From the Bench



We welcome everyone to Chalky Lane for the first time in 2026 for the visit of Camberley Town in the league. It's been a long time since we last played at home and we hope having our supporters back in front of us can rejuvenate us during what has been a tough spell for the club.

Our last two fixtures have come away against the same opponents, Horley Town. The first was in the cup, which we currently hold. It was a game full of desire and commitment but one that lacked a little quality from both teams in front of goal.



That evening we were able to introduce three new signings who certainly impressed those watching: Kit Fletcher, Ore Allen and Zakaria Shabir. Kit Fletcher proved decisive in the penalty shootout, making a great save. We converted all four of our penalties and that was enough for us to progress. Unfortunately, our home game scheduled between the two trips to Horley was postponed due to a waterlogged pitch, meaning Horley were once again our opponents, this time in the league. For both clubs this felt like the more important fixture, with Horley pushing for the play-offs and ourselves looking over our shoulders.

We started positively and should really have been one or two goals ahead before a complete lapse in concentration allowed a corner to go in at the near post. It was a first half that had positives, but our lack of sharpness in both boxes cost us again. Early in the second half another lapse in concentration — and another red card — made for a very difficult remainder of the game.

From a management perspective we all understand the gravity of the situation. A difficult start to 2026 has left us hovering close to the relegation places. The players have been working extremely hard on the training pitch and we are doing everything possible to equip them to win games. We take full responsibility for the recent run of results but remain confident we can turn things around and finish the season positively. That process begins today with the visit of Camberley, who themselves are experiencing a similar season and will know just how important this game is in terms of safety. In terms of squad news, we welcome back a familiar face in Jason Vincent, who has returned from Redhill to add some firepower. As I write this we are also hoping to add another attacking option to the squad for today's game.

We welcome Luke, his staff, players, supporters and board members to the club today. Finally, thank you to everyone who has followed and supported us through thick and thin this season — it is hugely appreciated by everyone at the club.

Welcome to Camberley Town



Camberley Town Football Club is one of Surrey's long-established non-league sides, with a history stretching back over a century. Based in Camberley, Surrey, the club currently competes in the Combined Counties League Premier Division South and plays its home matches at Krooner Park.

Early Years

The club was founded in 1895 as Camberley Magpies, before later becoming Camberley & Yorktown and eventually adopting the name Camberley Town. In its early decades, the club competed in local Surrey competitions, gradually building a reputation within county football. Camberley were founder members of the Surrey Senior League in 1922 and enjoyed early success, winning the title in its inaugural season. Throughout the inter-war years, the club established itself as a strong amateur side in the region.

Post-War Progress

Following the Second World War, Camberley Town continued to develop, competing in the Surrey Senior League before becoming members of the Corinthian League in 1954. This marked a significant step up in competition level and exposed the club to stronger opposition from across the South East.

In 1963, the Corinthian League merged with the Athenian League, and Camberley became members of the expanded Athenian League structure. Although success at that level was limited, the club remained competitive and retained its place in senior non-league football.

Isthmian League Era

A major milestone came in 1973, when Camberley Town joined the Isthmian League Division Two, placing them firmly within the semi-professional pyramid. The club remained in the Isthmian League structure for much of the following three decades.

One of Camberley's most successful periods came during the late 1990s and early 2000s. In the 1998–99 season, they won the Isthmian League Division Three title, earning promotion. The club later competed at Step 4 level and enjoyed solid seasons in Division One.

Camberley also recorded notable cup achievements during this era. They reached the FA Cup First Round Proper in the 1998–99 season, a landmark moment in the club's history. After progressing through the qualifying rounds, they faced Third Division side Brentford at Griffin Park, ultimately losing 3–0 but earning national recognition for their achievement.

Welcome to Camberley Town



Krooner Park

Camberley Town have played at Krooner Park since 1923. The ground has undergone gradual development over the decades, with covered seating, standing areas and clubhouse facilities added to meet modern ground grading requirements.

Krooner Park has hosted numerous Surrey Senior Cup ties and FA competitions and remains one of the more established non-league grounds in the county. The stadium has been central to the club's identity and community presence for over a century.

Recent Years

Following restructuring within the non-league pyramid, Camberley Town moved between divisions within the Isthmian League before later being placed in the Combined Counties League as part of the FA's reorganisation at Steps 4 and 5.

