Enjoy the game!

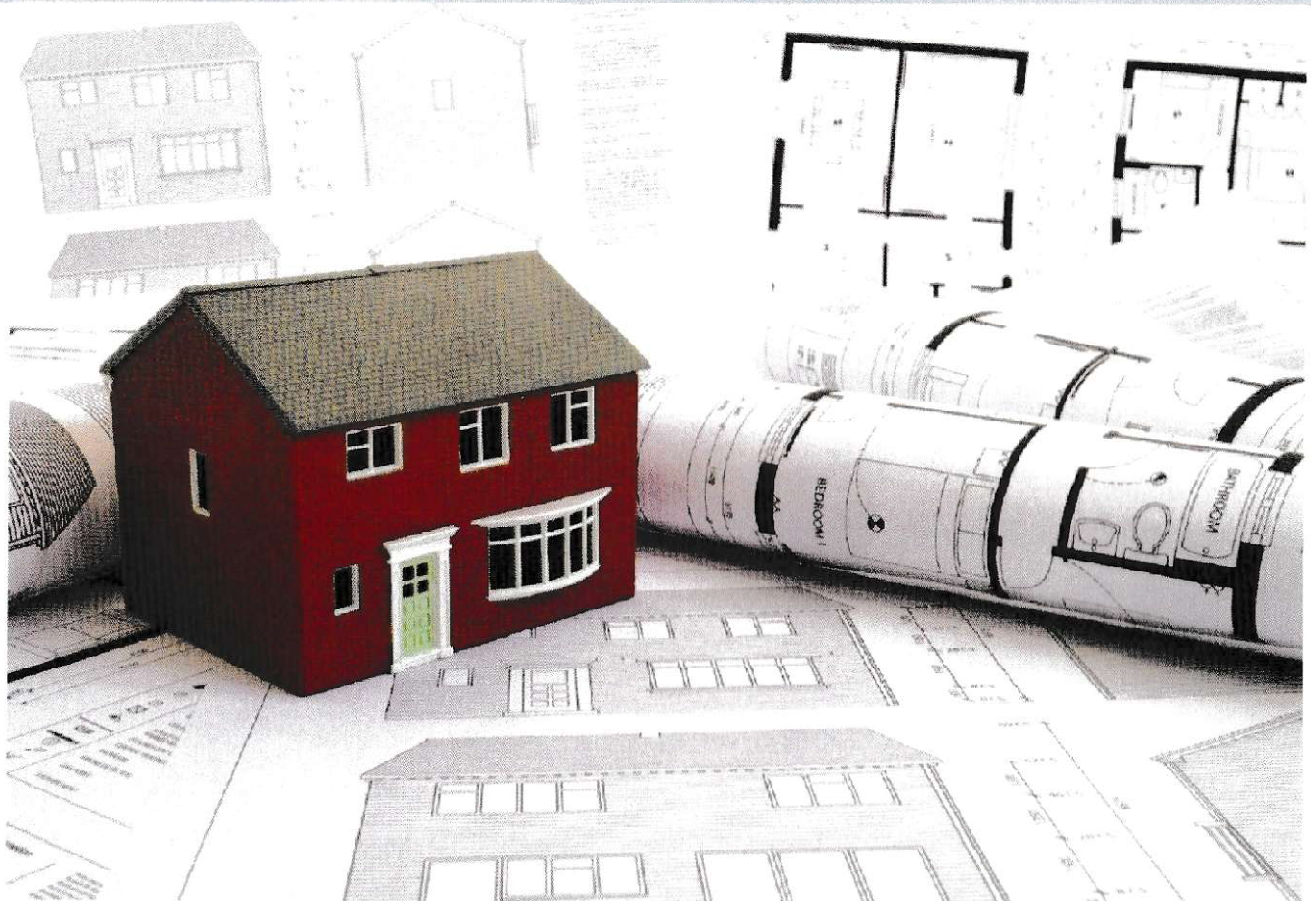

## Welcome to Epsom & Ewell Football Club

**11th November 2003**  
**Today's Match: Lewes**  
**Kick-Off: 7.30 p.m.**

Lewes Football Club are our visitors today for a Ryman Football League Division 1 South fixture and despite the result of our home encounter last season I can assure you that we still extend a warm welcome to their players, officials and supporters. As usual the three match officials, our own supporters and any casual visitor for the day are also included in that welcome. We hope you all enjoy your visit and afterwards have a safe journey home.

