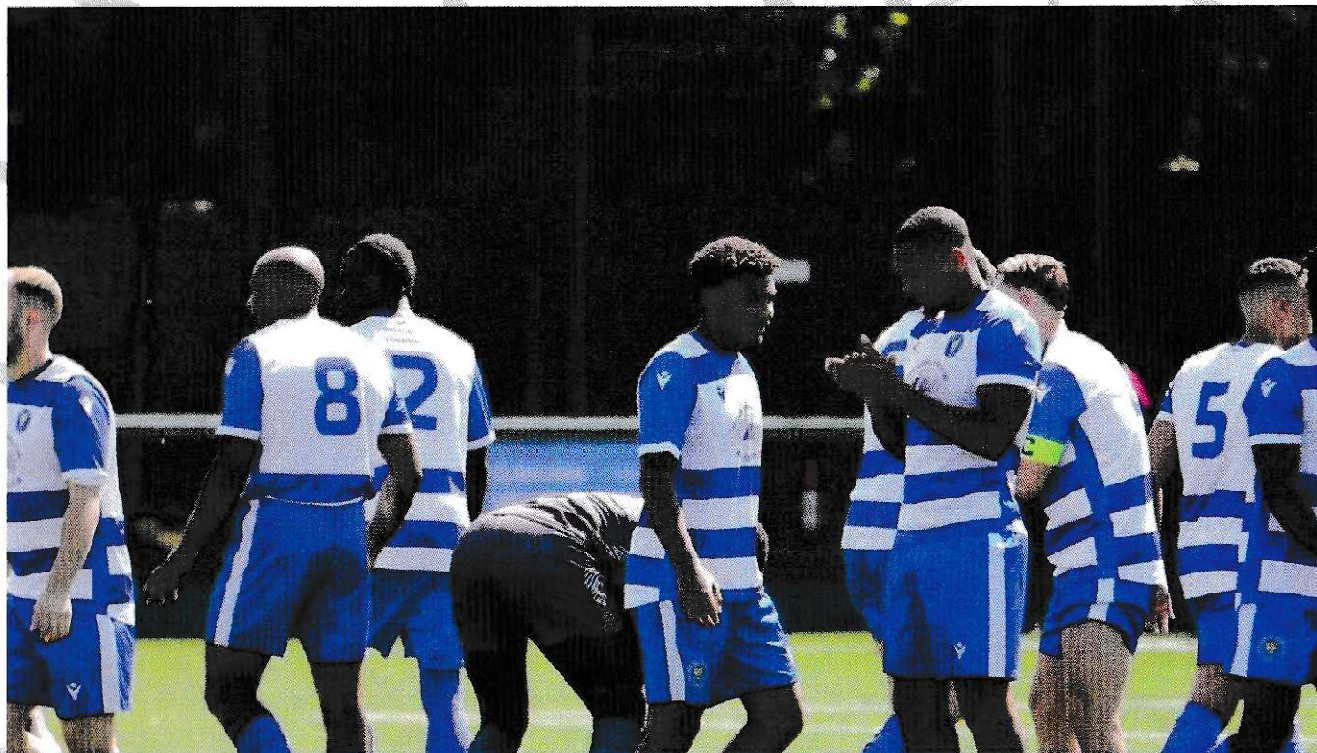

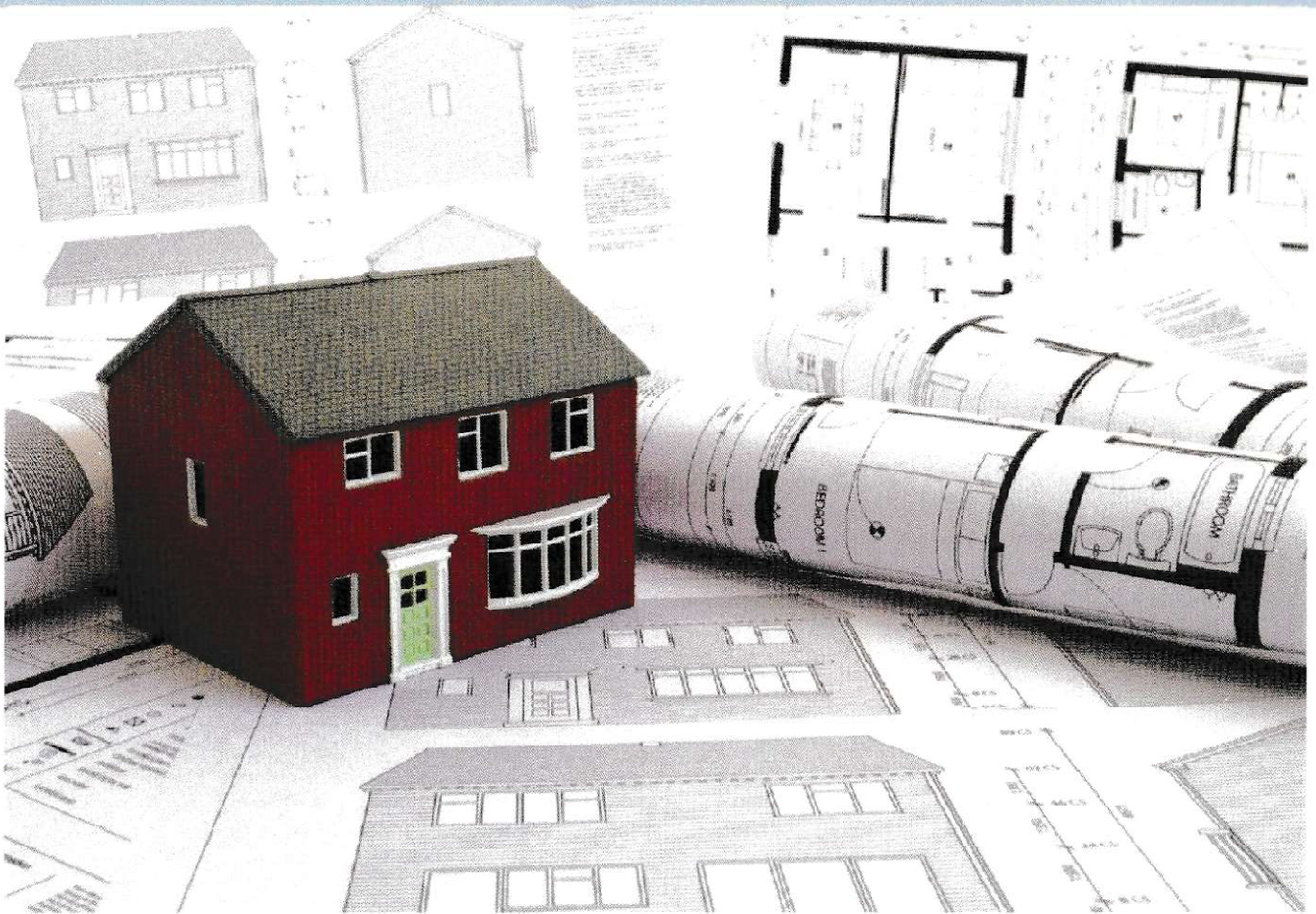

From the Clubhouse



Good evening and welcome back!!!

After just over 3 months we begin our 2025/26 campaign and we welcome to the 'Reg Madgwick' Stadium Guildford City, their manager, players and staff to this curtain raiser for the new season.

It has been a busy three months 'off the pitch' for us with our new management team of Craig Dundas and Max Johnson getting to grips with assembling our squad for the forthcoming season. The player retention has been very good and the quality added has been exceptional.

Our pre season plans have gone well with the players returning in mid June to training and many of our retained players keeping to a fitness schedule during the close season. The training seasons on the hallowed turf at Epsom College have been very well attended having seen these with my own eyes; we are very lucky to be able to used this facility and is testament to the relationship we have built with the college over many years,

We should also thank Dave and Sam of Cobham FC for facilitating our move back to the 'Reg Madgwick' so we can play our matches here until a potential move to Chessington and Hook's ground at Chalky Lane, we are currently waiting for a ground grading which we are confident in obtaining.

Over the summer, the Council has officially "released" the land at Hook Road Arena for part housing and part recreation. They are in the process of sending an agreement in principle to allow us to start applying for grants.

The Council is also planning to put the procurement policy and enable developers to apply for the housing contract through the Strategy and Resources committee on the 25th September so we will hopefully be in a position to move this forward.

There is always the problem that a developer will seek to take on the house building only, but due to the requirement for social housing, we feel we have a plan that works well and will enable the building of the sports facility which would not provide the return needed on it's own. We are also happy to work with the Council, whilst most developers prefer to work alone.