In recent seasons, Camberley have competed in the Combined Counties League Premier Division South, aiming to rebuild and stabilise after periods of transition. The club has continued to field competitive squads and remains a respected name within Surrey football.

Honours and Recognition

Over their long history, Camberley Town have collected several honours, including:

- Surrey Senior League Champions
- Isthmian League Division Three Champions (1998–99)
- Surrey Senior Cup winners (multiple occasions)

Their FA Cup First Round appearance in 1998–99 remains the standout national achievement.
Community and Identity

Nicknamed "The Krooners," Camberley Town have maintained strong local links throughout their existence. The club has relied heavily on volunteers, local supporters and youth development structures to sustain its place within the non-league pyramid.

Despite the evolving landscape of semi-professional football, Camberley Town continue to demonstrate resilience and ambition. With over 125 years of history behind them, they remain an important part of Surrey's football heritage.

From their origins as Camberley Magpies in 1895 to their modern campaigns at Krooner Park, Camberley Town FC's story is one of longevity, perseverance and proud local tradition.

Welcome to Camberley Town



Dom West

One of Camberley Town's most consistently involved players this season is goalkeeper Dom West, whose presence between the posts has been a mainstay for the Krooners in the Combined Counties League Premier Division South.

According to official appearance records, West is one of the most regular starters in the Camberley squad, featuring in 27 league matches this season — one of the highest appearance totals among his team-mates. This level of involvement reflects the trust placed in him by the coaching staff as the club's first-choice goalkeeper.

West's role for Camberley has seen him face a wide variety of attacking threats across the division, with his performances repeatedly noted in matchday reports. In a mid-season encounter with Fleet Town, he was called into action early on and produced a smart low save on sixteen minutes to deny a driven shot from close range, demonstrating his shot-stopping ability.

That save against Fleet is one of several documented moments this season where West's contributions have directly impacted his team's competitive efforts. Match reports show him consistently named in starting line-ups — for example in Camberley's 0–0 draw with Redhill, where he took his place in goal alongside defensive team-mates as the Krooners secured a shutout.

Between regular league action, documented saves and his standing in the squad, West's importance to Camberley's season is clear. In a division where defensive organisation and goalkeeper reliability often prove decisive in tight matches, a goalkeeper with West's level of consistent selection becomes a key figure.

For visitors and opponents alike, Dom West's presence adds experience and stability at the back — particularly when facing sides that rely on high tempo and sustained pressure.

As Camberley continue their campaign, West is certain to remain one of their principal defensive performers, and a player who can significantly influence results from the back.





Mutton's Musings



I cannot begin without passing on my huge congratulations to Cobham Football Club for winning our league last weekend. Their 1–0 victory over Redhill at Kiln Brow secured the title with four games remaining — a truly remarkable achievement. However, it has not come as a surprise given their record up to last Saturday, having lost only three games all season and boasting a remarkable +94 goal difference.

Manager Craig Lewington deserves enormous credit, especially considering the number of matches he attends, not only Cobham's. His coaching staff and, of course, the players also deserve recognition. A special mention should go to Dave Tippetts and Sam Merison, who have steered the club so effectively behind the scenes and had the foresight to invest in an artificial surface. The additional revenue such pitches generate can help secure the club's long-term future. My only slight gripe concerns the team photograph Cobham produced to celebrate their achievement — it appears to have been taken around two years ago. Hopefully a new one will be produced very quickly to properly mark their success.

Turning to the play-offs, who will take those four places? I believe it is now between seven teams. I have discounted anyone from Sheerwater downwards, who sit on 45 points and are 11 points behind fifth place with only five games remaining. The teams competing for those places, in table order, are Tadley Calleva, Tooting & Mitcham, Abbey Rangers, Horley Town, Knaphill, Fleet Town and Redhill. Eagle-eyed readers may think Knaphill's position here is incorrect, but they were deducted three points last week for fielding an unregistered player and Football Web Pages has yet to update this.