Lewes are enjoying an almost perfect season in the League and at present are in pole position having been there since the 28th August apart from one week in September when promotion chasers Windsor and Eton had played one more game than them. In cup competitions they have been picking up a few prizes. In the FA Cup they went out in the 2nd qualifying round but are still in the FA Trophy and Bryon Cup in which they received a bye to the second round.

In the match day programme notes of 16th November last season when Lewes were hosts I said that we had been somewhat of a boggy club for then as they had only won 5 of the last 26 league encounters but with that awful result on the day they made it 7 wins and later in the season increased it to 8 from 28.

The first encounter last season when they won 7-0 here at Merland Rise was our first home league defeat of the season and the previous weekend they had found the net seven times at home to Chertsey Town. Their goals from Matt Allen in the 18th minute, Tony Reid in the 40th, Junior Kamea 45th, Gareth Green 71st, Tim Smith 82nd, Germaine Amanuel 87th and Jon Palmer penalty 89th. A game best forgotten, at least as far as Epsom are concerned. The return fixture at Lewes on the 8th March had a much more respectable score line when on a heavily sodden pitch they won 1-0 the goal being credited to Danny Davis although Epsom Secretary Dave Wilson in his match report had said that it seemed as though Tony Chin had bundled the ball across the line from a pointblank obviously awarded Davis free kick. I was unable to go to the match so cannot comment but Dave very rarely gets things wrong but as they say, that is history!

# From the Archives



Fresh from our own latest visit to the south coast, for tonight's archives we go back to 2003-04 when we welcomed Lewes for a mid-November Ryman League Division 1 South match.

On paper it looked a tough match with Lewes flying high at the top of the league with just one defeat in 15. The Salts, however, were languishing at the foot of the table, with just 1 win in 16. And a tough match it was, losing 4-0.

The season had already seen some heavy defeats including 7-3 away to Enfield in the FA Vase, 5-2 at home to Metropolitan Police and 5-2 again away at Whyteleafe.

Conceding goals remained a challenge, with The Salts shipping 117 goals by the end of the season and relegated at the foot of the table.

Lewes kept their lead, won the division and then came through a special end-of-season play-off route (created for the non-league restructure) to reach the brand-new Conference South, beating Yeading (1-0), Basingstoke Town (4-1) and Kingstonian (1-0).

# Welcome to Eversley & California



Eversley & California Football Club, based in the north-east corner of Hampshire close to the Berkshire and Surrey borders, is a club that in many ways reflects the story of local football in southern England across more than a century: informal beginnings in agricultural villages, gradual formalisation into organised competition, the post-war expansion of youth football, and then the current era where community identity, facility development, girls' and women's pathways and off-pitch sustainability have grown to be as important as first-team success.

The roots of the Eversley element of the club stretch back to the late 19th century, when football began taking serious hold in rural counties. Matches were often played ad-hoc, on open ground, against neighbouring parishes such as Fleet, Sandhurst, Finchampstead and Yateley. The early Eversley sides drew heavily upon agricultural labourers, mill workers and local tradesmen. There was no clubhouse, and the concept of "kit" was closer to a shared stash of shirts and whatever boots a man owned. But in spirit — competition, village pride, and the Saturday football habit — the DNA of the club was already present.

By the early 20th century, Eversley had formalised its footballing identity. The club competed in local leagues through the inter-war period, and the game resumed after the Second World War with renewed enthusiasm. Railways and new roads helped the region become less isolated, and Eversley's footballing community strengthened as the population grew. The move from informal recreation to a structured league presence was a key shift, anchoring the club in the non-league pyramid and creating the expectation of competitive ambition that later generations would inherit.

