Founded in 1922 as the London & District Combination Football League, and renamed the Combined Counties Football League in 1978, the 2024–25 Cherry Red Combined CCL season will be the 47th in the history of the league. The league consists of four divisions for the second time, with a new Division Two being added to the Premier North, the Premier South and Division One. Division Two is intended largely for reserve and U23 sides, although it is also open to first teams.
















For season 2024-25, both CCL Premier Divisions have 20 clubs, Division 1 has 23, and there is a new Division 2, mostly featuring reserve and U23 teams.

Premier Division North

Flackwell Heath and Rayners Lane have been promoted to step 4 and Chalfont St Peter relegated to Division 1. Amersham Town, Berks County and British Airways have all joined from Division 1, and Woking & Emmbrook are now known as Wokingham Town.

Premier Division South

Farnham Town and AFC Croydon Athletic have been promoted to Step 4 and Colliers Wood United relegated to Division 1.

Chipstead and Corinthian-Casuals join after relegation from Isthmian League South

Central, and AFC Whyteleafe are promoted in.

PROMOTION & RELEGATION 24-25

Promotion from Step 5

The champion club in both Premier North and Premier South will be promoted to Step 4.

The clubs finishing in 2nd to 5th place in each Premier Division will be involved in the play-offs, i.e. 2nd v 5th and 3rd v 4th. The winners of each semi-final will then play off against each other to determine who joins the champion club in being promoted. In all matches the club that finished higher in the League than its opponents will play at home.

Relegation from Step 5

The bottom two clubs in both our Step 5 Divisions will be relegated to Step 6 and placed in the most geographically suited Step 6 Division. Irrespective of any vacancies, the bottom club in both of our Premier Divisions will be relegated.

Promotion from Step 6

The champion club from our Step 6 Division (Division One) will be promoted to Step 5

The clubs finishing in 2nd to 5th places in Division One will be involved in the play-offs, i.e. 2nd v 5th and 3rd v 4th. The winners of each semi-final will then play off against each other to determine who joins the champion club in being promoted. In all matches the club that finished higher in the League than its opponents will play at home.

Relegation from Step 6


The clubs finishing in the bottom three of Division One will be subject to relegation to a Regional Feeder League. The actual number of clubs to be relegated will depend upon vacancies and the number of suitable promotion candidates from the Regional Feeder Leagues (Step 7). This will be decided by the Football Association.

All promotions are subject to clubs having the required facilities in place on 31 March (or having been granted an extension)










Welcome to Tooting & Mitcham





The club was founded in 1932 after a merger between two existing teams, Tooting Town and Mitcham Wanderers. Both clubs had played in the London League and the new entity continued to do so until 1937, when they were accepted into the Athenian League. League form was initially patchy, but consolation was forthcoming in 1938 with the capture of the Surrey Senior Cup as Dulwich Hamlet were overcome at Selhurst Park.

Wartime brought a mixture of friendlies, and a smaller regional league (the South East Combination) was competed in. In 1942, the London Senior Cup was won for the first time with another triumph over south London rivals Dulwich Hamlet - this time by a 5-4 success at Millwall's (old) Den. The club have subsequently lifted this trophy on seven further occasions, most recently in 2021.

The Surrey Senior Cup has been won nine times in total, including a hat-trick in the years 1974 to 1976 - the first time this has been achieved.

In the post-war period, the club continued to play in the Athenian League, lifting the Championship Trophy on two occasions in 1950 and 1955. In 1956, they were accepted into the Isthmian League (then consisting of only one division), winning that Championship in 1960 and 1962, alongside consistently high placings for much of the next decade.

The 1970s saw several notable FA Cup runs alongside mainly high league placings; in the 1975/76 season they achieved their furthest run in the competition when they beat Swindon Town in a third round replay before going out in the fourth to Bradford City.

Having played in the top flight of the Isthmian League since the introduction of extra divisions in 1973, Tooting were relegated for the first time in their history in 1989 when they finished second-bottom of the Premier Division and dropped into Division One. They suffered a further demotion in 1997 after several mediocre seasons.

Happily, better times were just around the corner, and in 2001 the Isthmian League Division Two title was won.

Welcome to Tooting & Mitcham



In 2002, after many years of financial frustrations and setbacks, the club sold their Sandy Lane home to developers and moved into a purpose built stadium at Imperial Fields for the start of the 2002/03 season. However despite the new surroundings, further financial difficulties beset the club and by 2005 they were only able to continue as a result of being taken on by the current owners, Tooting & Mitcham Sports and Leisure Ltd.

Under the new administration, things began to improve on and off the pitch with the team playing a very consistent first half of the 2005/06 season, but injuries and the loss of star player Gavin Grant to Gillingham saw the team lose some of their cutting edge and start to falter, eventually finishing in a disappointing 6th place and losing to Tonbridge Angels in the semi-final of the play-offs.

