We welcome everyone back to Chessington & Hook United for our 3rd home game at our new ground. We'd like to personally thank all of those who have attended our last two home games and to those who have made the long trips to Redhill and Alton over the last week. Your commitment to our club is incredibly appreciated and we really feel the support. Thank you!



A little bit now about the run of games we've had leading up to our game against Horley Town. It all started at home against Tooting & Mitcham. It was an incredibly hard fought battle with few chances in the game and it was gutting to come off with losing 1-0. We felt that we matched a top team all over the pitch and small moments didn't fall in our favour. We then moved on to last Saturday where we played Redhill away and after a dominant first half which saw Ali and Brendan give us a 2-0 lead, we were unable to hold on and received a sucker punch with a 97th minute equaliser. Welcome to Horley Town



Early years and foundation

The club traces its roots back to 1896, when Horley Football Club first affiliated with the Surrey County Football Association. In 1903 a nearby side, Gatwick Rovers, was founded. The two clubs merged in 1908, with the Horley name surviving.

Originally, both Horley and Gatwick Rovers had played in red and black, but in 1912 the club adopted its now-familiar claret and blue colours, which remain in use today.

In the mid-1920s, Horley made strides in the county footballing structure. Having appeared in the Surrey County Junior Cup final in 1923–24, they went on to win the Surrey County Junior Charity Cup in 1924–25. This success ushered in their first experience of intermediate competition in 1925–26.

They progressed to join the Surrey Intermediate League, winning it in 1926–27. In the 1950–51 season, Horley claimed the Eastern Section of the Intermediate League and sought election to the Surrey Senior League.

Post-war era and switching levels

Following the Second World War, the club faced the challenge of losing its original ground, known as the King's Head ground. A generous local benefactor, Major A.L.N. Jennings, gifted the club 10.7 acres in Smallfield Road, to be held in trust "in memory of those who died in the defence of their country." The ground was named The Defence, a tribute to fallen servicemen. In 1951–52, Horley entered the Surrey Senior League, but the step up proved difficult and by 1954–55 the club found itself relegated back to junior football. In 1956 the club re-entered the intermediate leagues, and by 1957–58 established its first youth side in the Redhill & District League.

Horley fluctuated in status for much of the next two decades. In 1971 the club rejoined the Surrey Senior League, and in 1975 the name was changed to Horley Town F.C. to reflect the growth of the town itself.

The 1970s: a golden season

In the 1976–77 season, Horley Town enjoyed perhaps its greatest success to date, winning the Surrey Senior League championship and the League Cup in the same year. The club also reached the final of the Surrey Senior League Charity Cup in that season.

Not long after, league reorganisation led the club to switch to the newly formed Home Counties League, but instead Horley opted to join the Spartan League Premier Division in 1978. After three seasons, the club then moved into the Athenian League. When the Athenian League disbanded in 1984, Horley was among the clubs that joined the Combined Counties League, the successor to the Home Counties League.

Welcome to Horley Town



Modern non-league era

Horley remained in the Combined Counties League (CCL) through much of the 1980s and early 1990s. However, after finishing bottom in 1995–96, the club withdrew from the CCL and dropped into the Crawley & District League.

In 2002 Horley joined the Surrey County Senior League, finishing third in 2002–03 and earning promotion back into the Combined Counties League (Premier Division). At the end of the 2005–06 season, they were relegated to Division One of the CCL due to ground grading issues. The next season, they finished as runners-up (on goal difference) in Division One and were promoted back to the Premier Division.

In the 2018–19 season, Horley was transferred to the Premier Division of the Southern Combination League as part of non-league restructuring. After the 2020–21 season, they were moved back to the Combined Counties League, Premier South Division.

Ground: The New Defence

The club's long-term home since 1947 was the original Defence ground on Smallfield Road, located on land donated by Major Jennings and dedicated in remembrance of war dead. In 2003 the club relocated to The New Defence, a modern ground facility in Horley, which features spectator stands and clubhouse amenities.

