We will miss playing at Cobham especially the welcome we receive from the bar and catering operation, of course we hope to see some of them at 'Chessy' later in the season.

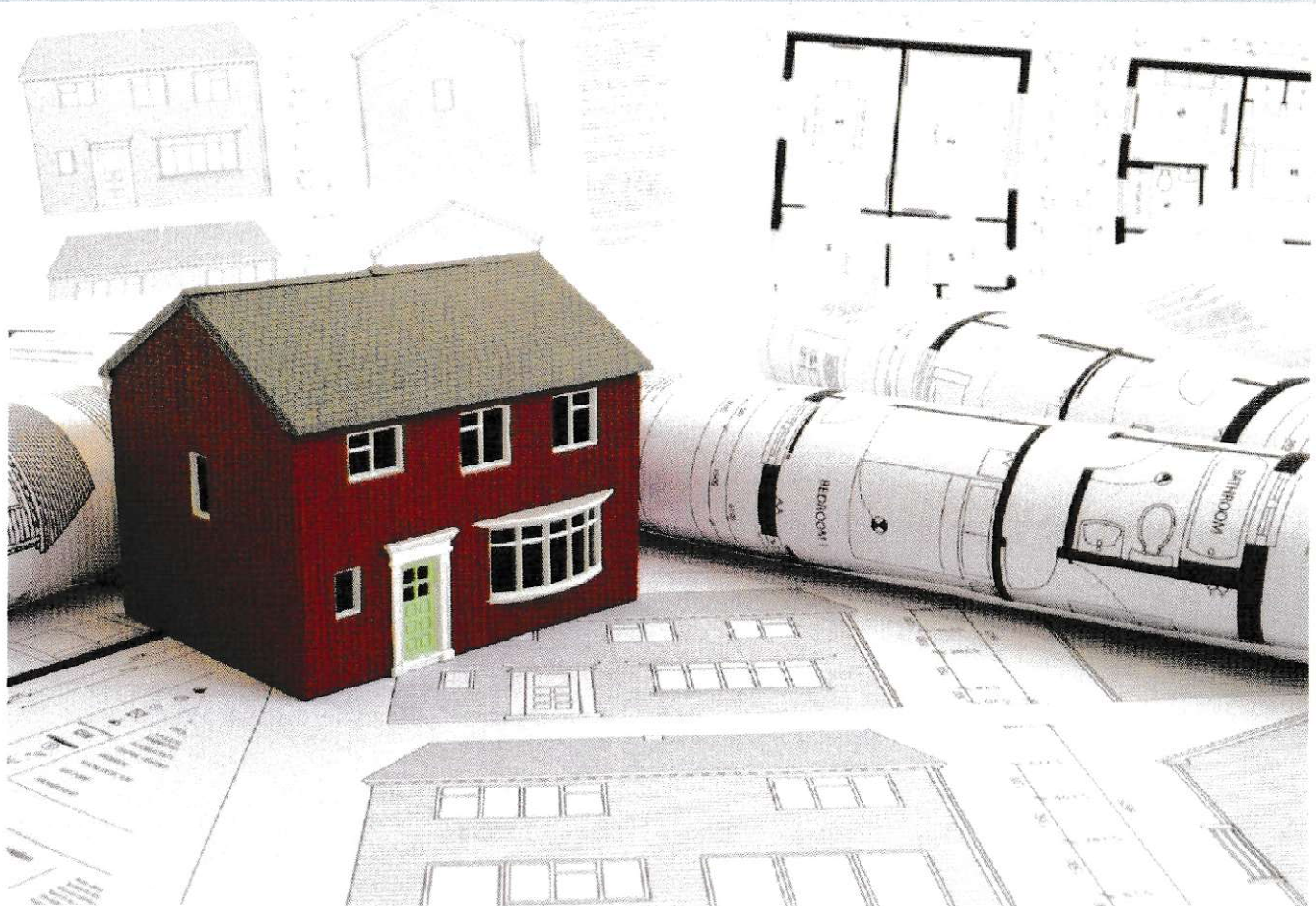

# Welcome to Farnham Town



Farnham Town Football Club has been at the heart of its community for well over a century, proudly representing the historic Surrey market town in non-league football. The club's story is one of resilience, local spirit, and a deep-rooted love of the game — a journey that has seen highs, lows, and everything in between.