California FC, the other half of the modern name, brings into the story the next main strand: the post-war era of youth football and the community club model. The California area of Finchampstead, despite its exotic name, is deeply English and suburban, and by the 1960s–1980s had become fertile ground for youth participation. California FC had earned respect as a youth-focused operation with a strong emphasis on player development, parental involvement and inclusive football. While first-team performance is the currency of a Saturday club, the pipeline of young players, coaches and volunteers is the true lifeblood — and California were strong in precisely that component.

The merger of Eversley and California, formalised in 2003, therefore brought two key values together: the senior football tradition of Eversley, and the youth and development culture of California. The combined entity — Eversley & California FC — placed these strands within a single structure, creating a strong local brand that was bigger than either identity alone. Mergers in non-league football can be fraught culturally; this one is widely considered a success. Central to that success was the idea that the name should not simply be a badge on the shirt — but that the ethos of both clubs would be preserved and genuinely blended.

This period coincided with the development of the club's modern home — Fox Lane. The move there, and subsequent upgrades, created a facility worthy of ambition. Floodlights, pitch improvements, fixed spectator areas and off-pitch infrastructure allowed the First Team to pursue Step 6 football, which it has competed at within the Combined Counties League system. Fox Lane has also served as a stable home for the growing youth section. Organisationally, this was the era in which the club moved from "volunteers who coach the odd team" to a semi-professional operations mindset: safeguarding policies, structured coaching pathways, proper recruitment, long-term facility planning, and club finance handled as a medium-term project, not just "survive the season".

On the pitch, Eversley & California have produced periods of momentum. Promotion into the Combined Counties League was a landmark, and the club has often been competitive at this level. Cup runs have provided memorable nights — particularly at Fox Lane under lights. The club has also embraced the growth of women's football, establishing a Women's First Team and expanding female participation pathways at younger age groups. This diversification — boys, girls, men, women — is one of the main reasons the club today feels not simply like "a football team with youth sections", but in truth a village-anchored community club.

Today, Eversley & California FC sits within a modern non-league environment where success is measured in multiple ways: yes, league standings and points, but also the number of children choosing football over screens; the number of volunteers gaining qualifications; the ability to provide a safe, welcoming Saturday environment for families; and the resilience to navigate rising facility costs and regulatory demands.

The club's history is therefore not a nostalgic museum exhibit but a living identity — evolving, shaped by those who contribute today, yet rooted in the values of the past: village pride, participation, development, and the belief that football at this level is not simply entertainment — it is local belonging.

Eversley & California FC continues to honour those principles. The badge on the chest is not just a mark of a team — it is the shared identity of two strands of local footballing culture, woven together — and still moving forward.

## PLAYER TO WATCH - Josh Selby

Every squad that survives Step 5 has one theme in common: somebody in the team takes responsibility for the weather moments. Not the sunny August ones — the grim ones, in November and February, when the pitch is heavy, the wind is diagonal, and the match turns into a psychological arm-wrestle where you don't so much impose your football as hang on to the ability to play it. For Eversley & California, that "weather-moment grown-up" is Josh Selby.

Selby isn't the shout-for-the-camera type. He's not the extravagant full-length dive merchant. The bigger value is that he gives Eversley & California the thing every Step 5 team privately craves — stability. What makes him stand out: in a rare moment for a goalkeeper, last February Selby actually found the net — a long clearance/kick from him sailed all the way into the opponent's goal after a mis-judgement by their keeper. That moment tells you a lot: the match-reading, the audacity, the confidence and the little bit of fortune that can tilt steps of non-league football.

His goalkeeping style is decisive without being frantic. He prefers fast wrists to full-body smotherers, he deals with cut-back situations by taking half a yard off his line early, and his parry choices are intelligent — wide, not central. Coaches always say Step 5 is won and lost in second phases; Selby is the kind of keeper who prevents second phases. In possession he is bold — not reckless — but bold.

Eversley's ability to play forward early relies on a goalkeeper willing to find feet in congested areas. Selby is comfortable clipping short to a full-back under pressure, and equally comfortable going into the No. 8 pocket on the half-turn to break the first line. It means the Boars aren't forced into predictable "long starter" football every time they reset. His presence also gives younger players defensive courage. When you trust the man behind you, you hold your line a second longer. You step into passing lanes. You stay brave in rest defence.