IN AND AROUND THE LEAGUE

We said goodbye in April to Spellthorne Sports and Sandhurst Town who were relegated from the Premier Division.

Their places were taken by Badshot Lea, Eversley and California, Sutton Common Rovers and Thatcham Town.

Badshot Lea join us having been relegated from the Isthmian South Central League last season along with Sutton Common Rovers from that same division. Both of these teams will be looking to return to Step 4 as soon as possible so will provide tough challenges.

The promoted sides of Eversley and California and Thatcham Town will be unknown quantities with the latter team providing us with one of our longest journeys of the season when we play them (62 miles by car, although Thatcham Railway station is only 1 minute from the ground).

We intend to summarise all the League matches within the division in our home match day programmes.

Against higher-league Step 4 side Bedfont Sports, the Salts produced a hard-working performance, particularly in the first half.

Epsom & Ewell started on the back foot, with goalkeeper Faebian Witter keeping them in the game early on, making a crucial save in the 11th minute. Two minutes later, Bedfont were awarded a penalty, which they converted to take a 1-0 lead.

In the 33rd minute, Jason Bloor went close with a shot that beat the keeper but drifted just wide of the upright. Shortly afterwards, Bloor won a free-kick, and Tom Collins struck a fine effort that also narrowly missed the target. The hosts went into the break with a one-goal advantage.

Several changes were made for the second half, and Witter was again called into action, making a smart save low to his right. However, minutes later, Bedfont were awarded a second penalty, which they also scored to make it 2-0.

Towards the end of the match, Ali Fofahan forced an excellent save from the home keeper with a powerful effort, as the Salts applied sustained pressure in the final ten minutes. Despite their efforts, the match ended 2-0 to Bedfont.

New rules

Key Points

Normal, respectful interactions with referees are still permitted; however, dissent (by word or action) remains a yellow card offence — even for captains.

Only the captain from each team is allowed to approach the referee on major decisions.

Captains are responsible for ensuring teammates stay away from the referee during these moments.

Referees may delay the restart to allow captains to communicate messages back to their teams if necessary.

Additional Details

If the goalkeeper is the team captain, an outfield player must be nominated to fulfil this role for referee interactions.

A "captain-only zone" of 4 metres will be established around the referee; no other players are permitted within this area.

Any non-captain entering this zone should be cautioned for dissent by action. If multiple players enter, at least one must be cautioned, and the incident will be reported to the relevant authorities.

Welcome to GUILDFORD CITY



1921 - 1974

In May 1921 Guildford were accepted into the Southern League, the equivalent of today's National League. 1927 saw Guildford become a Diocese and coupled with the planned cathedral the club was renamed Guildford City. In 1928-29 City were drawn at home to Queen's Park Rangers in the FA Cup First Round proper and won 4-2 in front of almost 8,000 spectators. The immediate pre-war years saw another famous FA Cup victory, this time over Reading, whilst 1937/38 saw Guildford City lift the Southern League Championship trophy for the first time. The following year a record crowd of 9,932 spectators crammed into Joseph's Road to watch an epic FA Cup First Round replay versus local rivals Aldershot. In 1951, City sold future England cap Jimmy Langley to Leeds. Another League Championship was achieved in 1955-56, and then in 1967-68 Guildford embarked upon a memorable FA Cup run. Leading 2-1 at Brentford in the First-Round proper, the match was abandoned due to snow. A 2-2 draw in the rearranged fixture saw 7,289 fans cram into Joseph's Road to roar City on to a famous 2-1 victory in the replay. A further 8,774 saw City fall narrowly to Newport County in the Second Round, but the heroes of that era, players like Tony Burge and long-serving Darby Watts, will long be remembered. In 1974 on-going financial problems came to a head and it was announced that the Club was to merge with Dorking. Subsequently the final game at Joseph's Road was played on 12 February 1974, when City beat Folkestone 2-0 in front of 625 fans. The club limped on for a further two seasons playing as Guildford & Dorking at Meadowbank before finally succumbing on 9 December 1976.