The record attendance at Horley is said to be around 1,500, achieved for a fixture against AFC Wimbledon in the 2003–04 period.

Welcome to Horley Town



Contemporary era

As of the latest seasons, Horley Town competes in the Combined Counties League Premier South, following movement between regional divisions due to restructuring. Off the pitch, the club has become more of a community sports hub: in 2009/10 Horley Rugby Club joined and The New Defence became a multi-sports facility under the New Defence Sports Club banner. Though the club has never risen into the higher echelons of non-league football, its longevity, steady presence in the Surrey / Combined Counties football structure, and deep local roots make Horley Town a respected and stable community football institution.

Player to Watch

One player currently turning heads at Horley Town FC is Jack Poplett, a centre back who joined the club as a signing with ambitions to make a lasting impact.

Poplett is a physically robust defender with an eye for reading the game. His aerial ability and strength in duels make him a key figure in Horley's backline. While not yet a household name, he has quickly impressed with his composure under pressure and ability to marshal the defence.

In matches this season, Poplett has often been the one organizing the defensive shape, stepping forward to intercept passes and challenging attackers who try to penetrate centrally. His pace is not elite, but his positioning, determination and work rate help compensate — he rarely gets caught out of place. He also has a decent passing range for a central defender at this level, helping transition from defence to attack when the opportunity arises.

What makes Poplett particularly interesting as a player to watch is his youth and potential. In lower-league football, having a defender who can grow, sharpen his technique, and learn to anticipate better is a big asset. If he continues developing consistency, decision-making, and perhaps a bit more composure in distribution, he could become a linchpin for Horley's defensive ambitions.

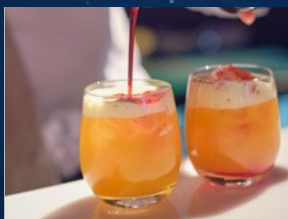

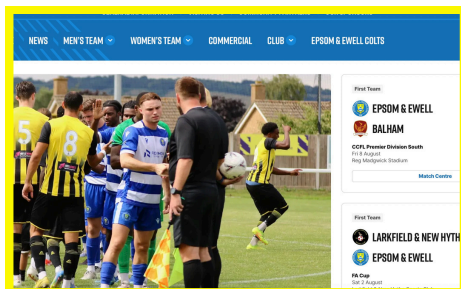
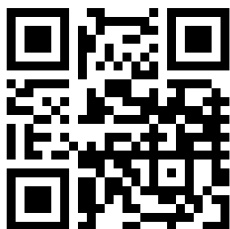

Match report v Tooting & Mitcham

Tuesday 14th October 2025

After the euphoria of Saturday's 4-0 victory against Thatcham Town at Chalky Lane, The Salts were brought back down to earth with a bump with a 0-1 defeat to Tooting & Mitcham – our first home league loss of the season.



Two changes were made from Saturday's side: Connor McShane came in for Brendan Murphy-McVey and Andrew Herring replaced Ali Fofahan up front. Both joined a strong bench with several players returning from injury.

A crowd of 151, including a large Tooting contingent, watched a tight contest with few clear chances. We started brightly but Tooting & Mitcham soon gained control, moving the ball sharply and forcing our midfield to work hard. Despite their possession, our defence stood firm and keeper Faebian Witter had little to do. Tooting & Mitcham's first opening came on 11 minutes when Darrel Wopara broke down the left, but his effort flew harmlessly across goal. On 26 minutes Luis Oliveira went on a superb run, beating three players, but his shot was easily gathered by former Salt Toby McKimm. Harry Murphy was booked for what looked an innocuous challenge before Jason Vincent went close just before the break, his effort again saved by McKimm.