Match tempo is calmer when he's in goal. The touchline feels calmer. The shape looks calmer. He has become — in the truest sense — Eversley & California's emotional base layer. And in Step 5, that's gold.

And finally, our landlords at 'Chessy' are still rooted to the bottom of their division after losing away 1-0 to Lewisham Borough.

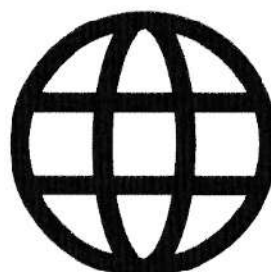

**A crowd of 88 watched the Salts cling on for a hard-earned 1-1 draw on Tuesday night against a good Abbey Rangers side in the play-off places. We finished with 10 men after Luis Oliveira received what looked a harsh second yellow midway through the second half following a clash in the air.**



There were changes again due to injury and suspension. We also lost captain Adam Green mid-week, although at the time of writing we'd been asked not to reveal his new club. Oliveira returned at No 2, Harry Murphy at No 3. Aiwone captained alongside Nazareth, with Gillfillian-Waul back in midfield with Limpo, and Bloor and Vincent up top.

Despite our own six-game winless run, Abbey (who'd lost their last two) began confidently, especially down their right. Our defending was frantic at times, Stillwell heading one free kick backwards to safety under pressure. Abbey forced us into hopeful long balls and on 13 minutes a lapse by Nazareth let Acheampong through, but Aiwone blocked well. Abbey continued to threaten, Aiwone again making a vital tackle to stop Beck-Bardoni.