At the end of this season, former player Billy Smith was appointed as manager. In his first season the club lifted both the London Senior and Surrey Senior Cups, and finished second in the league, but lost the play-off final to Hastings Utd.

The following season, after another runners-up position, the club secured promotion by defeating Worthing 2-0 in the play-off semi-final, and Cray Wanderers 1–0 in the final - both matches taking place at Imperial Fields.

Returning, at last, to the Isthmian Premier after a nineteen year absence, they finished the 2008/09 season in a comfortable 9th place and the following year reached the First Round Proper of the FA Cup for the first time since the '70s. Drawn away to Stockport County, then in the third tier of the Football league, many Tooting supporters made the journey north to take their place in a 3,000+ crowd but, unfortunately, they saw only monsoon-like conditions and a 5-0 defeat.

The management duo of Billy Smith and George Wakeling decided to call it a day at the end of that season, and despite a succession of managers taking the reins over the next few seasons, improvement was not forthcoming and the club finally succumbed to relegation from the Isthmian Premier in 2012.

The next few seasons again saw several managers come and go, with none of them able to bring a lasting upturn in fortunes, before Frank Wilson took his first senior role in football in 2015. An uncertain start did little to suggest major improvement was imminent but Wilson made several changes to his staff and introduced Paul Dale as First Team Coach in November, a move that saw results improve significantly; the club climbed away from the relegation positions and rounded off the campaign with a 2-0 victory over Hendon to lift the London Senior Cup for the seventh time.

The following season saw Tooting & Mitcham and Dorking Wanderers battling it out for the Isthmian League Division One South title, with the Terrors pipping their rivals on Goal Difference after both teams finished with over 100 points.

Premier Division status was again short-lived, unfortunately; with little investment available the team predictably struggled in the higher echelon, yet relegation was only confirmed on the final day with defeat at Metropolitan Police the final nail in the coffin - just one point on the day would have been enough to ensure survival with only one team going down, but it was not to be and the team departed the division the same way they had entered it - on Goal Difference.

The club parted company with Frank Wilson that summer, and installed Ashley Bosah and Cornelius Nwadialor as joint managers. The duo had previously overseen the club's successful U23 side and introduced a number of these youngsters as a slow start became a play-off push after a steady climb up the table. Ultimately, disappointing form at home - where too many games were drawn - meant the team fell just short of their target, and potential consolation in the Surrey Senior Cup was not forthcoming as Metropolitan Police proved to be Tooting's nemesis again with a 2-0 victory in the final at Dorking.

Hopes were high as the 2019/20 season began, but with the team challenging intensely for promotion, the season was abandoned as the Coronavirus pandemic took hold and the country went into lockdown.

The following campaign suffered the same fate after the team had once again started well, but the club managed to lift silverware again as the London FA decided to play the Senior Cup to a conclusion, and on a sweltering afternoon in late May, a young AFC Wimbledon side was vanquished by 2-1 at Hendon's Jubilee Park and another trophy was added to the club's list of honours.

Despite the optimism which followed this, the 2021/22 season started badly, with the club never able to put together a consistent run of results; with relegation looming ever closer they managed to win three of their final five fixtures to haul themselves clear of danger, but it was to be a short-lived reprieve; the following season saw the team struggle to translate performances into points early on, with the inevitable result that the club spent most of the season in the thick of the relegation struggle. With three matches to play, failure to beat Chipstead at home (drew 1-1) led to the Terrors relinquishing Isthmian League status after 67 years. In the close season of 2023, Ashley Bosah stepped back to resume his former duties overseeing the thriving T&MU Academy system.

This led the way clear for the club to announce the appointment of popular former player Jamie Byatt into the Manager's chair, and after a season of consolidation he and his backroom staff are setting their sights on restoring the club to its former glories

Match report 1



Epsom & Ewell 2 Tadley Calleva 1

Against a top side who had beaten us 5–2 just a few weeks ago away from home, the Salts put in a hardworking and determined performance. The opening 15 minutes belonged entirely to Epsom & Ewell, with wave after wave of attack. However, it was Tadley who opened the scoring — and in spectacular fashion. Adam Everiss struck from 40 yards out, his shot flying into the back of the net to give the visitors the lead.

The Salts didn't let their heads drop and continued to play some excellent attacking football. On 41 minutes, Ethan Nelson-Roberts was brought down in the box, and the referee pointed to the spot. Skipper Adam Green stepped up, but the Tadley keeper did well to save the penalty low to his left. Tadley went into the break 1–0 ahead.

