From the Bench





Firstly, I'd like to thank everyone who came to support us against Risborough in the FA Cup qualifying round—especially the kids behind the goal for creating such a great atmosphere. To come through the game 2–1 against a very good side, who like to move the ball around and cause problems with their wingers and their top striker, Elliott Buchanan, was a big achievement. I felt we dealt with them very well.


We made a change of formation to try something different and see if we could exploit areas down the wings, which in the first half worked particularly well. We couldn't make the most of it, but with a better final ball we could have created a lot more chances. That said, I thought we kept the ball really well, showed real patience, and defended just as strongly as we have from the start of the season.

In the end, we won through a penalty and a set-piece goal, which is massive in these tight games where fine margins make the difference. We came through with flying colours.

Now onto the draw—this is the furthest the club has been in 25 years. We've been drawn away to Eastbourne Borough, which is a great tie against a team three leagues above us. Of course, we'd have preferred a home draw, but we can't complain. Eastbourne haven't had the best start to the season, but that counts for nothing in the FA Cup.

There's also a bit of a backstory for me, going up against Matt Gray, who I worked closely with during my time at Sutton through the Covid season. We went on to win the National League and then had three seasons in League Two—just missing out on the play-offs but reaching the Papa John's Trophy Final at Wembley. Matt also gave me my league debut, so I know him really well. To go up against him in my first year of management is both unexpected and unbelievable. It should be a fantastic occasion, though a big challenge on the pitch. We'll go there with confidence, as we've been doing well this season and always set out to win every game.

Looking ahead to Friday night's match against Knaphill, we head into it without any new injuries. Jason, Tom, and Ali remain on the injury list, but everyone else is fit. Knaphill are a very young side who've had mixed results, but they beat Horley Town 2–1 on Tuesday, so it certainly won't be an easy task. Last season we lost 5–3 in one game against them and edged a very tight 2–1 in the other, so we know what to expect and we'll prepare accordingly.

Epsom & Ewell in the FA Cup



As we look ahead to our 2nd qualifying round tie away at Eastbourne Borough, a look back on our two previous best FA Cup seasons.

1933–34: A Historic Journey Into the First Round Proper

In the 1933–34 season, then known as Epsom Town, the club embarked on a remarkable FA Cuprun—still celebrated as one of its proudest achievements.

Climactic Qualifying Rounds

- Preliminary Round: Epsom Town faced Woking, an established Isthmian League side. The
 initial encounter ended in a 1–1 stalemate, but in a replay that also remained tight at 2–2
 after 90 minutes, Epsom pulled away in extra time to triumph 5–2.
- Second Qualifying Round: Upsetting Nunhead—another Isthmian opponent known for earlier associations with deeper FA Cup runs—Epsom dispatched them 3.
- Third Qualifying Round: Against Beddington Corner from the Surrey Senior League, Epsom edged through 4–2, setting a new club milestone by reaching the Third Qualifying Round for the first time..
- Fourth Qualifying Round: Epsom's next victims were Leytonstone, yet again from the Isthmian League—from a league above. Epsom clinched a 3–1 win and earned a place in the First Round Proper, a first in the club's history.

First Round Proper: A Day at Lea Bridge

On 25 November 1933, Epsom Town faced Clapton Orient (now Leyton Orient) at the Lea Bridge Speedway Stadium, watched by an impressive crowd of 9,485—a staggering turnout for a club of its size. The result, however, was a tough one: a 4–2 defeat, bringing an end to the dream Cup run—but the memory remained monumental in the club's history.

1980–81: Another Brush With the Proper Round

Fast-forward nearly half a century: the 1980–81 FA Cup witnessed Epsom & Ewell making yet another valiant push—this time taking them to the Fourth Qualifying Round, narrowly shy of the First Round Proper

The Road Through Qualifying

- Early triumphs saw Epsom & Ewell down Eastbourne Town, Margate, and Ashford Town (Kent).
- By the Third Qualifying Round, they had already achieved their best since 1933.