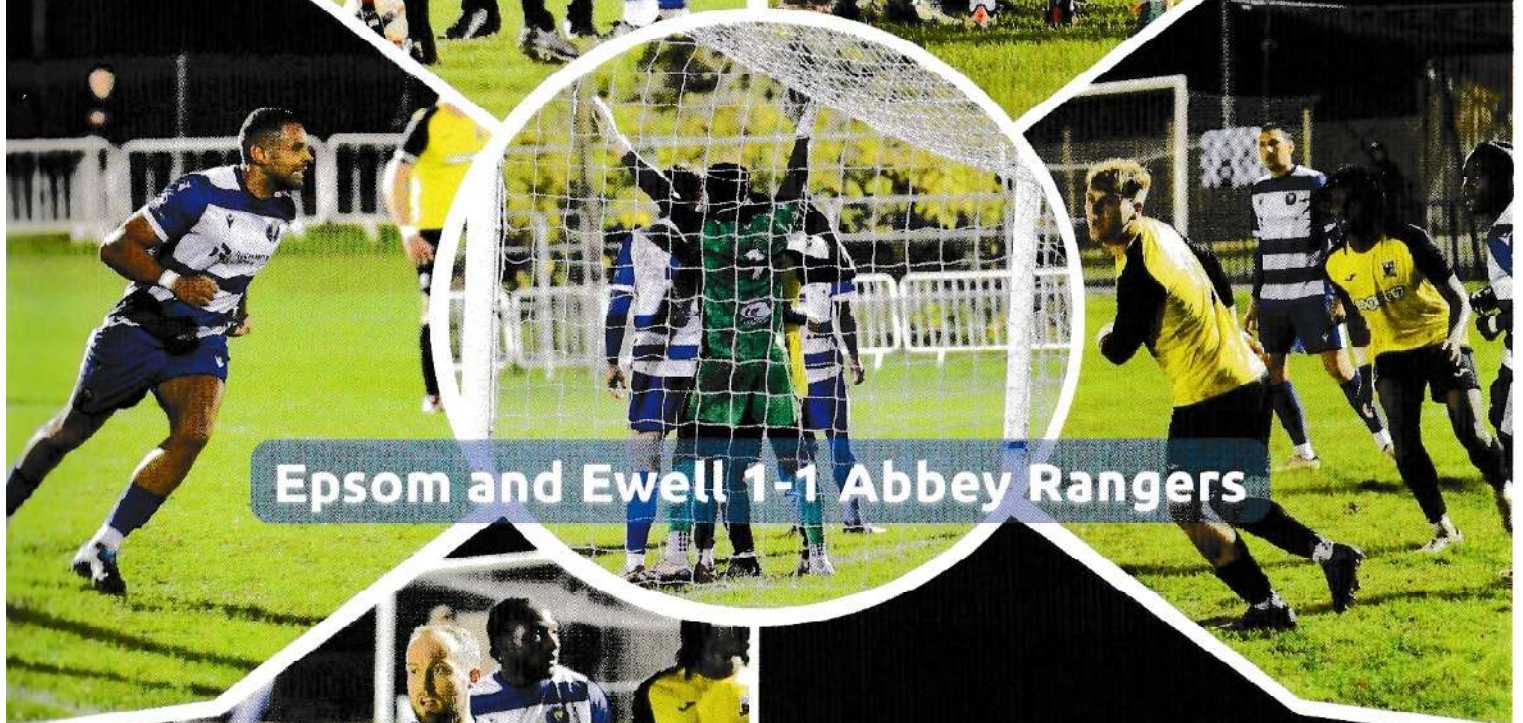
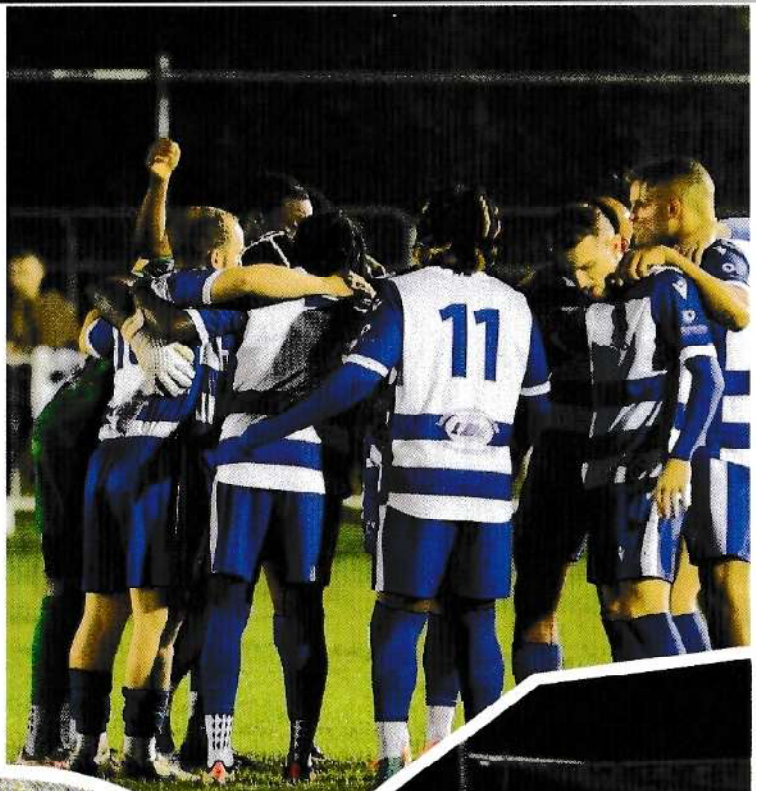
Our first moment came when Bloor drove down the left and beat two men but couldn't find anyone in the box. Abbey immediately replied with another dangerous ball that flew across our six-yard line but thankfully evaded everyone. On the half hour we stunned them. Limpo switched play, Oliveira went past two on the right, reached the byline and crossed low for Vincent to fire past Williamson. Against the run of play, but a terrific team goal.

Abbey came out strong again. The match became niggly, and Murphey-McVey was forced off, replaced by Merrett. With the wind and slope, Abbey kept targeting our right. Eastbourne began the sharper, although in the 4th minute Bloor put Oba through one-on-one, only for the finish to lack power. After that, keepers were largely untroubled. Murphy-McVey was booked early and then on the wrong end of a poor tackle that somehow didn't draw a card, which frustrated co-manager Max Johnson enough for the ref to have a calming word.