If I were a betting man, I would say Tadley Calleva look favourites for one of those play-off places after beating Knaphill on Tuesday evening and being one of the form teams in the division over the past two months. That leaves three places up for grabs. Redhill have the most games remaining with eight, while Fleet have seven. If any team might fall away late on, it could be Abbey Rangers, who have only four games left and lost 2–1 away at Sutton Common Rovers on Monday evening. There will certainly be twists and turns in the coming weeks as several of these teams still have to play each other. At the bottom of the table matters are equally tight, with ourselves very much involved in the relegation dogfight after a poor run of results. Guildford continued their impressive revival on Tuesday evening with a 3–0 win away at Camberley Town. That result pushed Eversley & California to the bottom of the table. Whether Guildford can stay up remains in the balance, as they only have two games left — against Eversley and ourselves — meaning they can reach a maximum of 33 points, and their negative goal difference is also a concern. I will take a closer look at the relegation battle in my next Musings, when the situation may be a little clearer.



Despite mounting pressure, Sheerwater carried their 1–0 lead into the interval.

The second half brought far more drama. On 62 minutes, Sheerwater goalkeeper Drew Churchwell was sent off for a second yellow card, this time for time-wasting, having previously tested the referee's patience. The Salts took full advantage. Captain Brendon Murphy-McVey levelled in spectacular fashion, firing home from 30 yards after spotting the replacement keeper off his line.

With five minutes remaining, Akinniranye completed the turnaround, putting Epsom & Ewell 2–1 ahead and seemingly on course for a hard-fought comeback victory.

However, deep into added time, misfortune struck. A deflection off Stefan Aiwone found its way into the Salts' net, leaving Nabbad stranded and the scores level at 2–2.

A frustrating end to a match that had looked destined to yield all three points, but positives remain as the Salts continue to regain match sharpness.

Epsom survived the early pressure but struggled to impose themselves physically or find rhythm on the uneven pitch.



Kit Lawrence-Fletcher saves Horley's third with a strong hand and the ball just looping over the bar.


Craig Dundas's penalty was saved but retaken due to keeper movement; he buries the second attempt — 1-2

Spectator Code of Conduct

Entry to the Ground shall constitute acceptance of this Code of Conduct, the rules and regulations of The Football Association and The Combined Counties League. The Club reserves the right to amend, alter or update this Code of Conduct and to eject, ban or prosecute as appropriate or necessary at their sole discretion. Please remember that your behaviour reflects on Epsom & Ewell FC and could result in fines and, in extreme cases, heavier sanctions being imposed upon the club.

Entering and Leaving the Ground

If you have driven to the ground, please park your vehicle considerately. Out of respect for our neighbours, please keep noise levels down, especially late at night, and do not litter the area. Do not attempt to bring flares, fireworks or any other dangerous items into the ground. We reserve the right to check all bags and confiscate any prohibited items found. No alcoholic drinks are allowed to be brought into the ground. Do not attempt to bypass the gate security checks, smuggle drinks of any kind into the ground, or bypass the turnstiles without payment. Anyone found doing so will be evicted from the ground.

Within the Ground

Be respectful to club officers, staff, security, stewards, and other fans at all times. Do not obstruct the normal activities of the Club and its officers. Do not stand in seating areas or block access gangways or steps. Do not behave in a manner that compromises the comfort, enjoyment or safety of others. Always behave appropriately and do not bring the Club into disrepute.

The following behaviour will not be tolerated and will result in immediate eviction and ban: being drunk or under the influence of drugs and behaving antisocially; threatening behaviour; use of obscene or abusive language; persistent swearing and/or making vulgar gestures; racial, homophobic or any other form of discriminatory abuse, chanting or harassment; fighting; entering the field of play before, during or after the game; throwing any missile or object onto the field of play; and setting off any flare or firework.

Strictly Forbidden

The following are strictly forbidden and may result in immediate eviction and a ban for repeat offenders: the consumption of alcohol in bottles, cans or glasses in the stands, terraces and other open areas within the ground; climbing onto floodlights, stands, buildings, roofs, fences or any other structure; obstruction of any walkways and pedestrian routes; playing ball games in areas populated by ground visitors; only service animals are permitted at Chalky Lane and must be kept on a leash.

Vehicles must ensure they do not block emergency vehicle access.

The length of any ban imposed will be related to the severity of the offence and solely at the discretion of the Club. Any appeal may be made in writing through the Club Secretary and will be given full and due consideration.