Welcome to GUILDFORD CITY



1996 – Present

The club re-emerged initially as AFC Guildford in 1996, and then for one season Guildford United, when the then Mayor John Woodhatch persuaded Burpham FC to change its name and move to the Spectrum Leisure Centre. After a brief spell in the Surrey Premier League, Guildford joined the newly formed Combined Counties League, winning Division One in 2003-04. In 2005 the club was re-named the historically significant 'Guildford City' after an absence of thirty years. 2007-2008 saw City claim a runner up finish in the CCL Premier League, under the management of Scott Steele and Lloyd Wye. Then a period of struggle was halted by the inspirational appointment of Kevin Rayner who took charge in spring 2009. Rayner's second season saw a good run in the FA Vase, an incredible FA Cup victory at Isthmian Premier Tonbridge Angels, but also the CCL Premier Division Championship. A second CCL Championship was gained in 2012, resulting in an emotional return to the Southern League after a gap of 38 years. That first Step 4 season saw a creditable ninth place finish in the Central division. At the conclusion of 2012-13 Rayner departed for a new chapter in his career. In November 2013 Rayner returned to lead an ultimately unsuccessful battle against relegation. After a poor start to the 2014-15 CCL season, Kevin Rayner departed in November to be replaced by Donovan Chislett who saved the club from relegation in an exciting climax to the season. Chislett himself departed in September 2015 to be replaced by former Godalming & Farncombe manager Dean Thomas, who in turn was succeeded by Steve Dormer and Chris Balchin. After four seasons Balchin departed in December 2020 to be replaced by ex-Staines Town manager Paul Barnes whose tenure proved to be short lived. Pete Ruggles and then Tristan Rees took the reins for a year each, before in May 2024, the experienced Carl Taylor arrived to manage the side in the 2024-25 season. Off of the field in a major restructure the Club became a limited company in July 2024 headed up by George Haddad and Azmir Begovic.

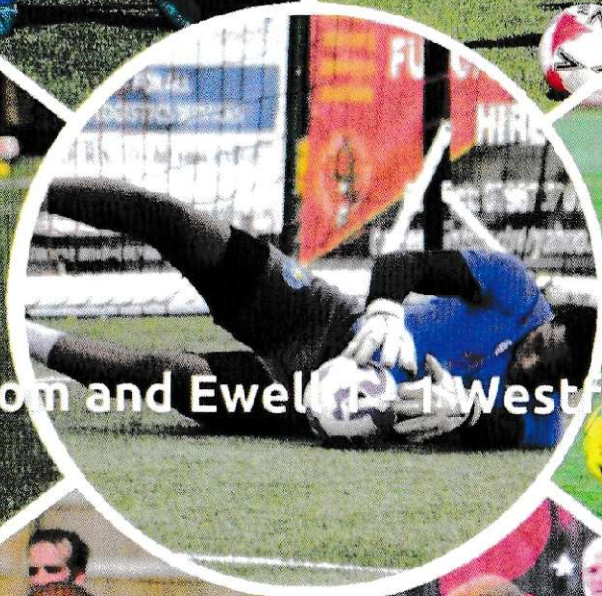

After a strong performance during the week against Cray Valley PM, the management team were keen to see the players continue to implement their new style of play. The only problem facing both teams was the heat. With temperatures in the 30s, we knew it was going to be a tough afternoon. In fact, both sides opted to hold their pre-match team talks in the shade, as the dressing rooms were becoming uncomfortably hot.

For the second game running, we fielded a recognisable starting eleven, with a couple of trialists and Faebian Witter between the sticks. The game began quite tightly, with plenty of passing as both teams adjusted to the conditions. We created a few early opportunities, but were pulled back by the linesman's flag. The first real chance fell to The Salts in the 14th minute, when a great ball was played through to Jason Bloor. He beat the offside trap this time, but although the keeper came out quickly, Jason really should have finished it off—his shot was saved well with the keeper's legs.

We continued to press and began to gain the upper hand. In the 22nd minute, Carl Oblitey noticed the goalkeeper off his line and executed a sublime chip from around 40 yards, which sailed over the retreating keeper into an empty net. 1-0 Epsom & Ewell. Shortly after, the referee called for a water break, which both teams gratefully took advantage of.

On the restart, Epsom & Ewell were caught slightly off guard, and a good move from Westside saw their centre-forward beat a couple of challenges before slamming the ball high into the net. 1-1.

We nearly regained the lead in the 31st minute when a poor clearance landed at the feet of Sean Michael Anderson, but he snatched at the shot and it went harmlessly wide.

Moments later, Jason latched onto a loose ball we had won back in their box, but his shot crashed against the bar and went over.

The referee was then forced to take action against a Westside player, who had been arguing persistently with him. After attempting to talk him down, the ref issued a yellow card. It was suggested the player be substituted to avoid further disciplinary action—which could have ended the game as a contest. Good refereeing, we thought.