The second half followed a similar pattern. Tooting & Mitcham enjoyed more of the ball but created little. We introduced Brendan, Ali and Oba, later followed by Emmanuel Limpo, which added fresh energy. On 64 minutes, Jason Vincent won possession and fed Oba, who beat two players but couldn't pick out Jason's return run. Four minutes later Ali was fouled just outside the box, but Brendan's free kick was comfortably saved.

With added pace and direct play, we began to press. Oba was fouled heavily by Tooting & Mitcham's Tyrese Ayeni, who was booked, but the resulting free kick came to nothing. Che Bell replaced Kionte on 75 minutes as we went more direct, launching long throws into the danger area. On 82 minutes, against the run of play, Tooting & Mitcham's Tariq Mahmoud found space in the box. A deflection off a defender fell kindly for him, and he drilled home the winner. Despite late pressure and a close-range effort from Naz that flew over, we couldn't find the equaliser.

A hard-fought match with little goalmouth action. Tooting & Mitcham had more possession, we had more chances, but they took the one that mattered. We deserved a point, and their wild celebrations showed how hard-earned their victory was.

It was a mild autumnal afternoon being watched by Redhill's lowest crowd of the season so far of just over 100. We had a debutant in midfield in Shane Dunne who has joined us from Hanworth Villa, and he gave a very impressive first performance.



As the first half progressed both teams had reasonable chances to open the scoring with the best of them falling to Luis Oliveira who burst through and only had the keeper to beat but was foiled by a good save by the Redhill keeper.

The first half changed dramatically in our favour in the 23rd and 27th minutes when we secured a 2-goal lead. The first goal was scored by Brendan Murphy-McVey who headed in at close range after a great ball from Emmanuel Limpo. Our second goal was scored by Ali Fofahan who was put through by Jason Vincent, and he finished with a good shot which went under the Redhill keeper. The rest of the first half played out with no further real incident.

Redhill made three substitutions at the start of the second half and we knew that we would face an onslaught in the opening minutes and this proved to be so. It looked like we had weathered this storm when we conceded a scrappy goal in the 55th minute when we failed to clear a ball into our box; we did have two or three attempts to do that but unfortunately the ball ended in the back of our net.

We made our first substitution in the 59th minute with Callum Wilson, who had been 'in the wars' a bit came off to be replaced by Ethan Nelson-Roberts; Redhill were certainly in the ascendency at this point and we were left with the odd foray forward.

Another couple of substitutions for us in the 70th minute saw Brendan Murphy-McVey and Ali Fofahan leave the proceedings to be replaced by Kionte Gilfilian-Wahl and Jake Brown. It was still nearly all in our half as Redhill searched for the equaliser, our final substitution was made towards the end of the match when we introduced Obasanjo Akinniranye and it looked like we might see the game out as we moved into injury time.

Unfortunately, we conceded in the 97th minute from a right wing cross and a header at the back post which found the back of our net. The referee blew for full time before the kick off could be taken. The game ended 2-2 when really we should have seen the game out and we must try to be better at game management towards the end of a game when we are leading.

Twice this season The Salts have squandered two-goal leads, but last night at Alton it was our turn to come back — two late goals salvaging a point after the hosts had gone 2-0 up on 84 minutes. Just one change was made to the starting eleven, with Ethan Nelson-Roberts replacing the unavailable Shane Dunne.



Alton went down to ten men on 27 minutes after No.10 Alex Macallister appeared to throw a punch at Toby Young. The referee spotted it well, but despite the advantage, Alton's defence was superbly disciplined and dealt with almost everything we threw at them. The first chance came early as Alton's No.7, Joshua Millo, forced Faebian Witter into a strong save. We had our moments — Vincent, Oliveira and Murphy-McVey all threatened — but clear openings were scarce. On 34 minutes, Callum Wilson was penalised for wrestling at a corner, and Adam Poynter put the resulting penalty past Witter. Alton 1-0 Epsom & Ewell. We pushed hard to equalise but struggled to find a final pass. On the stroke of half-time, Ali Fofana blasted over, and we went in a goal down.