There were half moments at both ends – Ovenden curling over for United, Fofahan hitting the bar from a corner, Naz clearing off our line just before the break – but it remained 0-0 at half-time.

Seconds after the restart, Paton collected the ball just outside the box and whipped a brilliant strike into the top left corner. The Salts didn't really deserve to fall behind but in fairness it was a worldly.

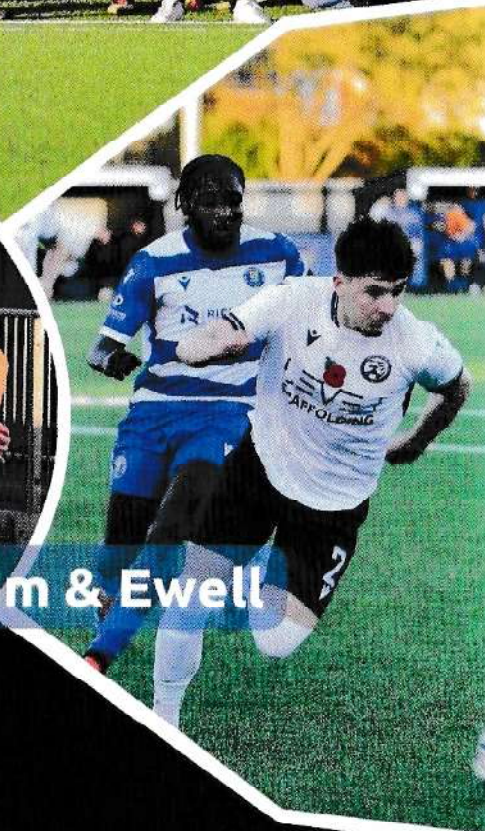
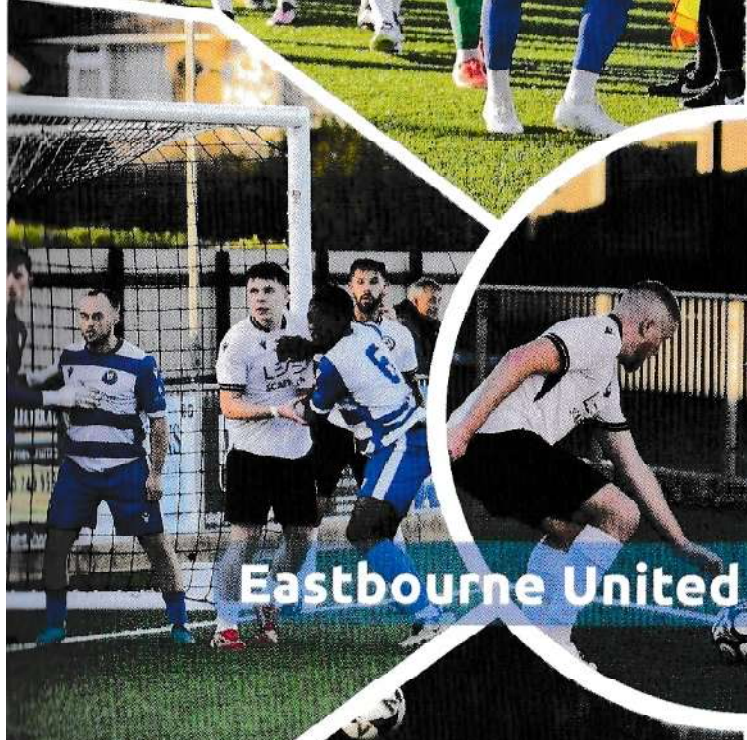
We made changes on 58 minutes and were lifted further when United's Tyano Wilson was sent off for a two-footed lunge on McShane on 64. 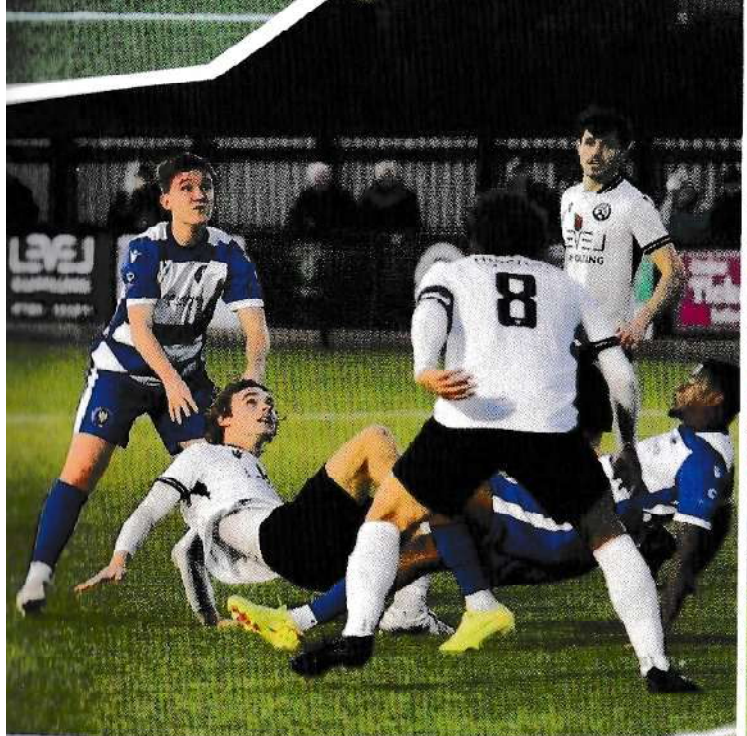