Fourth Qualifying Round: The End of the Line

But in the Fourth Qualifying Round, Epsom & Ewell's journey was halted in a heavy 5–0 defeat by Enfield, who would go on to join the First Round Proper. This emphatic loss punctuated their deepest modern FA Cup progression until then—still noteworthy in the broader sweep of the club's FA Cup history.

Welcome to Knaphill



Founding and Early Years (1924–1930s)

Founded in 1924, Knaphill Football Club began life playing at Waterer's Park in Knaphill. This recreation ground was originally part of a nursery estate known as Blue Gates Field, bequeathed to Woking Urban District Council by Anthony Waterer, and laid out as a public space between 1924 and 1928. The club made its mark early, winning the Surrey County Intermediate League (Western) title in 1935–36.

Growth and Local Success (1970s-1980s)

By the 1970s, Knaphill were competing in the Woking & District League. They captured the Charity Cup in the 1972–73 season, then struck gold with a sensational treble of the Premier Division, League Cup, and Charity Cup in 1978–79. The momentum continued into 1979–80, retaining both the League Cup and Charity Cup and adding the Challenge Cup to their trophy haul

In the early 1980s, the club re-entered the Surrey County intermediace League (Western), starting in Division Three. They earned promotion by winning that division in their first season back (1980–81), then again finished as runner-up in Premier Division Two (1981–82), securing a third successive promotion. The following season saw them finish as runners-up in Premier Division One. Resurgence and Promotions (2000s–2010s).

The mid-2000s marked a new chapter. In the 2005–06 season, Knaphill claimed the Surrey County Intermediate League Division One title, earning promotion to the Premier Division. They continued their ascent by becoming Premier Division champions in 2006–07, which led to entry into Division One of the Combined Counties League.

In a significant move during the 2004–05 season, the first team relocated from Waterer's Park to their current home at Redding Way. This ground, provided by developers of the Brookwood Manor housing development on land owned by Woking Borough Council, has since become one of the finest in the area. Waterer's Park continues to serve as a venue for reserve fixtures.

The new ground was steadily developed: floodlights were installed in 2011, followed by two 50-seat stands and a covered terrace added in 2015.

Knaphill's performances in the Combined Counties League were strong and consistent. In 2013–14, a third-place finish in Division One secured promotion to the Premier Division. Their upward trajectory continued with a memorable success in the 2017–18 season, capturing the Combined Counties League Premier Challenge Cup with a 3–2 final victory over Worcester Park.

Recent Highlights and Records (2020s)

The 2015–16 season stands out as Knaphill's best FA Vase run, reaching the Fourth Round. In the FA Cup, the club's best performance has been reaching the Second Qualifying Round, achieved in both 2017–18 and 2023–24.

Welcome to Knaphill



The 2023–24 season culminated in a thrilling title chase. Knaphill finished third in the Combined Counties League Premier Division South, earning a place in the promotion play-offs. After a 2–0 semi-final victory over Tadley Calleva, they narrowly missed out on promotion with a 2–1 defeat to AFC Croydon Athletic in the final. That final also produced Knaphill's record attendance to date: 872 spectators.

Match report v Risborough Rangers



Epsom & Ewell 2 Risborough Rangers 1

FA Cup 1st Qualifying Round Saturday 30th August 2025 Scorers- Green 57 pen, Aiwone 90+5

Epsom & Ewell reached the 2nd Qualifying Round of the Emirates FA Cup for the first time in 25 years, beating Risborough Rangers 2-1 thanks to a dramatic last-minute winner from centre-half Stefan Aiwone, in front of a crowd of 79.



With Max Johnson serving a one-match ground ban, Craig Dundas took charge, assisted by Chris Farnan and Conor Redmond. Two changes were made from Monday's line-up, with Stefan and Kionte Gillfillan-Waul replacing Jermaine Green and Ali Fofahan.

The game began slowly, though Kionte's early run gave Ethan Nelson-Roberts a chance in the 1st minute, but his effort went over. Rangers responded with a header from Keano Robinson, also too high. On the half hour, Manny Williams had the ball in the net after chipping Faebian Witter, but was flagged offside.

