Founded in 1922 as the London & District Combination Football League, and renamed the Combined Counties Football League in 1978, the 2024–25 Cherry Red Combined CCL season will be the 47th in the history of the league. The league consists of four divisions for the second time, with a new Division Two being added to the Premier North, the Premier South and Division One. Division Two is intended largely for reserve and U23 sides, although it is also open to first teams.

For season 2024-25, both CCL Premier Divisions have 20 clubs, Division 1 has 23, and there is a new Division 2, mostly featuring reserve and U23 teams.

Premier Division North

Flackwell Heath and Rayners Lane have been promoted to step 4 and Chalfont St Peter relegated to Division 1. Amersham Town, Berks County and British Airways have all joined from Division 1, and Woking & Emmbrook are now known as Wokingham Town.

Premier Division South

Farnham Town and AFC Croydon Athletic have been promoted to Step 4 and Colliers
Wood United relegated to Division 1.

Chipstead and Corinthian-Casuals join after relegation from Isthmian League South Central, and AFC Whyteleafe are promoted in.

Welcome to Redhill





Redhill history

IIt all started back in 1894, after a meeting between prominent local businessmen in the Warwick Hotel and shortly after, a friendly match was arranged against a Dorking side. That game ended in a two all draw and was played at the club's original home at "Wiggie" a ground lent to the club by their goalkeeper, Mr. H Trower.

Two years later, the club moved into its stadium of 88 years at Memorial Park in the centre of Redhill. At the time, the ground was an open swamp, until proper drainage was installed, which was accomplished under the auspices of a Sports Ground Association, an organisation that lasted until 1919. For the first few years, the club only competed in friendly matches but that all changed in 1898, when Redhill Football Club entered the South Suburban League, followed by various other leagues, that, unfortunately, have since folded.

It didn't take long for the Red's to make an impact; The club were Champions of the East & West Surrey league in 1902/03, and two years later, lost in the Surrey Senior Cup final.

Redhill became members of the Athenian League in 1923 and remained there until the league's demise in 1984. Success came early, being runners up and champions in their first two seasons in the league.

Redhill club history - Part 1

In 1925/26, the club enjoyed possibly its best season; reaching two cup finals and reaching the semi-final of the FA Amateur Cup, losing to Northern Nomads at Arsenals Highbury stadium in front of 17,000 people.

A possible contribution to the final result of that game was the fact that Redhill lost their goalkeeper very early on with a severe jaw injury, this sparked off an unusual football tradition that can still be heard today. Without a 'keeper and down to 10 men, Redhill were reduced to kicking the ball out the ground every time the Nomads attacked and each time, a cry of "Redhill!" was screamed by the supporters of both sides. Over the years this spread around the entire country as both Redhill and the Nomads travelled the land and when war broke out in 1939, the troops took it abroad. Next time you're at a game, anywhere in the world and the ball is booted out of the stadium, you might just hear someone shout "Redhill!"

In 1949, Redhill lost to Arsenal 1- 0 in a friendly that was offered by the Gunners after Redhill provided them with two of their best players at the time; Colin Grimshaw and Bernard Sexton.

In 1957/ 58, Redhill reached the FA Cup 1st Round Proper for their only time. After beating Tooting & Mitcham in the previous round, the Reds travelled to Norwich City, only to lose 6-1, but many write ups at the time gave Redhill plenty of credit for their part.

Redhill club history - Part 2


In the 1960's, A very talented youngster by the name of Ray Hutchins played for Redhill. Not many people in football circles will know the name, but in 1963/64, he won 2 England youth caps whilst playing for Redhill. The other players in the squad were playing for top professional clubs, and one of players was a certain Harry Redknapp playing at the time for West Ham United.

After winning the final Athenian League title in 1984, the Reds were moved into their current home, Kiln Brow. Lack of facilities meant the club could not take their rightful place in the higher league and instead found some success in the London Spartan League, before moving to the Sussex County League in 1988. After many brutal years of ups and downs, following hard work by many club officials and supporters keeping the club alive. Redhill eventually found themselves as runners-up of the Sussex League Division One in 2013, winning promotion to the Isthmian League Division One (South). Redhill's time in the 'Ryman' league was relatively short lived. They finished 3rd from bottom in the relegation zone in their first season but survived when offered a reprieve. The Reds were not so lucky in 2014/15, finishing 2nd from bottom. Again, a reprieve was offered but to play in the Southern League—South & West Division. This was turned down based, amongst other reasons, travel logistics and the financial implications. After back-to-back relegations, the club needed a positive season to build on. The 2016/17 season gave the club that platform, finishing runners up in Combined Counties Division One and gaining promotion, whilst also finishing runners up in the Division One Cup.

Redhill FC won the Combined Counties Premier League Cup in 2020/21 beating Ascot United on Penalties at Cobham FC.

Manager Jordan Clark arrived at Kiln Brow in the last quarter of the 2022-23 season, bringing in his management team and setting about building a new squad at very short notice to complete the last few fixtures.

In 2024 our club enters its 130th year and also 40 years at Kiln Brow.

After all the effort by the club to secure a ground and get the match played, it was fantastic to see the team's performance reflect that determination.

Epsom & Ewell started very quickly, earning a corner after just two minutes. Will Kendall, our No. 9, rose well to meet it but headed just over the bar. The Salts kept up the pressure, and a long throw from Niall forced a goal-line clearance. Will Kendall was quick to react to the rebound but couldn't quite keep the ball down. Burnham had their first chance in the 11th minute, but a weak shot was comfortably saved by our goalkeeper Dan O'Donovan.

The Salts maintained their dominance and took the lead in the 25th minute. Our goal came from a great cross by Anthony Nazareth (Naz), which Sean Michael Anderson volleyed in from ten yards out. It was a superb finish that rewarded the early pressure.

Burnham nearly equalised in the 37th minute when their No. 9 found himself through on goal. However, he was flagged offside, though goalkeeper Dan O'Donovan had already come off his line quickly to make an important save. At the time, Dan didn't know the flag would go up, and his decisive action kept the Salts' lead intact.

In the 40th minute, poor defending from Niall nearly cost us, but a combination of determined defending and Burnham's poor finishing kept us in front.

Epsom & Description of the Break. Craig Dundas delivered a fine ball through to Ethan Nelson-Roberts, who beat the offside trap, surged forward, and delivered a perfectly timed cross to Sean Michael Anderson. Anderson made no mistake, firing home from close range to double the lead. The Salts went into half-time with a 2–0 advantage.

Burnham kept the pressure on throughout the second half, but the Salts defended well, and only great goalkeeping from Dan O'Donovan kept us in front. Dan made four excellent saves, all low down, to keep Burnham at bay. Burnham eventually pulled a goal back in the 63rd minute through Jabir Laraba, but despite their efforts, the Salts held firm to secure the 2–1 victory.

Conrad should have sealed the win in the 86th minute when he was clear through on goal, but his shot was poor and went high and wide. Had he scored, it would have settled the game, but instead, his miss led to a nervy three minutes of injury time. The referee, however, played six minutes in total, keeping the tension high until the final whistle.

This result sees Epsom & Depth progress to the last 32 of the FA Vase for the first time since the 2009/10 season. They will now face VCD Athletic away on 11th January.


It was a disappointing performance all round, particularly after such a promising start.

Entering and Leaving the ground

If you have driven to the ground, please park your vehicle considerately, don't block in others, and in particular don't block our neighbours' access to their houses.