The second half followed a similar pattern: The Salts probing, Alton sitting deep. On 57 minutes, Akinnaranye and McShane were introduced to add fresh legs, and moments later Naz curled a fine effort that Ashby-Hammond turned round the post. Alton remained dangerous on the break and nearly made it two on 68 minutes when a mazy run ended with a shot across goal. Further changes followed, but with nine minutes left, Alton broke again and No.17 David Garlinge calmly slotted home. Alton 2-0 Epsom & Ewell. From the restart, Bloor's pass released Ayran Kugathas, who took a touch and rifled into the roof of the net. Alton 2-1. The hosts' concentration seemed to dip, and tempers flared soon after when Teddy Ralph's shove sent an opponent into the fence, earning bookings for both sides. Deep into stoppage time, Oba broke down the left, cut along the goal line and found Bloor, who lifted his shot over the keeper and a defender on the line to snatch a draw. Alton 2-2 Epsom & Ewell. Wilson was booked for celebrating in front of the Alton bench. The hosts finished strongly with two corners, one clipping the upright, before the referee blew for full time.

Two away draws against higher-placed teams would normally be a good return, but given the circumstances, it feels like four points dropped. Whether this was our worst performance or just the result of a disciplined Alton side, we'll take the fight shown at the end.

Ground Regulations 2025-26



Spectator Code of Conduct

All spectators attending home matches are required to read and comply with this Code of Conduct, and to respect the same principles when attending our away fixtures at other clubs. Entry to the Ground shall constitute acceptance of this Code of Conduct, the rules and regulations of The Football Association and The Combined Counties League. The Club reserves the right to amend, alter or update this Code of Conduct and to eject, ban or prosecute as appropriate or necessary at their sole discretion. Please remember that your behaviour reflects on Epsom & Ewell FC and could result in fines and, in extreme cases, heavier sanctions being imposed upon the club.

Entering and Leaving the Ground

If you have driven to the ground, please park your vehicle considerately, do not block in others, and in particular do not block our neighbours' access to their houses. Out of respect for our neighbours, please keep noise levels down, especially late at night, and do not litter the area. Do not attempt to bring flares, fireworks or any other dangerous items into the ground. We reserve the right to check all bags and confiscate any prohibited items found. No alcoholic drinks are allowed to be brought into the ground. Do not attempt to bypass the gate security checks, smuggle drinks of any kind into the ground, or bypass the turnstiles without payment. Anyone found doing so will be evicted from the ground.

Within the Ground

Be respectful to club officers, staff, security, stewards, and other fans at all times. Do not obstruct the normal activities of the Club and its officers. Do not stand in seating areas or block access gangways or steps. Do not behave in a manner that compromises the comfort, enjoyment or safety of others. Always behave appropriately and do not bring the Club into disrepute.

The following behaviour will not be tolerated and will result in immediate eviction and ban: being drunk or under the influence of drugs and behaving antisocially; threatening behaviour; use of obscene or abusive language; persistent swearing and/or making vulgar gestures; racial, homophobic or any other form of discriminatory abuse, chanting or harassment; fighting; entering the field of play before, during or after the game; throwing any missile or object onto the field of play; and setting off any flare or firework.

Strictly Forbidden

The following are strictly forbidden and may result in immediate eviction and a ban for repeat offenders: the consumption of alcohol in bottles, cans or glasses in the stands, terraces and other open areas within the ground; climbing onto floodlights, stands, buildings, roofs, fences or any other structure; obstruction of any walkways and pedestrian routes; playing ball games in areas populated by ground visitors; allowing any animal to roam off the leash within the ground confines; and parking any vehicle that blocks emergency vehicle access.

The length of any ban imposed will be related to the severity of the offence and solely at the discretion of the Club. Any appeal may be made in writing through the Club Secretary and will be given full and due consideration.