## Early Years and Formation

Football was first played in Farnham in the 19th century, with local teams forming as the sport grew rapidly in popularity across England. # Match report v Chipstead

**We welcomed back former striker Kingsley Anokye as a fan following his move to Eastbourne Borough, and it was interesting to see where our goals might come from after his bright start to the season. Suspended Adam Green and injured Steffan Aiwone were also present in support – a testament to this squad's spirit.**



There were several enforced changes to the line-up. Faebian Witter returned in goal after concussion, Connor McShane replaced Ethan Nelson-Roberts at full-back, and debutant Che Bell – a 17-year-old from Hampton & Richmond U18s – came in at centre-back. Jason Vincent and Jake Brown started up front, with Antonios Nazareth captaining the side.

Chipstead's line-up featured three ex-Salts: captain Tijani Eshelokun, striker Carl Oblitey, and Sirak Negassi on the bench. Early exchanges were fairly even, with both sides probing without creating clear chances. Brendan Murphy-McVey's shot on 17 minutes was deflected for a corner, while Kionte went close from a cross minutes later. Chipstead's Taurean Roberts was lively in our box but well contained.

We made the breakthrough on 40 minutes. Jake Brown surged down the right and squared for Vincent, whose neat inside pass found Andrew Herring. His first-time finish under the advancing keeper made it 1-0. Ali Fofahan replaced McShane at the break, and Witter was immediately tested, tipping a long-range effort over superbly. Our second came on 50 minutes when Kionte's break led to a loose ball falling for Vincent, who struck low past the keeper.

Stillwell was harshly booked soon after for "time-wasting" at a throw-in – a decision that would prove costly. Chipstead pushed forward, Roberts forcing a save and hitting the side netting, while Evan Kelly rattled the post from distance. Nazareth was then replaced by Craig Dundas after being booked for simulation, and Stillwell, now captain, was dismissed moments later for a second yellow, leaving us down to ten men.

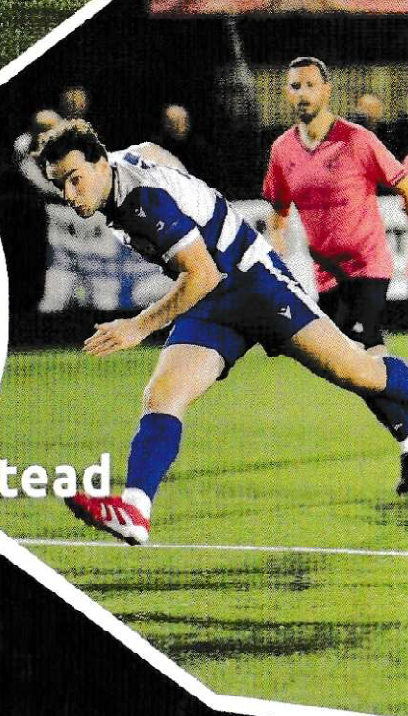
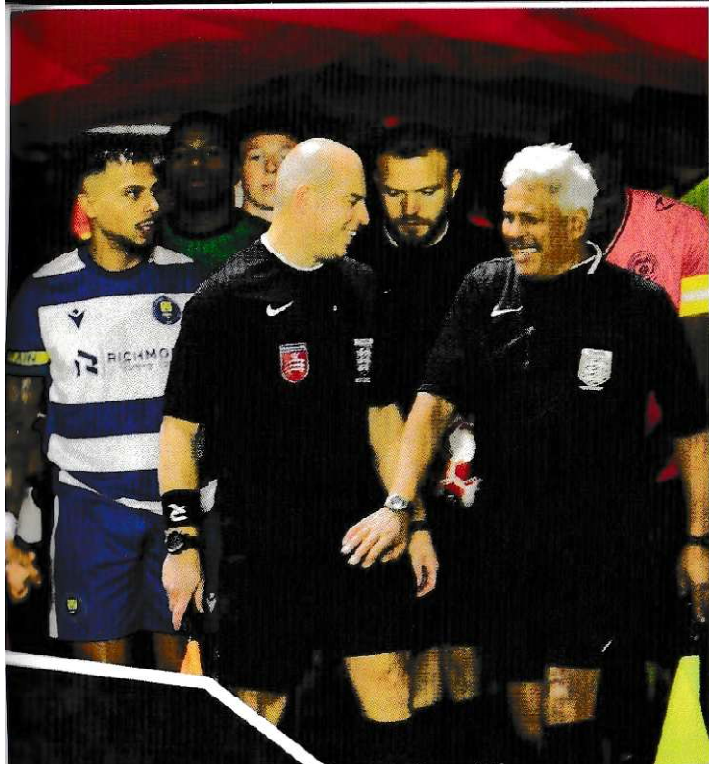
Despite the pressure, we remained a threat on the break. Herring narrowly missed after a sweeping move, and in the 90th minute we sealed the points. Obasanjo Akinniranye burst into space and squared for Fofahan, who controlled and slotted home for 3-0.

