
THE ROLL OF THE PARTY OF THE PA

Good afternoon and a warm welcome to Barlow's Park to all of our supporters for this afternoon's Combined Counties Premier South fixture versus Epsom & Ewell, I'd also like to extend the welcome to the management team, club officials and supporters of The Salts who have made the trip to face us today.

Our last home fixture saw us contest a hard fought game against Corinthian Casuals, where we ran out one-nil winners. My feeling during the game was that we looked pretty solid in the first half and really comfortable defensively in the second. The team got their organisation apot on and limited The Casuals to very limited attacking success, particularly in the second half. We would've liked to have been a little more effective going forward in open play, but we know we're a danger from set pieces, so to get a goal from this avenue was pleasing for sure.

Onto Saturday, we made the long trip into London to face Tooting & Mitcham. It was a tough, physical test, where we came away with a point. Similarly to the previous game, but the odd moment, I didn't feel that Tooting troubled us too much. We looked very solid, and it took an own goal from a corner to see us go behind. We then made another trip into London to face FA Vase semi-finalists AFC Whyetleafe. This was a disappointing one for us, with us on the end of a five-one defeat. For me, that was such a shame because we'd played better than that in the previous games and, as much as the quality of the opposition can have an impact on your performance, I still felt we had better in us. But it is okay to lose, as long as we learn and pick ourselves back up and perform better in the next game.

That leads us onto today where we face a really tough fixture against an Epsom & Ewell side who will be desperate for points to fight off relegation. We will be looking to bounce back from Tuesday's defeat, so it will make it a great encounter and hopefully one we will come out on top in.





TADLEY, GOD HELP US



Tadley, god help us. A familiar phrase amongst the locals of this town but where exactly does it come from?

TADS (Tadley & District History Society) have published an article on the popular phrase etched into the towns folklore and it goes like this.

For many miles around Tadley people refer to this village, with a knowing smile, as 'Tadley God Help Us', Why?

Many years ago a balloon made an unplanned descent in a clearing in Pamber Forest. The occupants of the balloon asked of a small group of forest workers, 'Where are we?' The workers, considerably frightened by what they thought was a visitation from the heavens replied, 'Tadley', adding the supplication, 'God Help Us!' The balloonists assumed they were in a place called 'Tadley God Help Us'.

WHERE DOES CALLEVA COME FROM?


Many visiting supporters ask us what *Calleva* means in the name Tadley-Calleva. The club's name of Calleva comes from the nearby Roman Town of Calleva Atrebatum, based just outside Silchester.

Calleva Atrebatum (Calleva of the Atrebates) was an Iron Age oppidum, the capital of the Atrebates tribe. It then became a walled town in the Roman province of Britannia, at a major crossroads of the roads of southern Britain.

The modern village of Silchester in Hampshire, England, is about a mile (1.6 km) to the west of the site.


Tadley-Calleva adopted the name as a nod to the heritage and roots of the town and surrounding areas. This can be visibly seen on our badge with the roman gladiator between two besom brooms, which are famous to the town of Tadley.



TOOTING 1-1 TADLEY

Tadley Calleva had to settle for a draw as they travelled to face Tooting & Mitcham United on Saturday.

Calleva were unchanged from their Tuesday night victory at home to Corinthian-Casuals, while Adam Everiss, Kieron Farmer, and Connor Thorne all returned to the bench.

The first half was a fairly uneventful one, with neither side able to make a breakthrough.

They didn't take long in the second half though, as Alex Cruickshank's shot hit Brad Neal, who scored an own goal just two minutes after the restart.

1-0 down with the clock ticking, Tadley would have been feeling the pressure, knowing that any further losses in the run-in would surely end their play-off hopes for good.

Tadley needed a saviour, and that proved to be Connor Thorne.

He arrived from the bench on the hour mark, replacing Dan Williamson, and made an instant impact.

It took Thorne just three minutes to find the net, pulling his side level and setting the game up for a grandstand finish.

Sheldon Wright, Adam Everiss, and Kieron Farmer came on as manager Joe Lawler went for all three points.