The Salts came out for the second half determined to turn the game around and immediately went on the front foot, putting the Tadley keeper under real pressure. Carl Oblitey was shown an unfortunate yellow card on 60 minutes, but he quickly made amends. Just two minutes later, he turned and lobbed the keeper with a cheeky effort from 15 yards out to make it 1–1.

With momentum building, Epsom & Ewell piled on the pressure. Following a quick throw-in, Luke Miller collected the ball and calmly slotted it under the keeper in the 70th minute to make it 2–1 to the Salts.

In the 76th minute, Sean-Michael Anderson and Jack Torbett came on to replace Brendan Murphy-McVey and Niall Stillwell. Tadley thought they had equalised on 80 minutes, but after a long consultation with the assistant referee, the goal was disallowed.

On 83 minutes, Callum Wilson came on for Stefan Aiwone. In the closing stages, fans were delighted to see the welcome return of Ayran Kugathas, who replaced Luke Miller.

The Salts battled until the final whistle, earning a fantastic win against a strong side who had been pushing for the play-offs all season. The victory saw us climb further up the table — and crucially, above our landlords, Corinthian-Casuals.





50 Years Ago Epsom & Ewell in the FA Vase

Clubs from the leagues immediately below the Football League had no realistic chance of playing in a Wembley Final before the FA Council decided to start an 'FA Challenge Trophy' competition in 1969. It was open to all non-Football League clubs registering professional players.

In 1974 The FA Council decided to abolish the official distinction between amateur and professional footballers and this meant the end of The Amateur Cup and Amateur Internationals involving England. At the same time the FA Vase was launched and for the first time in history, small clubs – even village clubs – had the chance of playing in a national final at Wembley. Gradually the two competitions were seeded, and the higher ranked non-league sides Steps 3 & 4 were allocated to the FA Trophy and those in Steps 5 and below to The FA Vase.

The first Vase finalists were Hoddesdon Town from the Spartan League and Epsom & Ewell from the Surrey Senior League. The Hertfordshire side edged home 2-1 before a crowd of 9.000.

Ground Regulations 2024-25



All spectators attending home matches are required to read and comply with this Code of Conduct, and to respect the same principles when attending our away fixtures at other clubs.

Entry to the Ground shall constitute acceptance of this Code of Conduct, the rules and regulations of The Football Association and The Isthmian League.

The Club reserves the right to amend, alter or update this Code of Conduct and to eject, ban or prosecute as appropriate/necessary at their sole discretion.

Please remember that your behaviour reflects on Epsom & Ewell FC and could result in fines and in extreme cases heavier sanctions being imposed upon the club.

Entering and Leaving the ground

Please don't enter if you have Covid or Covid like symptoms or have been in close contact with anyone who has Covid. If you have driven to the ground, please park your vehicle considerately, don't block in others, and in particular don't block our neighbours' access to their houses. Out of respect for our neighbours, please keep noise levels down, especially late-night revelry, and don't litter the area. Don't attempt to bring Flares or Fireworks of any description into the ground. We reserve the right to check all bags and suspicious objects, and any found will be confiscated. No alcoholic drinks are allowed to be brought into the ground. We reserve the right to check all bags and suspicious objects, and any found will be confiscated. Don't attempt to bypass the gate security checks, smuggle drinks of any kind into the ground or bypass the turnstiles without payment. Anyone found doing so will be evicted from the ground.

Within the ground

Be respectful to club officers, staff, security, stewards, and other fans at all times. Don't obstruct the normal activities of the Club and its officers. Don't stand in seating areas or access gangways or steps. Don't behave in a manner that compromises the comfort, enjoyment or safety of others. Always behave appropriately and don't bring the Club into disrepute. The following behaviour will not be tolerated and will result in immediate eviction and ban. Being drunk or under the influence of drugs and behaving anti socially. Threatening behaviour, use of obscene or abusive language, persistent swearing and/or making vulgar gestures. Racial, homophobic or any other form of discriminatory abuse, chanting or harassment. Fighting. Entering the field of play before, during or after the game. The throwing of any missile or object onto the field of play. The letting off of any flare or firework.

Furthermore, **the following are strictly forbidden** and may result in immediate eviction and ban for repeat offenders...

The consumption of alcohol in bottles, glasses or cans in the stands, terraces and other open areas within the ground. The climbing up or onto floodlights, stands, buildings, roofs, fences or any other structure. The obstruction of any walkways and pedestrian routes. The playing of ball games in areas populated by ground visitors. Allowing any animal to roam off the leash within the ground confines. The parking of any vehicle blocking Emergency Vehicle access. The length of any ban imposed will be related to the severity of offence and solely at the discretion of The Club. Any appeal may be made in writing through The Club Secretary and will be given full and due consideration.