HALF TIME: 1-1

The second half played out much like the first, with The Salts enjoying more possession and some nice passing, but lacking in clear goalmouth chances. In the 55th minute, one of our trialists made a darting run into the box, beating four challenges but never quite getting the ball fully under control. The Westside keeper was quick off his line again, narrowing the angle and saving with his legs.

We kept up the pressure. Niall Stillwell, who had come on as a second-half substitute, found himself in a similar position to Wednesday night, but this time his powerful shot was well saved.

Westside had a chance in the 61st minute when a breakaway was halted by a foul just outside our box. The forward went for goal from the resulting free-kick, but the wall held strong and deflected the ball out for a corner. Faebian came out confidently to collect the cross.

In the 67th minute, Adam Green found space in the Westside half and attempted a lob from outside the box. The ball beat the keeper but just cleared the bar as well.

With numerous substitutions and the heat taking its toll, the game was starting to drift towards a draw. The Salts still had more of the possession, but Westside defended with confidence. The final chance of the match fell to substitute Craig Dundass. A nicely played through ball gave him a good opportunity, but once again the keeper came out smartly to make a solid save. The resulting corner came to nothing, flying over everyone and out for a goal kick.

Not much happened after that, with Westside finishing the stronger but never really troubling Faebian in goal.

FULL TIME: 1-1

After the match, Salts manager Max Johnston emphasised the importance of maintaining concentration throughout. He said he was pleased with the overall performance and again full of praise for Westside, who gave us a good test in difficult conditions. However, he noted that the players need to find a way to cope better in such weather—or we risk not winning a game all August. Ground Regulations 2025-26



All spectators attending home matches are required to read and comply with this Code of Conduct, and to respect the same principles when attending our away fixtures at other clubs.

Entry to the Ground shall constitute acceptance of this Code of Conduct, the rules and regulations of The Football Association and The Isthmian League.

The Club reserves the right to amend, alter or update this Code of Conduct and to eject, ban or prosecute as appropriate/necessary at their sole discretion.

Please remember that your behaviour reflects on Epsom & Ewell FC and could result in fines and in extreme cases heavier sanctions being imposed upon the club.

Entering and Leaving the ground

Please don't enter if you have Covid or Covid like symptoms or have been in close contact with anyone who has Covid. If you have driven to the ground, please park your vehicle considerately, don't block in others, and in particular don't block our neighbours' access to their houses. Out of respect for our neighbours, please keep noise levels down, especially late-night revelry, and don't litter the area. Don't attempt to bring Flares or Fireworks of any description into the ground. We reserve the right to check all bags and suspicious objects, and any found will be confiscated. No alcoholic drinks are allowed to be brought into the ground. We reserve the right to check all bags and suspicious objects, and any found will be confiscated. Don't attempt to bypass the gate security checks, smuggle drinks of any kind into the ground or bypass the turnstiles without payment. Anyone found doing so will be evicted from the ground.

Within the ground

Be respectful to club officers, staff, security, stewards, and other fans at all times. Don't obstruct the normal activities of the Club and its officers. Don't stand in seating areas or access gangways or steps. Don't behave in a manner that compromises the comfort, enjoyment or safety of others. Always behave appropriately and don't bring the Club into disrepute. The following behaviour will not be tolerated and will result in immediate eviction and ban. Being drunk or under the influence of drugs and behaving anti socially. Threatening behaviour, use of obscene or abusive language, persistent swearing and/or making vulgar gestures. Racial, homophobic or any other form of discriminatory abuse, chanting or harassment. Fighting. Entering the field of play before, during or after the game. The throwing of any missile or object onto the field of play. The letting off of any flare or firework.

Furthermore, **the following are strictly forbidden** and may result in immediate eviction and ban for repeat offenders...

The consumption of alcohol in bottles, glasses or cans in the stands, terraces and other open areas within the ground. The climbing up or onto floodlights, stands, buildings, roofs, fences or any other structure. The obstruction of any walkways and pedestrian routes. The playing of ball games in areas populated by ground visitors. Allowing any animal to roam off the leash within the ground confines. The parking of any vehicle blocking Emergency Vehicle access. The length of any ban imposed will be related to the severity of offence and solely at the discretion of The Club. Any appeal may be made in writing through The Club Secretary and will be given full and due consideration.