Chipstead pulled one back in stoppage time as Kelly's strike flew into the top corner – amid strong claims of a foul in the build-up – but it was too late to change the outcome.

This was a vital and deserved first league win in five matches, lifting us to 11th in the table. With games in hand on most teams above us, there's every chance to climb further if we build on this result.

It was a hard-fought performance, with clinical finishing the difference. Bell looked composed and assured on debut, while Vincent and Brown impressed on their first starts up front. The team showed resilience under pressure and quality on the break — a performance to build on as we look to push higher up the table.

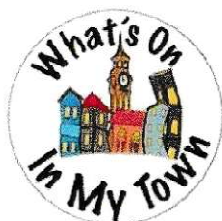

# Ground Regulations 2025-26



## **Spectator Code of Conduct**

All spectators attending home matches are required to read and comply with this Code of Conduct, and to respect the same principles when attending our away fixtures at other clubs. Entry to the Ground shall constitute acceptance of this Code of Conduct, the rules and regulations of The Football Association and The Combined Counties League. The Club reserves the right to amend, alter or update this Code of Conduct and to eject, ban or prosecute as appropriate or necessary at their sole discretion. Please remember that your behaviour reflects on Epsom & Ewell FC and could result in fines and, in extreme cases, heavier sanctions being imposed upon the club.

## **Entering and Leaving the Ground**

If you have driven to the ground, please park your vehicle considerately, do not block in others, and in particular do not block our neighbours' access to their houses. Out of respect for our neighbours, please keep noise levels down, especially late at night, and do not litter the area. Do not attempt to bring flares, fireworks or any other dangerous items into the ground. We reserve the right to check all bags and confiscate any prohibited items found. No alcoholic drinks are allowed to be brought into the ground. Do not attempt to bypass the gate security checks, smuggle drinks of any kind into the ground, or bypass the turnstiles without payment. Anyone found doing so will be evicted from the ground.

## **Within the Ground**

Be respectful to club officers, staff, security, stewards, and other fans at all times. Do not obstruct the normal activities of the Club and its officers. Do not stand in seating areas or block access gangways or steps. Do not behave in a manner that compromises the comfort, enjoyment or safety of others. Always behave appropriately and do not bring the Club into disrepute.

The following behaviour will not be tolerated and will result in immediate eviction and ban: being drunk or under the influence of drugs and behaving antisocially; threatening behaviour; use of obscene or abusive language; persistent swearing and/or making vulgar gestures; racial, homophobic or any other form of discriminatory abuse, chanting or harassment; fighting; entering the field of play before, during or after the game; throwing any missile or object onto the field of play; and setting off any flare or firework.

## **Strictly Forbidden**

The following are strictly forbidden and may result in immediate eviction and a ban for repeat offenders: the consumption of alcohol in bottles, cans or glasses in the stands, terraces and other open areas within the ground; climbing onto floodlights, stands, buildings, roofs, fences or any other structure; obstruction of any walkways and pedestrian routes; playing ball games in areas populated by ground visitors; allowing any animal to roam off the leash within the ground confines; and parking any vehicle that blocks emergency vehicle access.

The length of any ban imposed will be related to the severity of the offence and solely at the discretion of the Club. Any appeal may be made in writing through the Club Secretary and will be given full and due consideration.