We looked threatening from a 37th-minute corner when Stefan's header went just wide, while Rangers finished the half stronger. A dangerous cross in stoppage time found Andrei Chiriac, but his effort was blocked and dribbled harmlessly to Witter.


The second half began much the same until Luis chased down a ball on 55 minutes, weaving into the box before being brought down. Adam Green converted the penalty to give the Salts the lead. Rangers pressed hard, Robinson firing high and Chiriac forcing Witter into a sharp save. Their equaliser came on 70 minutes, Robinson heading home powerfully at the back post after we failed to clear a corner.

Risborough looked the likelier side to win, with captain Buchanan driving them forward. Dundas introduced himself and Emmanuel Limpo to steady things. In the 83rd minute Adam Green tested Bridle-Card from distance, and Luke Miller also went close after intercepting a poor clearance, but both efforts were saved. Substitutes Obasanjo Akinniranye and Kiyo Brown were then introduced as the game seemed destined for a replay.

Deep into stoppage time, we forced a corner. Luke Miller, whose earlier deliveries had been disappointing, sent in a perfect ball to the far post. The keeper missed it, and Stefan bundled the ball over the line to spark wild celebrations — including a pitch invasion by the bench.

Callum Wilson came on to help see out the game on his 50th appearance, and the Salts comfortably dealt with the final long ball before the whistle blew. Epsom & Ewell fans, who had sung all afternoon, roared with joy as mascots joined the celebrations on the pitch.

We now await Monday's draw for the 2nd Qualifying Round, when Step 2 clubs enter. A home tie would be ideal, and a meeting with local side Dorking Wanderers would be especially welcome. Fixtures will be played the weekend of 13th September.

Ground Regulations 2025-26



Spectator Code of Conduct

All spectators attending home matches are required to read and comply with this Code of Conduct, and to respect the same principles when attending our away fixtures at other clubs. Entry to the Ground shall constitute acceptance of this Code of Conduct, the rules and regulations of The Football Association and The Combined Counties League. The Club reserves the right to amend, alter or update this Code of Conduct and to eject, ban or prosecute as appropriate or necessary at their sole discretion. Please remember that your behaviour reflects on Epsom & Ewell FC and could result in fines and, in extreme cases, heavier sanctions being imposed upon the club.

Entering and Leaving the Ground

If you have driven to the ground, please park your vehicle considerately, do not block in others, and in particular do not block our neighbours' access to their houses. Out of respect for our neighbours, please keep noise levels down, especially late at night, and do not litter the area. Do not attempt to bring flares, fireworks or any other dangerous items into the ground. We reserve the right to check all bags and confiscate any prohibited items found. No alcoholic drinks are allowed to be brought into the ground. Do not attempt to bypass the gate security checks, smuggle drinks of any kind into the ground, or bypass the turnstiles without payment. Anyone found doing so will be evicted from the ground.

Within the Ground

Be respectful to club officers, staff, security, stewards, and other fans at all times. Do not obstruct the normal activities of the Club and its officers. Do not stand in seating areas or block access gangways or steps. Do not behave in a manner that compromises the comfort, enjoyment or safety of others. Always behave appropriately and do not bring the Club into disrepute.

The following behaviour will not be tolerated and will result in immediate eviction and ban: being drunk or under the influence of drugs and behaving antisocially; threatening behaviour; use of obscene or abusive language; persistent swearing and/or making vulgar gestures; racial, homophobic or any other form of discriminatory abuse, chanting or harassment; fighting; entering the field of play before, during or after the game; throwing any missile or object onto the field of play; and setting off any flare or firework.

Strictly Forbidden

The following are strictly forbidden and may result in immediate eviction and a ban for repeat offenders: the consumption of alcohol in bottles, cans or glasses in the stands, terraces and other open areas within the ground; climbing onto floodlights, stands, buildings, roofs, fences or any other structure; obstruction of any walkways and pedestrian routes; playing ball games in areas populated by ground visitors; allowing any animal to roam off the leash within the ground confines; and parking any vehicle that blocks emergency vehicle access.

The length of any ban imposed will be related to the severity of the offence and solely at the discretion of the Club. Any appeal may be made in writing through the Club Secretary and will be given full and due consideration.