# Ground Regulations 2025-26



## **Spectator Code of Conduct**

All spectators attending home matches are required to read and comply with this Code of Conduct, and to respect the same principles when attending our away fixtures at other clubs. Entry to the Ground shall constitute acceptance of this Code of Conduct, the rules and regulations of The Football Association and The Combined Counties League. The Club reserves the right to amend, alter or update this Code of Conduct and to eject, ban or prosecute as appropriate or necessary at their sole discretion. Please remember that your behaviour reflects on Epsom & Ewell FC and could result in fines and, in extreme cases, heavier sanctions being imposed upon the club.

## **Entering and Leaving the Ground**

If you have driven to the ground, please park your vehicle considerately, do not block in others, and in particular do not block our neighbours' access to their houses. Out of respect for our neighbours, please keep noise levels down, especially late at night, and do not litter the area. Do not attempt to bring flares, fireworks or any other dangerous items into the ground. We reserve the right to check all bags and confiscate any prohibited items found. No alcoholic drinks are allowed to be brought into the ground. Do not attempt to bypass the gate security checks, smuggle drinks of any kind into the ground, or bypass the turnstiles without payment. Anyone found doing so will be evicted from the ground.

## **Within the Ground**

Be respectful to club officers, staff, security, stewards, and other fans at all times. Do not obstruct the normal activities of the Club and its officers. Do not stand in seating areas or block access gangways or steps. Do not behave in a manner that compromises the comfort, enjoyment or safety of others. Always behave appropriately and do not bring the Club into disrepute.

The following behaviour will not be tolerated and will result in immediate eviction and ban: being drunk or under the influence of drugs and behaving antisocially; threatening behaviour; use of obscene or abusive language; persistent swearing and/or making vulgar gestures; racial, homophobic or any other form of discriminatory abuse, chanting or harassment; fighting; entering the field of play before, during or after the game; throwing any missile or object onto the field of play; and setting off any flare or firework.

## **Strictly Forbidden**

The following are strictly forbidden and may result in immediate eviction and a ban for repeat offenders: the consumption of alcohol in bottles, cans or glasses in the stands, terraces and other open areas within the ground; climbing onto floodlights, stands, buildings, roofs, fences or any other structure; obstruction of any walkways and pedestrian routes; playing ball games in areas populated by ground visitors; allowing any animal to roam off the leash within the ground confines; and parking any vehicle that blocks emergency vehicle access.

The length of any ban imposed will be related to the severity of the offence and solely at the discretion of the Club. Any appeal may be made in writing through the Club Secretary and will be given full and due consideration.