1-1 is how it ended though, an imperfect result for both sides.

Tadley sit one spot below the play-offs, with two games in hand on Fleet Town above them.

It's not quite that simple however, as they trail them by eleven points.

OUR HISTORY



Tadley Calleva Football Club are a football club based in Tadley, Hampshire, England. The club is affiliated to the Hampshire Football Association. The club's name of Calleva comes from the nearby Roman Town of Calleva Atrebatum, based just outside Silchester. We currently compete in the Combined Counties League Premier Division South

adley has had a football team since the early 1900's. In the modern era the team was re-formed in 1989 and played in the Basingstoke and North Hants Leagues before winning promotion to the Hampshire League.

The club was formed as Tadley F.C in 1989. We joined the Hampshire League Division Three in 1994, finishing runners-up in 1995–96, gaining promotion to Division Two. The club changed its name to Tadley Town F.C. in 1999 and joined Division One upon reorganisation. In 2004, we changed our name again to the present name and entered the Wessex Football League Division Three. Division Three was renamed Division Two in 2006, and the club finished runners-up in 2007. In the 2007–08 season, we won the Wessex League Division One title but were denied promotion as the ground did not meet the requirements for the Premier Division.

The club achieved its ambition of gaining promotion to the Wessex League Premier Division in 2018-19 season - the highest level (Step 5) that the club has competed at. The goal was to consolidate its position on the field and to make significant progress with the infrastructure off the field. Tadley finished 8th in their first season.

In 2020/21 Tadley had their best run in the FA cup in the club's history, team manager Adam Clarke saw the club reach the First qualifying round.

In 2021/22 Tadley Calleva has seen a chance in league and management, the club has joined the Combined Counties League North. This was due to the FA restructuring at Steps 4-6. Adam Clarke had to step down due to work commitments, we wished Adam the best of luck. Joe Lawler & Ben Dillon was named as joint first team managers for the coming season. In 2021/22 season the club came 12th after a slow start. In season 2022/23 we were moved to the Combined Counties League South.

In September 2014, the club recorded probably the best result of its modern history, defeating Conference South Basingstoke Town on penalties in the Hampshire FA Senior Cup at The Camrose after a 2-2 draw in 90 minutes.



TODAYS OPPONENTS

Epsom & Ewell Football Club, based in Surrey, England, boasts a rich and storied history that spans over a century. The club was founded in 1918, originally as Epsom Juniors, before adopting the name Epsom Town. In 1922, the club merged with Ewell, forming Epsom & Ewell Football Club, a name that reflects the unity of the two neighboring communities.

The club initially competed in local leagues before joining the Surrey Senior League. Their early years were marked by steady progress, and they eventually gained promotion to the more competitive Corinthian League. After the dissolution of that league in 1963, Epsom & Ewell transitioned to the Athenian League, where they continued to build their reputation.

One of the club's most notable achievements came in the 1974-75 season when they reached the final of the FA Vase, a prestigious competition for non-league clubs. Although they were narrowly defeated by Hoddesdon Town in the final, their remarkable cup run solidified their status as a formidable side in non-league football.

In 1977, Epsom & Ewell joined the Isthmian League, where they enjoyed further success. During this period, the club attracted attention for their competitive performances and ability to develop talented players. They consistently challenged for promotion and maintained a strong presence in the league for several decades.

However, like many non-league clubs, Epsom & Ewell faced financial and logistical challenges. The loss of their home ground, West Street, in 1993 was a significant blow. This forced the club to ground-share with other teams, including Leatherhead and Merstham, which disrupted their stability and fan base.

Despite these difficulties, Epsom & Ewell remained resilient, continuing to compete in various divisions of the Combined Counties League. The club's commitment to developing local talent and fostering community engagement has helped them endure through turbulent times.

In recent years, Epsom & Ewell have focused on rebuilding and establishing a solid foundation for future success. With ambitions to secure a permanent home ground and return to higher divisions, the club remains an integral part of the local footballing landscape
