from Sean almost found Carl Oblitey. However, Balham remained dangerous, and another well-worked move down the left led to a cross flashing across our six-yard box. Once again, Kevin Kardell came to the rescue in the 75th minute, making a brilliant save to push the ball around the post for a corner.

Niall Stillwell produced an excellent run and, from just outside the box, fired in an effort that unfortunately went straight to the keeper—our first shot on target of the match. This, ultimately, was the key issue: plenty of effort but a lack of finishing. Kevin Kardell continued to keep us in the game with a couple more crucial saves, but the Salts failed to truly test the Balham goal.

In the 85th minute, Luke Millar was sent to the sin-bin, leaving us a player down for the final 10 minutes. Our bench protested that this was incorrect, as sin-bins are not permitted in cup competitions, but the referee stuck to his decision. Balham comfortably saw out the final moments, and our cup run—after 14 games across various competitions—came to an end.

After the game, it was brought to the referee's attention that he had made an error and should not have shown the "orange" card, which left us a player down for the closing stages. The unfortunate outcome for Balham, who were the better side on the night and deserved the win, is that the game will now be declared void and must be replayed as soon as possible.

Ground Regulations 2024-25



All spectators attending home matches are required to read and comply with this Code of Conduct, and to respect the same principles when attending our away fixtures at other clubs.

Entry to the Ground shall constitute acceptance of this Code of Conduct, the rules and regulations of The Football Association and The Isthmian League.

The Club reserves the right to amend, alter or update this Code of Conduct and to eject, ban or prosecute as appropriate/necessary at their sole discretion.

Please remember that your behaviour reflects on Epsom & Ewell FC and could result in fines and in extreme cases heavier sanctions being imposed upon the club.

Entering and Leaving the ground

Please don't enter if you have Covid or Covid like symptoms or have been in close contact with anyone who has Covid. If you have driven to the ground, please park your vehicle considerately, don't block in others, and in particular don't block our neighbours' access to their houses. Out of respect for our neighbours, please keep noise levels down, especially late-night revelry, and don't litter the area. Don't attempt to bring Flares or Fireworks of any description into the ground. We reserve the right to check all bags and suspicious objects, and any found will be confiscated. No alcoholic drinks are allowed to be brought into the ground. We reserve the right to check all bags and suspicious objects, and any found will be confiscated. Don't attempt to bypass the gate security checks, smuggle drinks of any kind into the ground or bypass the turnstiles without payment. Anyone found doing so will be evicted from the ground.

Within the ground

Be respectful to club officers, staff, security, stewards, and other fans at all times. Don't obstruct the normal activities of the Club and its officers. Don't stand in seating areas or access gangways or steps. Don't behave in a manner that compromises the comfort, enjoyment or safety of others. Being drunk or under the influence of drugs and behaving anti socially. Threatening behaviour, use of obscene or abusive language, persistent swearing and/or making vulgar gestures. Racial, homophobic or any other form of discriminatory abuse, chanting or harassment. Fighting. Entering the field of play before, during or after the game. The throwing of any missile or object onto the field of play. The letting off of any flare or firework.

Furthermore, the following are strictly forbidden and may result in immediate eviction and ban for repeat offenders...

The consumption of alcohol in bottles, glasses or cans in the stands, terraces and other open areas within the ground. The climbing up or onto floodlights, stands, buildings, roofs, fences or any other structure. The obstruction of any walkways and pedestrian routes. The playing of ball games in areas populated by ground visitors. Allowing any animal to roam off the leash within the ground confines. The parking of any vehicle blocking Emergency Vehicle access. The length of any ban imposed will be related to the severity of offence and solely at the discretion of The Club. Any appeal may be made in writing through The Club Secretary and will be given full and due consideration.
